This Saturday, April 3rd is the statewide clean-up entitled "The Great Texas Trash-Off." Eldorado will again be participating with our own City-Wide clean-up, better known as "E-Day."

The schedule for the clean-up is as follows:

9:00 a.m. - Registration for everyone (volunteers and Adopt-A-Highway groups) on the north side of the courthouse. AAH groups will clean their highway and all other volunteers will work in the city.

10:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. - Information Center open at the Memorial Building

12:00 noon - Everyone (city volunteers and AAH groups) meet at Memorial Building for lunch.

1:00 p.m. - Everyone (city volunteers and AAH groups) continue to work in the city only.

1:00-4:00 p.m. - Information center open at the Memorial Building

The Ministerial Alliance will be providing a nursery for workers' children ages 3 and under at the First United Methodist Church. The children need to bring a

sack lunch upon arriving at the church nursery.

All Adopt-A-Highway groups need to call Carolyn Scroggins at the Sonora T-DOT office, 387-2848, to have bags and vests delivered for your group. After cleaning you need to call her again to receive credit for the cleaning.

Also, as a reminder, all volunteers are asked to bring trailers, pickup trucks, mowers, gas weed-eaters, rakes, brooms, etc. for the clean-up. Coca-Cola will provide bags for the City-Wide clean-up. After filling the bags, please put the bags along the curbs or next to dumpsters in alleys only. Please DO NOT put bags in streets or where they will block alleys.

The City trucks will be picking up trash that day and the Sanitary Landfill will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Hearing Held For Dairy

On Tuesday, March 30th, the Texas Water Commission held a preliminary hearing in Eldorado concerning the location of Double Vision Dairy. Although a majority of those persons attending were in favor of having the dairy in Schleicher County, Double Vision dairy was not directly represented.

It has been reported that certain parties opposing the dairy were able to persuade Double Vision Dairy representatives to choose another site location.

San Angelo Attorney John Hemphill represented those who are opposed to the dairy.

Mike Rogan, Hearings Examiner from the Texas

Water Commission, stated that this hearing was held to consider jurisdiction and party status for the application.

Kathy Keils, representative of the executive director of the Texas Water Commission, Jesus Garza, commented, "As of now I don't know which way that will go."

Desiderio Mora, permits coordinator for the Agricultural Section of the Texas Water Commission, was also present.

Ronnie Sauer, John Nikolauk, Johnny Griffin and others spoke about the favorable impact that a dairy would have on our community.

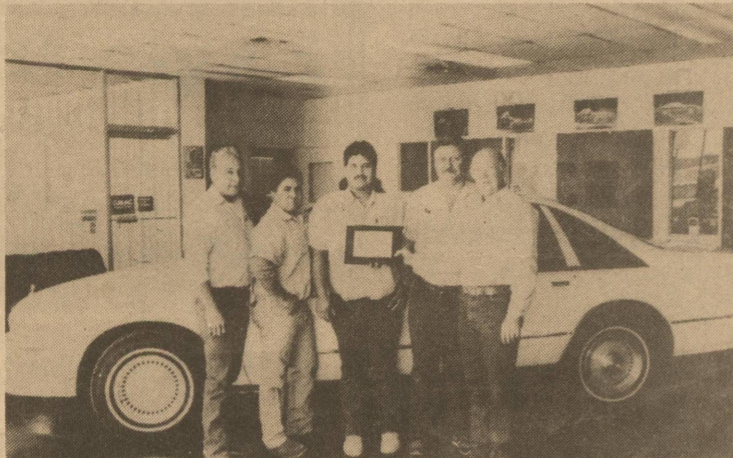

The Blowout is an annual triple rabbit show that is put on by 3 Texas Rabbit Clubs, hosted by Tom Green County Rabbit Club. The show was an open American Rabbit Breeders Association show and held at the MIR building. There were between 600 and 650 rabbits entered in each show.

Amy Clark's rabbit "Bee," a Californian Senior Doe, won Best of Breed, Best of 6 Class and Best in Show in the show sponsored by the Concho Valley Breeders Association. She then went on to win the Best of the Best West Texas Blowout IV award in which the Best In Shows of the 3 individual shows were judged by all 9 judges present at the show. The rabbit receiving the majority of votes from the

judges wins the award. "Bee," much to the delight of Marvin and Russell, was selected. It was a great surprise for Amy who couldn't attend the show due to a track meet.

Amy and Russell have been showing rabbits for 5 years. They have traveled to Oklahoma, Florida, California and Ohio to compete in national shows as well as numerous Texas shows.

Amy raises Californians and Jersey Woolies. She has a total of 4 Best in Shows and numerous Best of Breeds in both of the breeds she raises.

Russell raises Harlequins, Florida Whites and Netherland Dwarfs. He also has several Best of Breed awards and was the #1 youth Harlequin breeder in the U.S. in 1990 and 1991 as well as the 1990 ARBA Rabbit Prince and the 1992 Creative Writing winner at

the 1992 ARBA Convention in Ohio.

Both children have several showmanship awards, not only in rabbits but in heifers and pigs at our county show. Amy's most recent showmanship in rabbits was at a San Antonio show in April of 1992. Russell won Junior Rabbit Showmanship at the 1993 San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo.

Both children compete in open shows with adult competition due to the scarcity of sanctioned youth shows within a 5 hour driving time.

Amy will be receiving a third place sweepstakes award for Californian points earned in 1992 at the Texas Rabbit Breeders Association

State Show in Belton this weekend. She and Russell will also be competing in the TRBA King and Queen Youth Contests.

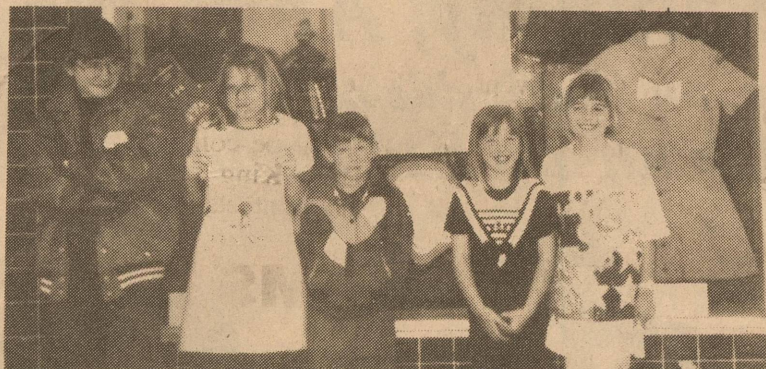

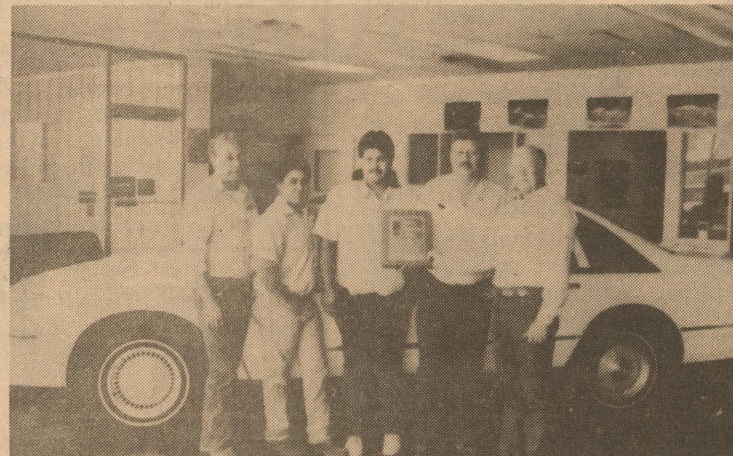

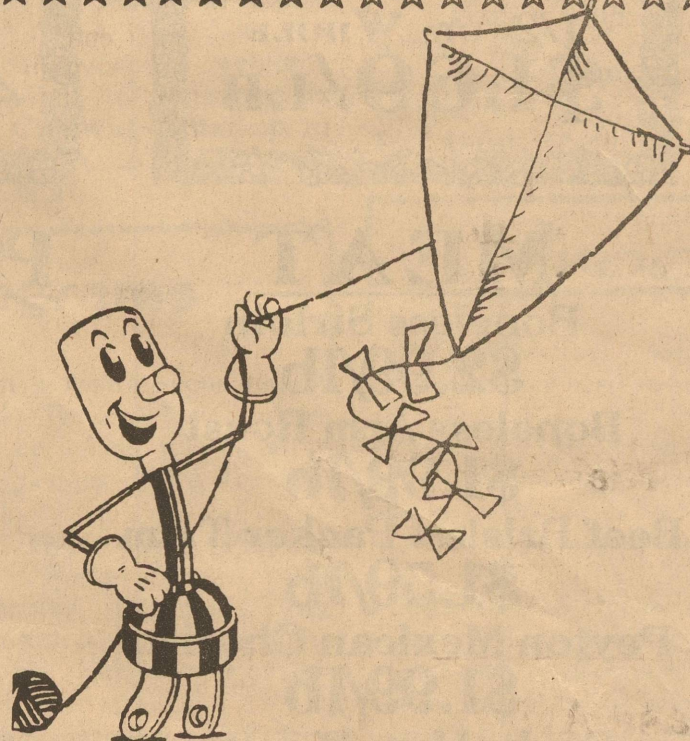
