On September 1, 1901 fifteen men and women joined together to establish the Eldorado Missionary These Church. charter members felt the need to establish their religious preference in a community of God loving citizens.

The first church structure was completed in 1906 on property donated by W.B. Silliman. Its seating capacity was 250. 
