Editor's Journal

TOP OF THE DIVIDE by Thomas Giovannitti

This Sunday is Easter Sunday. For many of us Easter is so intimately connected with the beginning of Spring. Spring is the season of newness, change, a fresh start. The Earth is starting over with new Blue Bonnets and other early flowers. Maybe more so in times past Easter brought out the print dresses and straw hats in anticipation of the warmer weather.

My own strong memories of childhood Easter really are more reflective of the Thursday, Friday and Saturday just preceding Easter. Holy Week was filled with much ceremony leading up to the celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus. The

Midnight Easter Vigil, full of candles and revived praise singing and many bells was the culmination of a week of liturgical drama that unfolded in my young life every Spring.

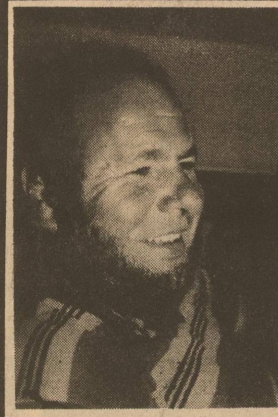
The Holy Thursday service was filled with the symbolism of that last Passover meal of Jesus with his Apostles. As an Altar boy I was intimately involved in the ceremony. After the offering the priest would divest and wrap a towel around himself and wash the feet of twelve parishioners just as we had heard in the bible that Jesus had done to his Apostles to show them the way. We also had candles mounted on poles. Eight altar boys, in two rows each

holding a lighted candle in a red glass wind shield would lead the procession at the end of Thursday's service as the priest, wrapped in a cloak and another vestment carried our beliefs to repose in a small chapel away from the main sanctuary. He went down the center aisle around to one of the side isles all the way around to the other side and finally out the side door to the chapel. As the procession passed each member of the congregation had his or her chance for one last glimpse of Jesus with the eyes of their heart.

We, the altar boys and the priest would then return and strip the altar bare. All of the statues and any other

distraction were covered in purple giving the church an almost sepulchral air.

Now, people would take turns waiting with Jesus in the little chapel, usually an hour just as He had asked Peter, James and John to watch one hour while He prayed in the Garden. Good Friday services were even more dramatic but this article is already too long. I do know this much, all of those memories have left with me, I think, a much deeper appreciation of just what it means when Jesus said, "There is no greater love than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13). He did and I hope I am His friend.

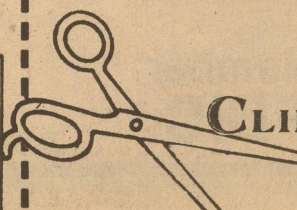

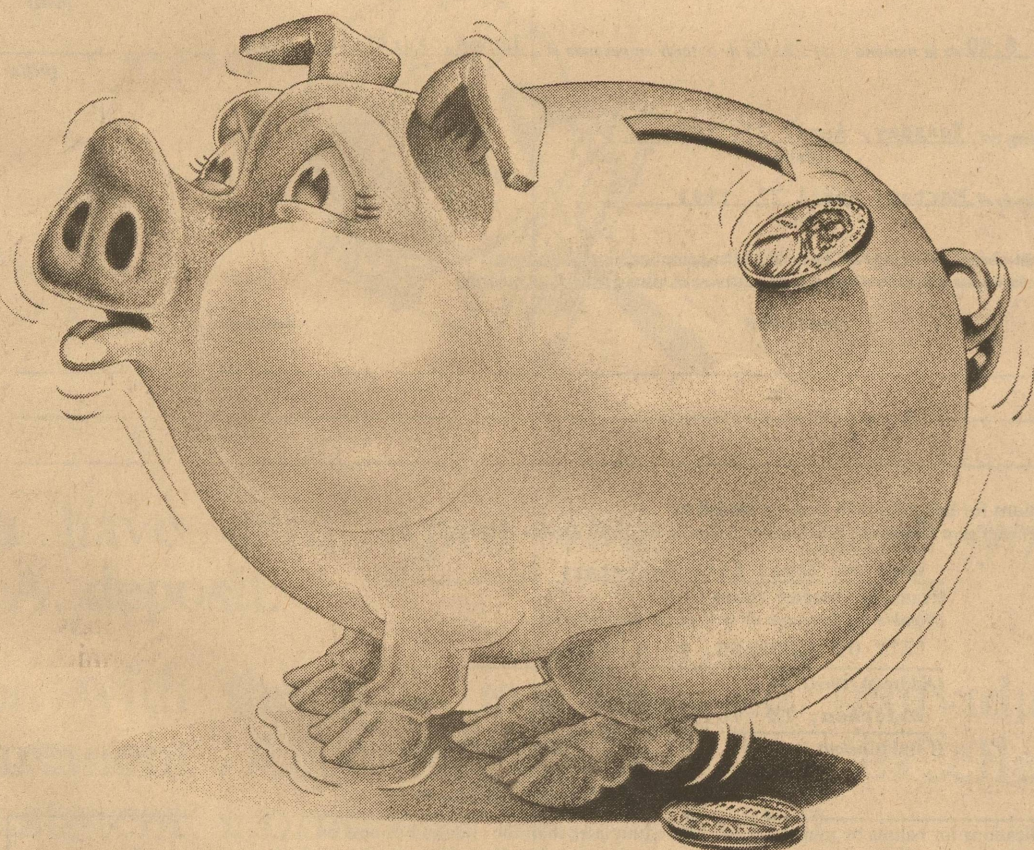

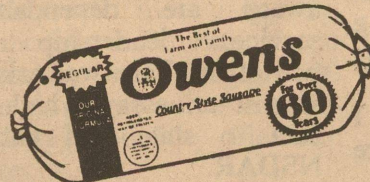

If anyone asked you, "Exactly what does a school board trustee do," would you admit that before I became a member of this privileged group of unpaid paraprofessionals, my ideas about the board members' responsibilities were a little vague. I must also apologize if the following explanation seems a little preachy or presumptuous; of course I realize that I am still a newcomer to this town (I have only lived here since 1973), and that my entire board experience totals no more than one year, but in view of the upcoming election I would like to help out with a few points I have come across:

In my understanding the most important role of the school board is to *define and access the educational goals of the school district*. All other responsibilities derive from this most important

obligation:

- The board adopts or adapts the policies that make sure these goals can be accomplished.

- The board hires the superintendent to administer these policies; the board does to get involved in the day-to-day administration of these policies.

- The board sets the budget and tax rate that will allow the administration to implement the stated policies effectively.

- The board monitors and evaluates the success of these policies, and changes them if advisable.

Most of all, board members keep in mind how

their decisions will effect the learning of all children in their district; at the same time they constantly try to evaluate the feedback they get from the community. (And they try to inform the public about the school board's role...)

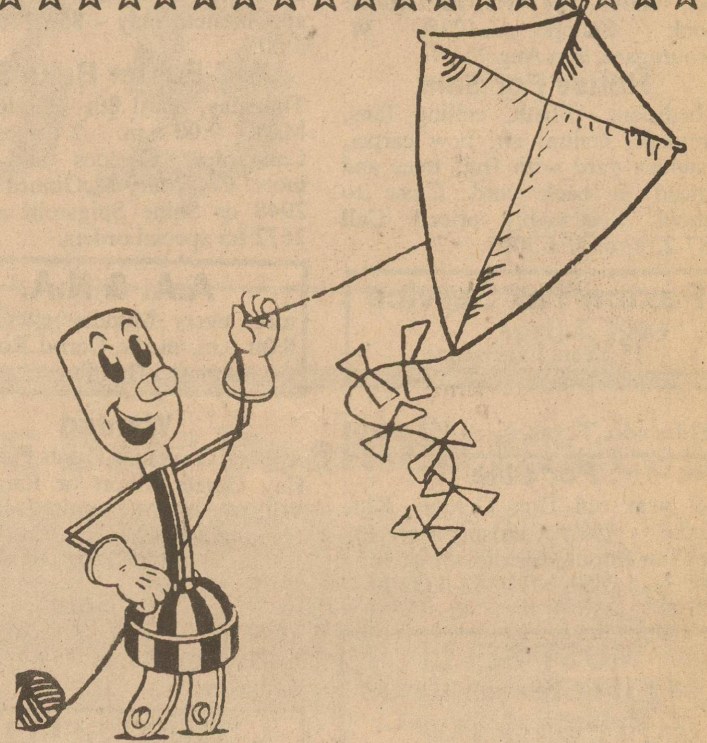


Kite Flyer's Code
