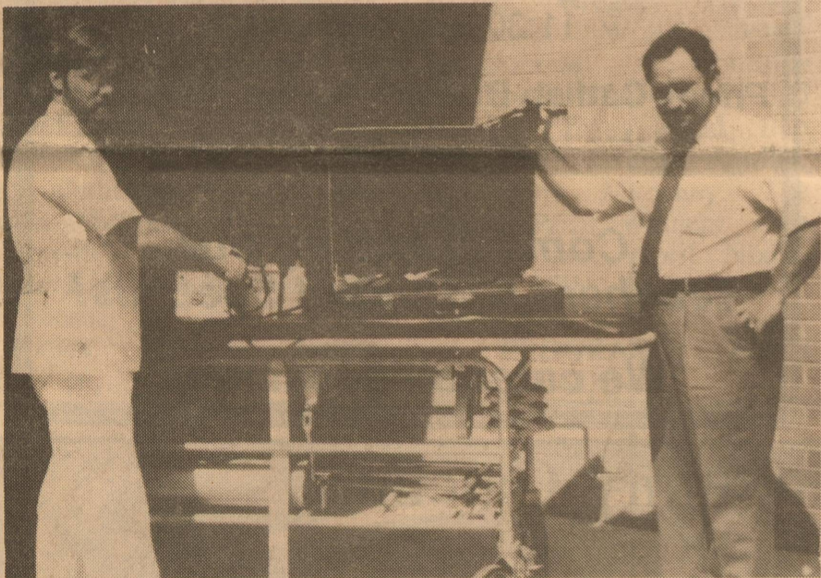

The other day I received a book from Reader's Digest, "Birds of North America." Besides giving me yet another chance to enter the reader's Digest Sweepstake I also really wanted the book to help identify the winged creatures I see every day around here.

When I was about twelve I received a book with birds in it. Each bird was pictured with a short description of its habits and where it usually lived, and if it was migratory where it lived each season. When I was twelve seeing all those different birds made me curious and so I would look in that book taking great

pride in being able to find the species and learning a few things about its habits and habitats. Of course, I turned thirteen and I lost interest in birds, for awhile anyway.

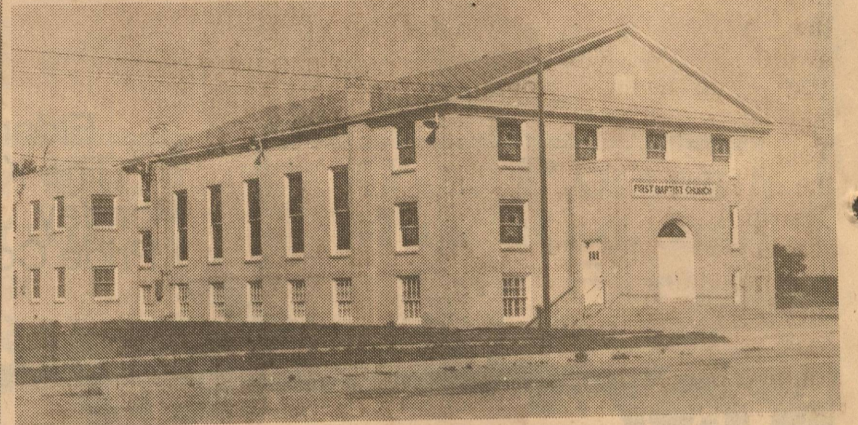
the kids have mentioned the number and variety of winged creatures that seem to live around here or at least visit here.

On September 1, 1901 fifteen men and women joined together to establish the Eldorado Missionary Church. These charter members felt the need to establish their religious preference in a community of God loving citizens.

The day following its organization seven people baptized in the South Concho River by Rev. Ben Wilson, were added to the congregation. Rev. Y.F. Barnett served as the churches first pastor.

The first church structure was completed in 1906 on property donated by W.B. Silliman. Its seating capacity was 250. This building was so high off the ground open range sheep would crawl under the building and often disrupt services. In 1928, this structure was torn down and replaced with the present brick structure. The Rev. J.L. Ratliff served as pastor and chief carpenter during this time of construction. In the 1950's and '60's the church was remodeled, a preschool annex and new parsonage was added. In 1986, the church built a 6,000 square

foot fellowship hall. The name was changed to First Baptist Church in 1925. The church helped organize local Minority Baptist Churches and supports community-wide outreach and foreign missionary activities.

Join the First Baptist Church Family and the Historical Society on June 6th in a dedication ceremony honoring the history of this church with an Official Texas Historical Marker. Church services will be held at 10:55 a.m. with the dedication

following at 12:15 p.m. A dinner will be held in the Fellowship Hall following the dedication. Special guests invited are family descendants of charter members, former pastors, music and youth directors of the church, and government officials.

KTB Finalists

Keep Texas Beautiful, Inc. (KTB) announced today the 46 Texas communities selected as finalists in the 1992-93 Governor's Community Achievement Awards, the highest environmental award in the state. Since 1968, this awards program, supported by the Governor of Texas, and co-sponsored by the Texas Department of Transportation, has recognized communities in nine population categories for their grassroots efforts in local environmental improvement through litter prevention, waste reduction and recycling, beautification, public education, and litter law enforcement.

"These 46 cities are the top contenders for state-wide recognition of their grassroots efforts to keep Texas the cleanest, most beautiful state in America," said Laura Lantrip, KTB Board Member from Mesquite, and Chairwoman of the Keep Texas Beautiful Awards.

The finalists (in population/alphabetical order) are: Category 1 (up to 1,000 population)-Oyster Creek, Seven Points, Zavalla; Category 2 (1,001 to 2,500 population)-Eldorado, Port Aransas, Wolf City; Category 3 (2,501 to 5,000 population)-Big Lake, Diboll, George West, Gun Barrel City, Smithville, Whitehouse, Wills Point; Category 4 (5,001 to 15,000 population)-Athens, Clute, Dickinson, Ft. Stockton, Gonzales, Mineral Wells, Richland Hills, Weatherford; Category 5 (15,001 to 25,000 population)-Alice, Burleson, Denison, Lake Jackson, Pampa, Pearland, Rockport/Fulton, Waxahachie; Category 6 (25,001 to 60,000 population)-Conroe, Haltom City, Lewisville, Lufkin, North Richland Hills; Category 7 (60,001 to

100,000 population)-Denton, Midland, Odessa, Wichita Falls; Category 8 (100,001 to 300,000 population)-Abilene, Bryan/College Station, Laredo, Mesquite, Plano, Waco; Category 9 (300,000 + population)-Austin, El Paso, San Antonio.

Judging of the finalist cities will take place in Austin during the week of June 1. The nine winning cities, one from each population category, will share a total of \$700,000 in landscape projects, funded by the Texas Department of Transportation.

The announcement of the winners of this highly competitive program will be made on June 2, and the awards will be presented at KTB's 26th Anniversary Convention, July 2, in Austin.

"On behalf of Keep Texas Beautiful, its officers and directors, I want to extend a very sincere thanks and congratulations to every city that entered the Governor's Awards and

thereby continued to make Texas the number one state nationally in preventing litter, in addressing solid waste challenges, and in the beautification of our natural environment," said Bill Vincent, KTB Board Chair from Richland Hills.

Keep Texas Beautiful, Inc., the non-profit state affiliate of Keep America Beautiful, Inc., provides grassroots solutions to Texas' solid waste and litter issues. 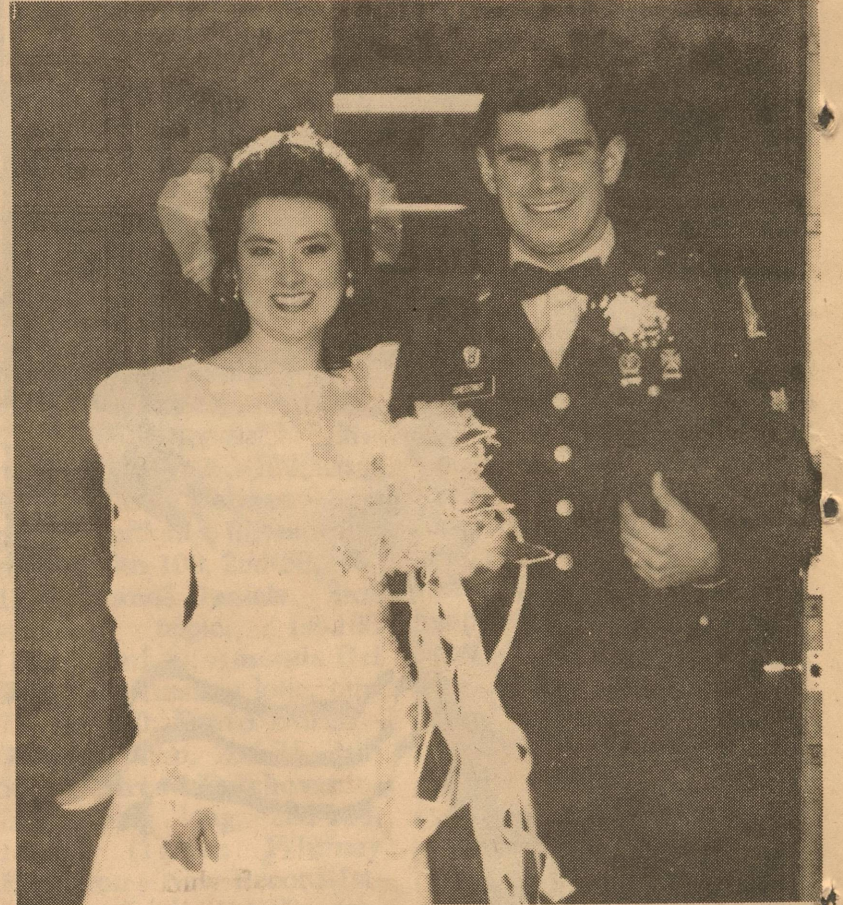
