GOVERNOR CAMPBELL. SPOKE IN COURT YARD THURSDAY MAY 7.

Thursday at 11 o'clock Gov. Tom Campbell was introduced to the citizens of Schleicher and adjoining counties by Hon. W. B. Silliman. The people who gathered to hear the first Governor who ever spoke in Schleicher county, numbered about 300, in all Gov. Campbell put in what time he did talk defending the acts of the 30th legislature and the laws that were passed by that body. The Governor praised the 30th legislature and the people for sending such good

men to represent them. He was cheered many times by the crowd. The Governor said in his talk that he did not approve of any public officers accepting fees or even gifts from any Trust. He plainly showed the people where we should have equalization in taxes and showed them that the full rendition laws should be in force by the people. His talk lasted about one hour and forty minutes, he closed by saying that he would come back to Schleicher some day.

Monday was the day for Gov. Tom Campbell to pass through our little city on his way to Sonora, and a phone message from Christoval stated that he would arrive in our town about 3:30 so a great many of our citizens prepared to meet the Chief Magistrate of the Lone Star State, as he passed through the Band met at 3:30 and played several nice selections at the Elder corner where several of the good ladies had met with bouquets to present to the Governor upon his arrival, the Automobile that carried the first Governor over this western part of Texas arrived at 4 o'clock and Gov. Campbell was introduced to the crowd by Joab Campbell who in his eloquent manner said: Who living in Schleicher county would of thought 30 days ago that today we would have the pleasure of meeting the Chief Magistrate of the State, but today I wish to introduce to the people Gov. Tom Campbell.

(Cheers) Why even the birds sing for the presence of Tom Campbell the cows love Tom Campbell and even the little prairie dogs bark Tom Campbell as he passes down the road. The crowd then cheered again and was then permitted to shake hands with the Governor. The Governor remained only a few minutes in our city as he went through, but he told the people that he would speak on Thursday at 11 o'clock on his return from Sonora. The Governor was accompanied by Dr. Fields, Jim Allwell, Jim Cornell and several others there being two autos. The Governor thanked the ladies for the flowers and also thanked the voters for the support he got at the last election.

RETURNS OF PRIMARY ELECTION HELD MAY 2ND 1908.

Returns of Election held Saturday May 2nd. Eldorado precinct No. 1 Bailey got 45 Johnson 75; Mayer precinct No. 2 Bailey 12 Johnson 6; Rudd precinct No. 3 Bailey 9 Johnson 12, precinct 4 Bailey 7 Johnson 14 the total vote polled in the county was Bailey 73 Johnson 104. The late frost by killing out the cotton kept lots of people from going to the polls, as they thought more of their crops than they did of the question involved.

Chas Morris returned from Harper Saturday, where he has been gone to attend to some business, Charley reports having a splendid visit, and said the country was in fine shape, but said the frost killed nearly all the cotton in that section.

VISIT TO SONORA.

We had the pleasure of attending the celebration at Sonora the 5th and 6th as was previously advertised. Our town and county was well represented and every body that attended seemed to enjoy themselves to the utmost. People from all adjoining counties were there to meet the Chief Executive of the State (Gov. Tom Campbell) and hear him speak on the administration made during his term of his office, Sonora was one mass of people, as well as fine stock. The stock show was a splendid representation of the kind of stock raised in and adjoining counties to Sutton. The celebration was a complete success as well as the present term of school which has just closed. There being 5 graduates at the close of this school who secured their diplomas from the hands of the Governor.

There will be a meeting of the citizens of the Rudd neighborhood Sunday May 17 of the Adams School House, to discuss time, ways and means of having a barbecue, every man in the community is expected to be on hand, they will also sell right to sell cold drinks on the ground the day of the barbecue, don't stay at home come and help get up this entertainment.

The C. C. West Herford cattle that were carried to Sonora to exhibit at the fine stock show captured 4 blue ribbons as prize winner, the cattle came from the Tom Palmer herd. Mr. West also sold his yearling bulls at about \$37.50 per head.

The election on the Bailey issue has come and gone, while there was lots of entreat taken on both sides, Cone Johnson won over the Junior Senator in this county by a vote of 72 to 106, the vote that was polled was about half the votes in this county, lots of men stayed at home on account of planting their crops over, as the recent frost killed lots of cotton.

At a meeting held April 20th by the trustees of the Eldorado Independent School District an order was passed for the printing of the Bonds, so the school house is still on the move, and Eldorado will in no doubt get a new school building between this and the first of 1909. The Bonds won't be approved until after the commissioners court fixes the valuation on all property in this Independent district, which will be in June.

The contract for the W. O. W. hall was let to A. D. Wright of Brady and as soon as the lumber gets out the building will be started. All bids will probably be published in our next issue.

J. B. Smith will teach school at Mayer for three months, the school will begin next week. Mr. Smith is a competent teacher and Mayer should congratulate them selves on having secured him during his vacation.

DEMOCRATIC COUNTY CONVENTION.

The Democratic County Convention was called to order by Joab Campbell acting as temporary chairman.
Dr. Murphy was elected permanent chairman, and A. Oliver secretary.
A Credentials committee was appointed by the chair—T. M. Palmer, Will Adams and B. E. Earle.
The County Executive committee was asked to tabulate and make returns to the convention the vote cast at the various voting precincts in the county on May 2nd, recess was taken to give these committees time to act.

After recess the report of both the credential's committee and the Executive committee were adopted as a basis for the convention.
A resolution committee consisting of A. Oliver, M. B. McKnight and E. M. Barbee was appointed to draw up resolutions embodying the will of the convention. As the time was limited to ten minutes they did not complete their labors. The following resolutions however were reported by them which were adopted by the convention:
We, the organized Democracy of Schleicher County, assembled in its County Convention, May 2nd, 1908, do hereby pass and adopt the following resolutions:—
Resolved that we unqualifiedly endorse the candidacy of William Jennings Bryan for President of the United States, believing him to be a clean man from top to bottom, in whom there is no guile.
We further endorse him believing him to be a man who is better qualified than any other man in these United States to direct its policies.
We further endorse him because we believe that he can lead the Democratic Party to a justly deserved victory.
We further endorse him believing that the efforts being made by the trusts and organized corporate wealth to control our County, State and National affairs, is the greatest menace to the perpetuity of our rights and liberties and we know that he is opposed to such practices;
We further endorse him because, though thrice defeated, we believed him to be the strongest man in the Democratic party today and the greatest living statesman in the world.
We hereby declare that a public servant can not faithfully serve the people, who elect him, and at the same time accept fees and employment from favor-seeking corporations;
We hereby endorse the actions of the 39th, Legislature as having the courage and back-bone to carry out the demands of the people;
We hereby unquestionably endorse the passed record of Gov-

ernor T. M. Campbell and further endorse his candidacy for re-election, believing him to be an active and zealous servant of the people.
Joab Campbell was elected to the State Convention. He was delegated power to appoint a proxy should he be unable to attend himself.
The delegate was instructed to be governed by the resolutions as adopted a ove, Convention adjourned.






