Graveside services were held at 10:30 a.m. July 13th in Fairmount Cemetery with Father Robert Hodges officiating.

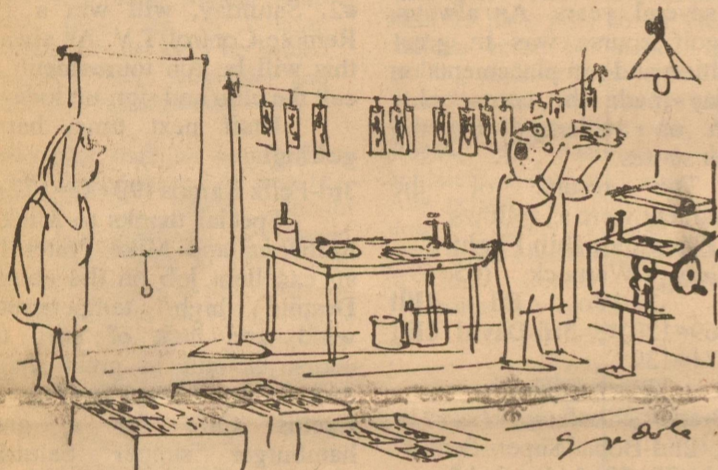

Building Bridges

Building Bridges is now accepting applications for persons wanting to participate in our volunteer training program to be offered in the fall. Hospice of San Angelo sponsors this unique program that began two years ago.

Building Bridges was designed specifically to address the needs of children in grief. It offers understanding and support for any child in the community grades K-12 who has lost a significant loved one to death. The children come for six consecutive weeks on Monday nights beginning

October 11 and are facilitated in small groups by trained volunteers. This is not therapy, but rather a time of skilled and directed listening to children.

Common Questions About Water Testing

submitted by the Plateau Underground Water Conservation & Supply District

WHY DO I NEED MY WATER TESTED? Generally, problems can be detected and solved before an irreversible situation occurs. While there are programs to clean up contaminated aquifers, none have been completely successful.

WHAT COULD BE CONTAMINATING MY WELL? Many sources of contamination are likely here in Schleicher County. Septic tanks, improperly constructed and/or maintained is a major concern. Oilfield construction, particularly wells closed years ago, are cropping up and showing signs of age with leakage into the aquifer. Improper waste disposal of oil and gas products, paint products, etc. are another problem. Cesspools, which are illegal, can cause water well contamination. Abandoned holes or wells with no caps or plugs provide another avenue to our water. Remember, what we put in the ground can eventually find its way to the water source.

BUT I'VE NEVER HAD TROUBLE BEFORE. WHY SHOULD I WORRY NOW? Hopefully, you will never have trouble with your water well. However, as the old saying goes, "an ounce of prevention is worth more than a pound of cure." Why not be safe instead of sorry.

HOW DO I GET MY WATER TESTED? Easy, just pick up the phone and call the Water District office at 853-2121.

WHAT'S INVOLVED IN TESTING MY WATER? Answer a few questions and direct the Water District personnel to the location of your water well.

WILL I BE ABLE TO FIND OUT THE RESULTS OF THE WATER TEST? Yes, you will receive a copy of the test results, comments of the quality of your water and any action that is required.

HOW MUCH DOES THIS COST? The Water District provides water testing as a service free of charge to well owners.

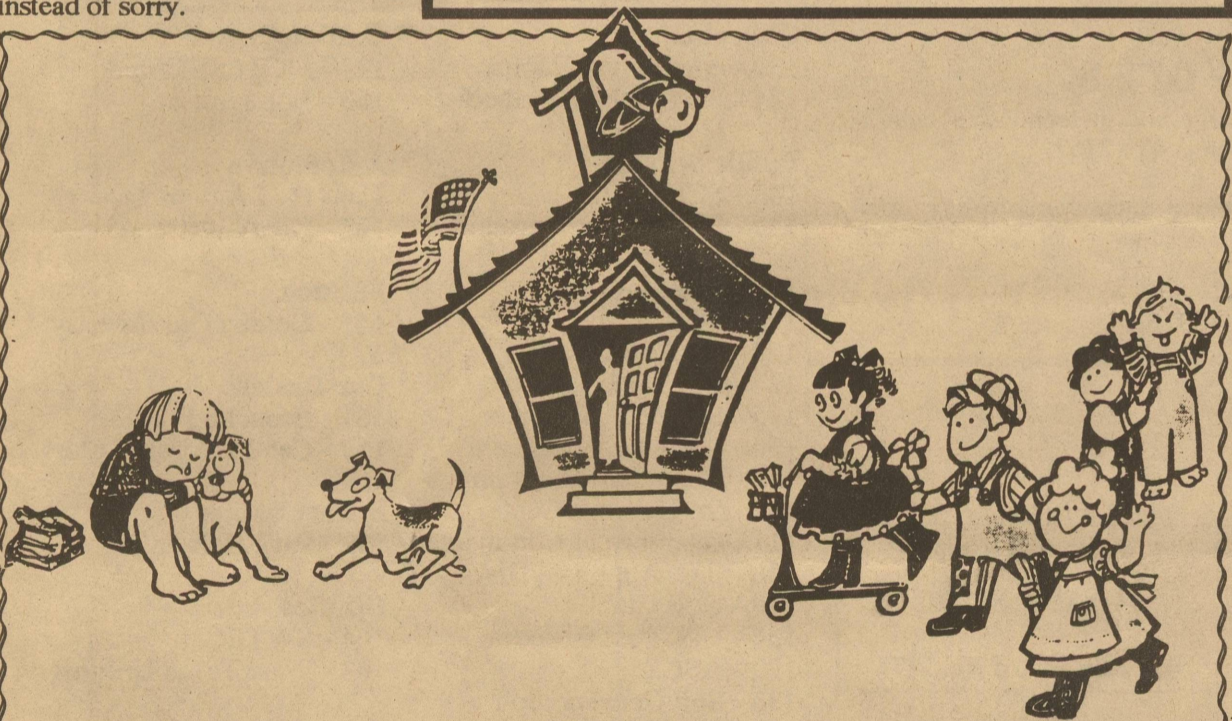

National School Lunch/ Breakfast Program

The Schleicher County I.S.D. school serves meals each school day. Children may buy lunch for K-4 - \$1.10, 5-8 - \$1.20, 9-12 - \$1.30, and breakfast for 50¢. Adult teachers may buy lunch for \$1.75 and guests may buy lunch for \$3.45. Children may also get meals free or at a reduced price.

If you now get food stamps or AFDC for your children, your children can get free meals. If your total household income is the same or less than the amounts on the Income Chart below, your children can get free meals or reduced price meals. A foster child may get free or reduced price meals regardless of your income. The reduced price is 40¢ for lunch and 25¢ for breakfast.

To get free or reduced price meals for your children, you must complete an application and return it to the school. We cannot approve an application that is not complete.

How To Apply

If you now get food stamps or AFDC for the child you are applying for, the application must have the child's name, a food stamp or AFDC case number for that child, and the signature of an adult household member. If you are applying for a foster child, the application must have the child's name, the child's "personal use" income, and an adult signature. If you do not list a food stamp or AFDC case number for the child's name, the names of all household members, the amount

of income each person got last month and where it came from, the signature of an adult household member and that adult's social security number or the word "none" if the adult does not have a social security number.

Verification: Your eligibility may be checked at any time during the school year. School officials may ask you to send papers showing that your children should get free or reduced price meals.

Fair Hearing: You may talk to school officials if you do not agree with the school's decision on your application or the results of verification. You may also ask for a fair hearing. You may do this by calling or writing:

Reporting Changes: If your children get free or reduced price meals because of your income, you must tell the school if your household size decreases or your income increases by more than \$50 per month or \$600 per year. If your children get meals because you get food stamps or AFDC, you

must tell the school when you are not getting AFDC or food stamps for them. You may then fill out another application giving income information.

Confidentiality: School officials use the information on the application only to decide if your children should get free or

reduced price meals.

Reapplication: You may apply for meals anytime during the school year. If you are not eligible now but have a change in status, like a decrease in household income, an increase in household size, become unemployed or get food stamps or AFDC for your children, you

may then complete an application.

Handicapped: Meal substitutions at no additional cost for children who meet the definition of "handicapped" will be served, provided a physician has submitted a statement attesting to this fact and prescribing a substitute.

In the operation of the child feeding programs, no child will be discriminated against because of race, sex, color, national origin, age or handicap. If you believe you have been discriminated against, write immediately to the Secretary of Agriculture, Washington, 20250.

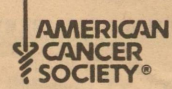

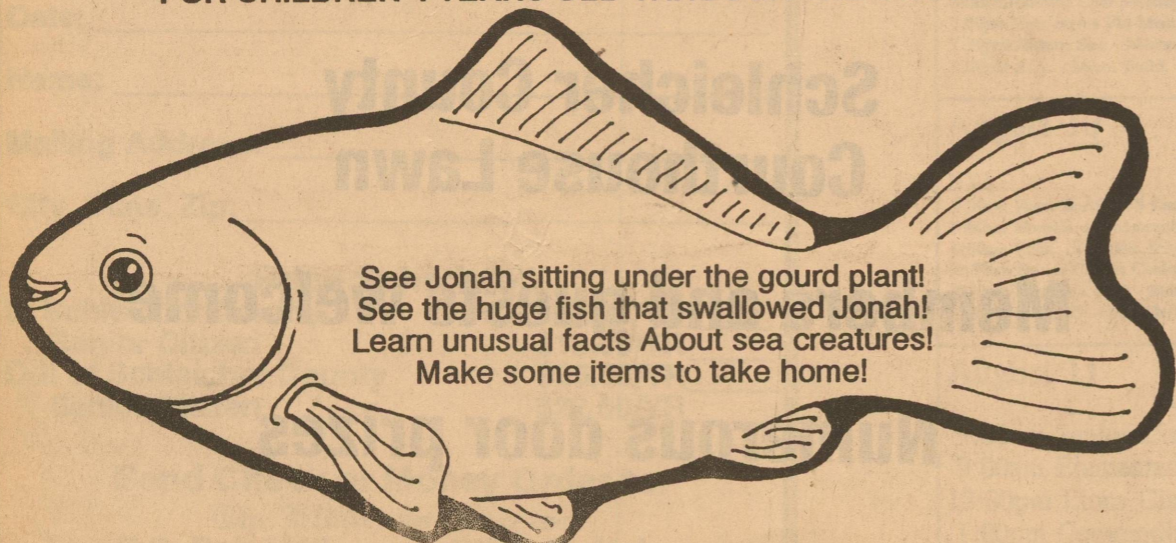
