Dairy Meeting Held

The Schleicher County Chamber of Commerce hosted a luncheon at the Memorial building this past Monday. The purpose of the meeting was to allow local citizens to question representatives of the Texas Water Commission, the Schleicher County Underground Water District, the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, the Texas Department of Agriculture and the Double Vision Dairy concerning the proposed placement of a 6,000 cow dairy in the north part of Schleicher County.

Approximately 100 citizens gathered to discuss and ask questions concerning the dairy. Questions were directed to Gary Lloyd, the dairy's designer. According to Mr. Lloyd, though the people who live in close proximity to proposed dairy sites are usually in opposition to dairy placements, he did not expect to see much opposition here.

Opposition to this particular dairy seems to stem from people living close to the site and a group of citizens from San Angelo.

According to Robert Maggiani of the Texas Department of Agriculture, if the dairy follows its plan for grain acquisition approximately 5 million dollars worth of grain a year would be purchased from local farmers. Forty or fifty jobs would be added to our

county. \$4000 to \$5000 dollars additional property taxes would be collected for the county.

One opponent of the dairy, who says that he wants to remain anonymous, stated that he would do everything in his power to keep the dairy from locating here.

Any rabbit that will be shown at the stock show must be validated your rabbits by contacting Marvin Clark at 853-3116 or 853-3349, Jerry Swift at the County Agent's Extension Office or Mr. Bill Sudduth, F.F.A. teacher.

The rabbit show is scheduled for Thursday, January 14, 1993. All rabbits must have a legible tattoo in the left ear. If your rabbits are not tattooed, the validation committee will be able to tattoo the rabbit for you. You must call to set up a home validation time.

There will be classes for Fancy Rabbits and Commercial Class as well as for Meat. Be sure and call before December 18th in order to be able to show your rabbits at the stock show.
