## Trust Fund Established For Steve Fletcher

A trust fund account has been opened at the First National Bank in Eldorado for Steve Fletcher in Eldorado for Steve Fletcher to help offset medical expenses. Steve was burned in an explosion and fire at his home on Poplar Street on May 3, 1993. He was taken by helicopter from Schleicher County Medical Center a few hours later to Brooks Army Medical Center's Burn Unit in San Antonio where he has remained in ICU and is in very critical condition. He has been through numerous surgeries for skin grafts; has been given many units of blood; and has had all ten fingers amputated at different places.

Steve moved to Eldorado in 1979, living with his Aunt and Uncle, Jeri and Hal Whitten. He went to work for Western Company when

Western came to Eldorado. He later worked for Oglesby Wool and Mohair and was employed with Fitts Construction at the time of his accident.

Steve's mother, Martha has been with him continuously. She lives in San Angelo.

Steve has had many ups and downs while in the Burn Unit - pneumonia, heart problems, infections - but through the many prayers of friends and relatives and a strong will to live he seems to "hang on."

## TOP OF THE DIVIDE

I know we need trash cans and I know we need different sizes but what I don't know is why we need different shaped cans of the same size. ### FNB Files Application For Holding Company Approval

The First National Bank of Eldorado has made public the intent to apply for approval by regulatory authorities and bank stockholders for the formation of a bank holding company in the name of First Eldorado Bancshares. This action has been under consideration by the Board of Directors for several months.

Organizationally, the bank holding company is a separate corporation, organized and under the supervision of the Federal Reserve System. Application is currently on file with the Federal Reserve, with the proposed officers and directors being the same and in the same capacities as those currently serving First National Bank.

Under this two-tiered structure, assets may be held by the holding company which cannot be owned by a national bank. This flexibility will offer capabilities for additional services to the bank's customers.

The approval process, including approval by the OCC, Federal Reserve Bank and First National Bank Stockholders, will require from four to six months from the present time.

Under this proposed arrangement, banking services would remain unchanged with the same local ownership and the same personnel available to take care of the banking needs for Eldorado and Schleicher County.

### PHR 3 Begins Summer Immunization Initiative

The Texas Department of Health - Public Health Region 3 (PHR 3) has begun a summer immunization initiative focusing on preschool age children.

"This initiative reflects the concerns both President Clinton and governor Richards have expressed," according to Joseph Trillo, Immunization Program Manager for PHR 3. "The campaign is called 'No More Excuses -- For Their Sake VACCINATE,' we want every child in each community to be fully immunized against disease by their second birthday."

Region 3 has received nearly \$250,000 to hire staff and purchase supplies and some equipment for this initiative.

"The majority of the money is being designated to hire outreach workers to go door-to-door in the neighborhoods and identify children at risk of preventable diseases," said Trillo. "We want the people in the communities to be aware that they will be visited by a TDH representative."

Public Health Region 3 will lead an intense outreach campaign to survey community member's needs, inform people of the importance of immunizing their children and letting them know when and where immunization clinics will be held. Special clinics will be established on weekends and/or evenings if needed. Each county in the 36 county region will have a special emphasis on immunizations, with access to immunization clinics for the residents.

**\*DEFINITION OF INCOME**  
Income means total cash receipts before taxes from all sources, with the exceptions noted below. Income includes money, wages or salary before deductions; net income from non-farm self-employment; net income from farm self-employment; regular payments from Social Security or railroad retirement; payments from unemployment compensation, strike benefits from union funds, workers' compensation, veterans benefits, public assistance (including Aid to Families with Dependent Children, Supplemental Security Income, Emergency Assistance money payments, and non-Federally funded General Assistance or General Relief money payments); training stipends; alimony, child support, and military family allotments or other regular support from an absent family member or someone not living in the household; private pensions, government employee pensions (including military retirement pay), and regular insurance or annuity payments; college or university scholarships, grants, fellowships, and assistantships; and dividends, interest, net rental income, net royalties, and periodic receipts from estates or trusts; and net gambling or lottery winnings.

As defined here, income does not include capital gains; any assets drawn down as withdrawals from a bank, the sale of property, a house or a car; or tax refunds, gifts, loans, lump sum inheritances, one-time insurance payments, or compensation for injury. Also excluded are noncash benefits, such as the employer-paid or union-paid portion of health insurance or other employee fringe benefits; food or housing received in lieu of wages; the value of food and fuel produced and consumed on farms; the imputed value of rent from owner-occupied non-farm or farm housing; and such Federal noncash benefit programs as Medicare, Medicaid, food stamps, school lunches, and housing assistance.

The period of time to be considered for eligibility is the twelve months immediately preceding the month in which application or reapplication for enrollment of a child in a Head Start program is made, or for the calendar year immediately preceding the calendar year in which the application or reapplication is made, whichever more accurately relates to the family's current needs.
