Duringthesentencingphase of Couch's trial, a defense expert argued that Couch's wealthy parents coddled him into a sense of irresponsibility — a condition the expert termed "affluenza." The condition is not recognized as a medical diagnosis by the American Psychiatric Association, and its invocation

drew widespread ridicule.

The Tarrant County District Attorney's office also told local media outlets that the two had been taken into custody. A spokeswoman for the office could not immediately be reached by The Associated Press for further comment.

Landfill to accept living trees free of charge through Jan. 9, officials say

On Monday, the city of Big Spring landfill began accepting living Christmas trees without charge will continue

through Sat-

urday, Jan. 9, 2016, a city press release announced. Only trees will be taken. All other debris and trash disposal is subject to normal landfill charges, the release said.

The trees will be turned into compost at the city's composting facility located in the land-

However, residents can also get the most of their trees by making mulch. The boughs can be cut off and placed among plants susceptible to windburn. The tree can be used as a natural shelter for birds. Once es-

tablished outside securely, the tree can provide food and shelter for wild birds. To help attract birds to the tree, place it near a bird feeder birdbath or hang bird treats from

the tree.

And if you have a small body of water on your land, sink the tree into the pond. The tree can also be used to provide a habitat for fish and aquatic insects.

Next year, consider purchasing a tree that still has its roots. When Christmas is over, find a place to plant the tree.

# Matthews' late 3-pointers help Texas weather Mavericks top Bucks 103-93

Mavericks took care of the ball and Wesley Matthews made the big

Matthews scored 22 points, including two clutch 3-pointers in the fourth quarter, and Dallas held off the Milwaukee Bucks 103-93 Monday night.

Matthews snapped an 89-all tie with a 3 from the right wing with 4:25 to play, then followed Giannis Antetokounmpo's runner at the other end with another 3-pointer with 3:50 remaining.

Dallas got a seasonlow seven points on 3-of-15 shooting from Dirk Nowitzki. The Mavericks were outrebounded by 18 and even their normally strong free throw shooting off. And though Dallas never trailed and led by as many as 13 in the second half, Milwaukee rallied to tie the score in the fourth quarter.

But the Mavericks turned the ball over only four times, tying a franchise low, and outscored the Bucks 26-0 on points after turnovers.

"They made a run," Matthews said. "They're playing with energy, too. They're the one team to beat Golden State. Their record is what it is, but they still play hard."

After Matthews' second 3, the Bucks didn't score again until Antetokounmpo's layup with 1:11 to play made it 97-93. Devin Harris sealed the game with a layup with 11 seconds left following a loose-ball scramble that included the Bucks' O.J. Mayo crashing over the scorer's table.

Zaza Pachulia 17 points and eight rebounds for Dallas against his former

Jerryd Bayless turned to the Bucks' lineup after missing 11 games with a left ankle sprain and led Milwaukee with 19 points and seven assists.

"Usually, your rhythm is not going to be what it was before you got injured; there's a process of getting back in the flow," Bucks interim coach Joe Prunty said. "I thought he did a very nice job of not only getting himself going but getting the team going.'

Milwaukee went on a 9-0 run early in the fourth quarter, including two buckets by Bay less, to slice the Mavericks' lead to 83-81. Bayless had eight points in the quarter.

Khris Middleton's turnaround jumper tied it at 89 with 4:49 to play.

"We fought back," Bayless said. "We didn't quit. The whole team didn't quit. We kept on fighting. We just have to

# Ware recovers fumble to seal Broncos' 20-17 win over Bengals

DENVER (AP) — One errant shotgun snap sent the fortunes of the Denver Broncos and Cincinnati Bengals in different directions.

AJ McCarron took his eyes off his center for a splitsecond to look at the coverage and both the snap and Cincinnati's surest path to a first-round bye slipped away along with a chance to earn the AFC's top seed next

DeMarcus Ware secured both the fumble and Denver's ticket to the playoffs, clamping down on the loose football 6 minutes into overtime and sealing Denver's 20-17 win Monday night.

"It was my fault. I told the team that," McCarron said. "I looked up to see the coverage and the snap caught me by surprise."

This was just the big play Ware's been looking for ever since missing a month with a bad back.

"Felt great to finish the game that way," Ware said. "We thought we were going to finish it with the field goal but at the end of the game, it's all about that win."

Ware's recovery followed a 37-yard field goal by Brandon McManus, whose shanked 45-yarder at the end of regulation made necessary the extra

"I'm 24 years old and I don't think I've ever kicked the ball like that in my life: grade school, elementary school or anything like that," Mc-Manus said. "I just wrapped my toe around it and I knew I had to bounce back."

He did, and Ware's followup capped Denver's second comeback from a 14-0 deficit at home this season. The Broncos (11-4) also beat New England in overtime last month after spotting the Patriots a two-touchdown lead in the first half.

Denver's comeback denied the Bengals (11-4) their first road win on a Monday night in a quarter century.

The Broncos now can secure the AFC's top seed next week with a win over San Diego and a Patriots' loss at Miami.

"First off, getting into the playoffs in the National Football League is a hell of an accomplishment. It's hard to do," Broncos coach Gary Kubiak said. "Once you get there, it's about how you play, not really where you play, but ... we've got a great opportunity this weekend.

"It's going to be a very quick turnaround after a five-quarter football game. It's going to be very tough on us physically. I've got to get them ready to go, but they understand that. They didn't want a lot of atta-boy's tonight. They're ready to go to work next week. I could feel that already."

Other takeaways from the final Monday night game of the season:

**BANGED-UP BACKUPS:** The battle of backup quarterbacks took its toll on Brock Osweiler and McCarron. Osweiler, making his sixth straight start in place of Peyton Manning (foot), came in with a sore left shoulder and left with a sore left elbow. Mc-Carron, making his second consecutive start in place of Andy Dalton (thumb), injured his left wrist on the final scramble and had it wrapped afterward.

"I was diving for the football and it just happened," McCarron said, adding he wasn't sure how bad it was hurt. "I don't know. I'll get it checked out tomorrow and we'll see."

Osweiler hurt his elbow on one of Carlos Dunlap's three

"Coming into the game, I was a little bit banged up. Coming out of the game I'm a little bit banged up. But that's football," said Osweiler, who will get the start against the Chargers next week, too.

BOGGED DOWN: After piling up 205 yards on their first three drives — including 170 on their first two possessions the Bengals managed just 89 yards the rest of the way.





### Calm urged after Ohio grand jury doesn't indict officers

CLEVELAND (AP) — Officials are urging calm as they brace for expected protests after a grand jury voted not to indict a white Cleveland police officer for fatally shooting a 12-year-old black boy who was carrying what turned out to be a pellet gun.

Small groups of protesters gathered Monday outside the Cuyahoga County Justice Center and at the recreation center where Tamir Rice was shot by then-rookie patrolman Timothy Loehmann in November 2014. The size of those protests likely was reduced by a cold and steady rain that fell throughout the day. County Prosecutor Tim McGinty announced that

Loehmann and his field training officer wouldn't be indicted because of "indisputable" evidence that Tamir was reaching for what officers thought was a real gun tucked in his waistband, and urged those who disagreed with the grand jury to protest peacefully. "It is time for the community and all of us to start

to heal," McGinty said.

Cleveland Mayor Frank Jackson made a similar plea, as did Tamir's family. Attorneys for the family condemned the grand jury's decision but called on people to express themselves "peacefully and democratically." Deputies set up metal barricades outside the Justice Center after McGinty's news conference on Monday afternoon.

### Neighbor tried to help save baby after deadly Texas twister BLUE RIDGE, Texas (AP) — The winds had fi-

nally calmed when Debralee King and her husband ventured out to check on their horses and see what damage the tornado had caused. Then she heard a

King saw her neighbor, Jose Daniel Santillano – shirtless and shoeless — running toward her with his newborn daughter in his arms. The child was gravely injured. Her tiny hand was cold.

"He wanted me to take her to the hospital," King said. "He was frantic. His wife was still trapped." With that, King was thrust into the unsuccessful ful line of weekend storms that spawned multiple tornadoes, destroyed several hundred homes and displaced residents throughout Dallas' suburbs. At least 11 people died and dozens were injured in

effort to save the likely youngest victim of a power-

the tornadoes that swept through the area on Saturday, pushed by a powerful storm system that continued to hit the nation's midsection on Monday with heavy snow, ice, rain, flooding and blustery winds. More than 2,800 flights nationwide were canceled Monday — more than half of them at Chicago's two main airports — but that had dropped to 600 by Tuesday morning.

### Iraqi PM tours Ramadi to hail city's liberation from IS BAGHDAD (AP) — A triumphant Iraqi prime

minister on Tuesday toured the western city of Ramadi, just a day after government troops routed Islamic State militants from the area and recaptured a key government complex. Iraqi state TV reported that Haider al-Abadi was

in Ramadi but offered no further details. But an Iraqi military commander, Brig. Gen. Ahmed al-Belawi told The Associated Press that the prime minister kicked off the visit by meeting security and provincial officials for the latest updates. Across the city meanwhile, military engineering

teams were clearing bombs from the streets and nearby buildings, al-Belawi said, even as sporadic clashes were underway in outlying parts of the Ramadi, the Anbar provincial capital, fell to IS in

May, marking a major setback for Iraqi forces and the U.S.-led campaign. The Baghdad government was quick to announce a counter-offensive to retake the city but attempts repeatedly stalled. Then in November, al-Abadi's forces announced

a major push to recapture Ramadi, warning residents to leave and advancing quickly across the Euphrates River.

### Rubio in Iowa as questions grow about early-state efforts DES MOINES, Iowa (AP) — With a nationally fo-

cused campaign that leans on strong debate performances and television advertising, Marco Rubio isn't going all out in any one of the early voting

The charges pertained to a period when he was mayor of Jerusalem and the country's trade minister, years before he became prime minister in 2006.

Olmert has denied any wrongdoing and was allowed to stay out of prison until the verdict on his appeal was delivered.

After Tuesday's decision, Olmert said he was "satisfied" about his partial exoneration. Clearly relieved, Olmert said it was still a "hard day" but that he accepted the Supreme Court's ruling.

iff Dee Anderson has said he believes the two fled in late November after a video surfaced that appears to show Couch at a party where people were drinking. If found to be drinking, Couch's probation could be revoked and he could be sentenced to up to 10 years in prison.

A spokesman for the Tarrant County Sheriff's Department has declined to say whether Tonya Couch is facing any charges.

There was no immediate comment Monday night from the U.S. Marshals Service, which had issued a wanted poster promising a reward of up to \$5,000 for information leading to Ethan

whereabouts Couch's and capture.

In June 2013 at age 16, Ethan Couch was driving drunk and speeding on a dark two-lane road south of Fort Worth when he crashed into a disabled SUV off to the side, killing four people and injuring several others, including passengers in Couch's pickup truck. Couch pleaded guilty

to four counts of intoxication manslaughter and two counts of intoxication assault causing serious bodily injury. Because of his age,

he wasn't certified as an adult for trial and a judge sentenced him in juvenile court to 10 years' probation and a stint in a rehabilitation

Anderson was among those critical of the judge's decision not to incarcerate Couch. The sheriff said that the teen has never expressed remorse for his actions and that his case sparked more outrage than any other Anderson has encountered in his law enforcement career.

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


# **Endangered!**

Ever heard of an addax? How about a bonobo or a vaquita? All are endangered animals that must be protected to ensure their existence.

The addax is a type of antelope that lives in the Sahara Desert in northern Africa. It has a grayish-brown coat in the winter, which turns sandy blonde or almost white in the summer. The bonobo is a type of chimpanzee that

lives in the Congo Basin in central Africa. It has long legs, a dark face, pink lips and long, parted hair on its head. The vaquita is a type of porpoise that lives in the Gulf of California. It is stocky with dark rings around its eyes, patches on its lips, a dark gray back and a white belly.

The destruction of habitat, along with hunting and other things, have made these animals endangered. People are working to change this, however. The addax has been reintroduced in Morocco and Tunisia, and many are being raised in captivity. There are 29,000 to 50,000 bonobos left, and organizations are working hard to protect them and their habitat. Thereare only 100 to 300 vaquitas left, making them one of the most endangered species in the world. Laws now prevent the use of nets that have accidentally trapped and killed vaguitas, and other steps are being taken to protect them.







# Curry's triple-double leads Warriors past Kings 122-103

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP) — Stephen Curry's eyes lit up when he saw little brother Seth guarding him for the first time in their NBA career, and the reigning MVP promptly missed a long 3-pointer.

"It was a very cool moment," the Golden State star said. "I missed and he let me know about it. After that I was able to see a couple go in."

That's an understatement. Curry scored his first 17 points in the final 3:16 of the first half and went on to record his sixth career tripledouble as the Warriors won for the 29th time in 30 games this season, 122-103 over the Sacramento Kings on Monday night.

"He's done that so many

times throughout the year, I don't think that's me, per se," Seth Curry said. "He's going to turn it up. He's done that probably once a game, had a run like that. We tried to stop him from getting going, but it's tough. The game was going so fast at that time, that's when he's at his best."

Curry had 23 points, a career-high 14 rebounds and 10 assists, Klay Thompson scored 29 and Draymond Green had 25 points for the Warriors, who have won 33 straight regular-season home games.

Omri Casspi scored a career-high 36 points, tying Mike Bibby's team record with nine 3-pointers for Sacramento.

But star center DeMarcus Cousins got ejected in the third quarter and the Kings lost their 11th straight against their Northern California rivals.

"I'm not sure I liked how we responded," coach George Karl said. "We had a tough, bad refereed game. But we can't emotionally lose it."

The Kings were excited to have a healthy Cousins for the first time in three meetings with the Warriors this season. But the All-Star big man played less than 13 minutes before getting ejected. After sitting out most of the first half in foul trouble, Cousins was upset after getting called for his fifth foul in the third quarter.

Monty McCutchen then called Cousins for a technical, setting him off on a tirade that led to another technical called by Mitchell Ervin and an ejection. Cousins had to be restrained by teammates before being escorted off the

Stephen Curry made three of the four free throws to start a 15-0 run that turned a twopoint deficit into a 79-66 lead for the Warriors. His 3-pointer just before the third quarter ended put Golden State up 90-75.

After trailing early, the Kings went on a 28-7 spurt to build a 41-30 lead on one of Casspi's seven first-half 3s. But Casspi's sharp shooting seemed to wake up Stephen

Curry, who missed his first six shots and was scoreless for the first 20:44 of the game.

He ended that drought with a 3-pointer that started a stretch of him scoring 17 straight Golden State points in the final 3:16 of the half. Stephen Curry hit five 3s and a layup during that span to the delight of the home crowd.

"I just found a spark and shots started to fall," he said. "All the ones before felt pretty good, most of them were just in and out. I never lost confidence. Thankfully a couple went in."

Casspi hit four 3s in that same stretch to help Sacramento take a 61-58 lead at the break.

Their loss in Denver also prevented them from going 7-1 on the road, which would have been the team's best mark in its 48-year history.

**REF'SROUGHNIGHT:** This wasn't nearly as bad as Ed Hochuli's blown call on Jay Cutler's last-minute fumble against San Diego in 2008. But the buff referee had a tough night in Denver. He began by identifying the Broncos as the Bengals when Denver won the opening coin toss. He left his microphone on in the closing minutes of regulation like in a State Farm commercial and twice had to pick up flags thrown even though the Bengals had declared an extra lineman as an eligible receiver and it had been announced.



After you replace that soda once a day with water and are used to that and comfortable, switch those fries for a salad.





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

many deals, but it is not exclusively the province of the declarer. Today's hand shows how the defense can exercise control over the trump suit, and in so doing, stop a slam. Declarer won the opening dia-

mond lead with the ace and played a low trump to the king. The outcome of the hand now hinged on whether or not West took the king with the

First, let's see what would have happened had West taken the trick. Presumably, he would have returned a diamond, ruffed by South.

Declarer would then have cashed the ace of clubs, ruffed a club, led a trump to the queen and ruffed another club. This would have established his remaining clubs as tricks, and all he would then have to do is play a spade to the ace, draw West's last trump and claim the balance.

But when the hand was played, West realized that if he took the first trump, he could very well be aiding South's cause. Accordingly, he allowed the king to hold the trick.

As a result, South could no longer make the slam. If he tried to ruff two clubs in dummy, East would overruff the second one with the ten. And if instead South elected to play a second round of trumps before tackling the clubs, West would defeat the contract by taking the ace and returning his remaining trump. In that case, the queen of clubs would become the setting trick.

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



Today's Highlight History:

On Dec. 29, 1975, a bomb exploded in the main terminal of New York's LaGuardia Airport, killing 11 people (it's never been determined who was responsible).

On this date:

In 1170, Thomas Becket, the Archbishop of Canterbury, was slain in Canterbury Cathedral by knights loyal to King Henry

In 1808, the 17th president of the United States, Andrew Johnson, was born in Raleigh, North Carolina.

In 1812, during the War of 1812, the American frigate USS Constitution engaged and severely damaged the British frigate HMS Java off Brazil.

In 1845, Texas was admitted

as the 28th state. In 1890, the Wounded Knee nassacre took place in South Dakota as an estimated 300 Sioux Indians were killed by U.S. troops sent to disarm

In 1916, Grigory Rasputin, the so-called "Mad Monk" who'd Czar Nicholas II, was killed by a group of Russian noblemen in St. Petersburg.

In 1934, Japan formally renounced the Washington Naval Treaty of 1922. In 1940, during World War II,

Germany dropped incendiary

bombs on London, setting off

what came to be known as "The Second Great Fire of London." In 1957, singers Steve Lawrence and Eydie Gorme

were married in Las Vegas.

In 1972, Eastern Air Lines Flight 401, a Lockheed L-1011 Tristar, crashed into the Florida Everglades near Miami International Airport, killing 101 of the 176 people aboard.

In 1989, dissident and playwright Vaclav Havel (VAHTS'lahv HAH'-vel) assumed the presidency of Czechoslovakia.

In 1992, the United States and Russia announced agreement on a nuclear arms reduction treaty.

Ten years ago: International monitors said they would review Iraq's parliamentary elections in response to fraud complaints by Sunni Arab and secular Shiite groups.

Five years ago: Suicide bombers succeeded in killing Iraqi police commander Lt. Col. Shamil al-Jabouri, who was renowned in the tense northern city of Mosul for his relentless pursuit of al-Qaida.

Character actor Bill Erwin, 96, whose nearly seven-decade career included his memorable role as the grumpy old man on television's "Seinfeld," died in suburban Los Angeles.

One year ago: President Barack Obama, in an NPR interview, issued a warning to congressional Republicans set to take control of both houses of Congress, saying he had a veto pen, and would not be afraid to use it. A man with a lengthy criminal record killed six adults and two young children before taking his own life in Edmonton, Alberta.

# 5 tips for better financial health



As the calendar turns over a new year, it's a good time to take stock of your finances. Evaluating what missteps you made with your money in the past year, determining how you can correct those errors and setting a realistic budget will put you on your way to better financial health in

A top New Year's resolution is putting money into a savings account each month, according to a recent survey of working adults by the Principal Financial Group. Leading money management priorities include paying down debt (28 percent), saving for retirement (25 percent) and building a savings account

Over time, those pizza deliveries and nights on the town add up and can make a huge difference in your budget."

Getting your financial house in order doesn't have to be a burden. Follow these tips to establish a budget and begin building healthier money habits:

Account for incidentals. When listing all the people and places you owe money, it can be easy to overlook other expenses that really add up. Things like a work wardrobe, toiletries and personal hygiene items are necessary purchases that should be reflected in your budget.

Expect the unexpected. Even the best planned budget can fall apart when unexpected expenses arise. Ensure that you're not only directing a sum of money to your savings account each month, but that you're earmarking some of that money for emergency car repairs, an unplanned visit to the veterinarian or a critical home repair.

Don't treat your budget like a bad diet. Like a crash diet, being too restrictive with your budget will leave you discouraged and exhausted. And maybe hungry. The key is to be honest with yourself about your spending. Look at your spending history — you might be surprised to see where your money goes. Be sure to set a reasonable budget each month that allows you manage your finances without falling off the wagon.

Leverage rewards. It may seem counter-intuitive to use a credit card for expenses you don't need to buy on credit. Deposit those rewards in a savings plan or allocate them to help pay down debt each month. Just remember that this approach only works to your advantage if you pay the balance each month.

Research all your money management options. A solid budget is the foundation of a good money management plan, but the type of accounts you use can also influence your financial situation. ### Amazon holiday shipping, Christmas Eve deliveries set record

AP — Amazon.com has been a prime beneficiary of holiday shoppers going online or procrastinat-

Amazon says it shipped a record number of items worldwide for the holidays, with Christmas Eve the biggest day ever for deliveries using the company's Prime Now service. The service offers free two-hour delivery to more than 20 metropolitan areas, up from just Manhattan, where the service launched last

The company's Amazon Prime service, a loyalty program that includes unlimited free two-day shipping, gained 3 million new members in the third week of December alone. Amazon says Prime members shopping via mobile more than doubled.

The Seattle company did not disclose the actual number of items shipped. A report it just issued outlines trends and percentage changes in shipments, rather than sales fig-

### Holiday spending up 8 percent; online sales surge

NEW YORK (AP) — Americans spent more on items like furniture during the holidays this year, with online shopping in particular seeing a big spike, according to a report released Monday.

Overall spending rose 7.9 percent from a year ago, according to the MasterCard SpendingPulse report, which tracks retail sales across cards, cash and checks from Black

Friday to Christmas Eve. The uptick was driven by people sitting in the comfort of their homes or at work, with online shopping up 20 percent.

Shopping at physical stores still accounts for the majority of spending during the holidays. But the continuing shift to online shopping is forcing retailers to improve their websites, or offer perks like faster or free delivery. Earlier this month, another report by First Data also found that online sales growth was outpacing sales growth at physical stores. That report was based on payments from Oct. 31 to Dec. 14.

The SpendingPulse report does not include spending by dollar amounts. But the National Retail Federation, the nation's largest retail trade group, expects sales for November and December to rise 3.7 percent to \$630.5 billion from a year ago.

For the traditional holiday shopping period from Black Friday to Christmas Eve, the MasterCard SpendingPulse report found that furniture sales rose in the double-digit percentages, indicating that people are "willing and able" to spend on big-ticket items.

Sales of women's clothing also rose double-digits, while men's apparel declined. The report noted that the warm weather this fall pushed back sales of clothing, leading to some pent-up demand during the holiday shopping period. Retailers such as Macy's had said the unseasonably warm temperatures would force it to slash prices on items like coats and boots during the holidays.

The SpendingPulse report is based on sales activity on the MasterCard payments network, along with estimates for cash and check spending based on surveys.


