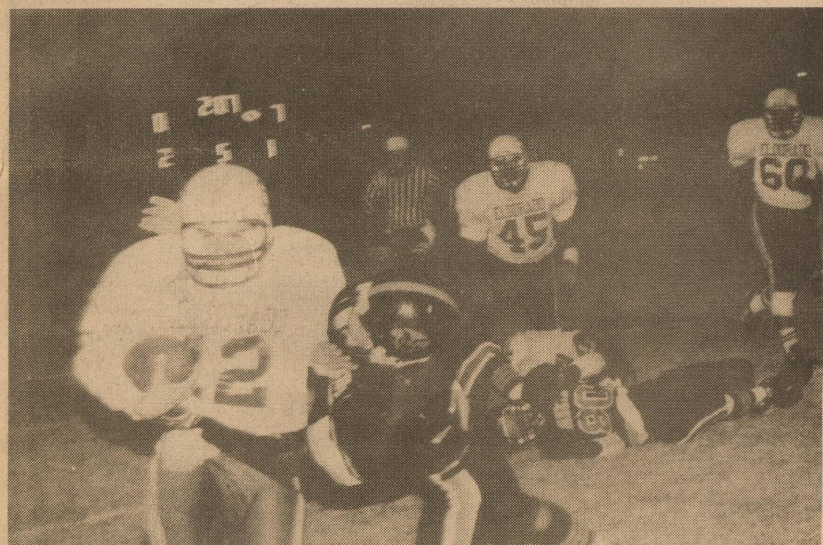

I would strongly suggest that parents of children between the ages of nine and seventeen pay the price of the ticket and take your child. There are not very

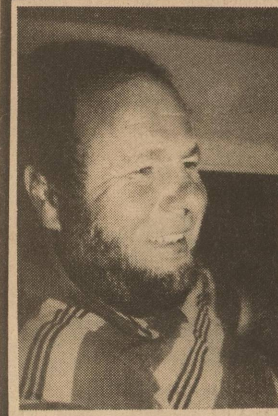
many opportunities to have our children interact through attendance at a live dramatic performance.

## Letters To The Editor

Dear Editor:

We are writing this letter in response to Pat Ragsdale's enthusiastic recommendation of Randy Mankin. What Mr. Ragsdale said did not bother us at all, but the implications or impressions that he leaves with the reader need to be addressed.

For Mr. Ragsdale to imply that the present commissioners court will not take a stand on any particular issue is preposterous. This court has never been ambivalent on any issue that we are aware of. This court has and will toughly examine and study the issues, then make their decision. They will not be lead astray by some political philosophy or persuasion from anyone inside or outside this county.

To the best of our knowledge, we do not know of a time when this court has made any decision concerning traditional or nontraditional family values. We do not believe that Roe vs. Wade has ever been an agenda item in Schleicher County and we certain that none of the commissioners live or believe in alternate lifestyles.

For Mr. Ragsdale to imply that this court is not fiscally conservative is pure

political jargon and and is absolutely false. This court has and will be as conservative as it possibly can and still provide the needed services to our citizens. We agree with Mr. Ragsdale about WILLFUL WASTE. If Mr. Ragsdale, or any citizen of Schleicher County, knows of specific wasteful situations that exist in the county the commissioners court will gladly receive your suggestions. We certainly do not want WOEFUL WANT to plague this county.

Schleicher County has held the line as best it can on taxes and still provide the needed services that the citizens of this county

deserve and enjoy. Over the past ten years the county's tax levy has grown 23% while the jurisdiction that Mr. Ragsdale and Mr. Mankin represented has grown 137% in the same time frame. Our figures are from the Schleicher County Appraisal District records not the coffee shop or some mutual admiration society.

The most damaging and misguided assumption that Mr. Ragsdale made in his glowing recommendation of Mr. Mankin is the suggestion that the City of Eldorado and Schleicher County do not cooperate with one another. Clearly, Mr. Ragsdale does not know what he is talking about.

Listed below are a few items that we have taken from the commissioners court minutes from the past six year.

January 13, 1986 --- Commissioner Mayo made the motion to provide \$12,000.00 to the City for the purchase of front end loader for the landfill. Seconded by Joy. Vote Unanimous.

July 25, 1988 -- City and county sign inter-local agreement.

September 26, 1988- County agrees to sell a used Ford Truck and trailer to the city for one dollar. (\$1.00)

June 11, 1990 --- Commissioner Mayo made a motion to sell a used International dump truck to the city for one dollar (\$1.00). Second by Whitten, unanimous.

August 13, 1990 --- Motion by Joy to share the cost of excavating the city landfill. Second by Mayo. Vote-unanimous.

August 26, 1990 --- Agreement with city signed by all commissioners.

April 22, 1991 --- Motion by Joy to give county owned land (lot 9, Block 105) to the city. Seconded by Mayo. Vote-unanimous.

February 24, 1992 --- County agrees to pay half the cost of a wood chipper purchased by the city. County's portion of cost \$8,000.

March 9, 1992 --- Motion by Mayo to sell a used county owned maintainer to the city for one dollar (\$1.00). Seconded by Joy. Vote-unanimous.

May 26, 1992 --- Court discusses issuance of bonds to help the city in street paving.

June 9, 1982 --- Two commissioners to meet with the city to share information the county received on bonds for paving of city streets.

The commissioners court has allowed the city to use county owned equipment from time to time and the city has had free access to county owned crushed rock and caliche for their streets for years. The city has always assisted the county with any

request, when possible, and I am not aware of a time that a city request has been refused by the county. For Mr. Ragsdale to infer there is a problem between the city and county is not only erroneous, it is irresponsible.
