## Medical Mission To Mexican Frontier

Six months ago, a small group from Schleicher County Medical Center began traveling to the frontier village of Cristales, near Ciudad Acuna, Mexico. It was the dream of Bertha Castillo (a citizen of Sonora and office nurse at the S.C.M.C. Pediatric Clinic) to improve health care for the people of her birthplace.

The project began with pediatric consultations and rapidly expanded into an educational program. Cardiopulmonary resuscitation and nutrition classes were held, as well as safe cooking practices and water use. Drinking water from their small river and a local well were analyzed, and the river water found relatively pure. The school children were organized in a cleanup effort with emphasis on keeping their river and lovely village in sagebrush country clean and healthful.

Cristales' clinic spent two months this spring without a physician. The pediatric and

educational groups welcomed assistance from Dr. Wimpee's orthopedic staff on one of the visits during that time of greater need. Now their young doctor has recently arrived to begin his new career and requests our continued specialty consultations.

In addition to the unexpected acute infections, injuries, nutritional deficiencies, skin problems, visual deficits, and allergies, major medical needs have been identified in several children. We have delighted in the improvement of some due to our efforts: an eleven year old who is hearing for the first time in her life thanks to an old hearing aid that was donated, and a ten year old girl with cerebral palsy whose ability to walk has improved with simple exercises. Other youngsters have not been so fortunate, though. A girl with congenital heart disease and a little boy with cancer need testing and treatment requiring

travel to a large hospital. Arrangements have been made for them to be seen at a university medical center in Saltillo next week. Dr. Peaslee will accompany them to facilitate their continuing care on return to Cristales. We apologize for the closing of the Pediatric Clinic at S.C.M.C. on June 28th - 30th, however the needs of these children are urgent. Dr. Sobredo's office in Eldorado will be open those days for our children's urgent needs.

We would like to thank everyone who has helped make our mission to Cristales possible, those who have joined us down the long, dusty road to work in the village, those who have made donations (clothing, blankets, toothbrushes, toys, medical supplies, and educational materials), Shannon Hospital for lending us their portable EKG machine and C.P.R. mannequins, and the San Angelo District United Methodist Church Council on Ministry (through application by First United Methodist Church of Sonora) for the recent monetary donation. As time and your enthusiasm permit, we hope to expand our program to other villages on the Mexican frontier.

We and the people of Cristales greatly appreciate your acts of kindness.

## TDA Offers Adopt-A-Nursing Home Program

The Texas Department of Health (TDH) has announced a new service which matches volunteer resources to the needs of nursing homes and their residents. Called Adopt-A-Nursing Home, the program coordinates volunteers from schools, churches, businesses and others in the community to enhance the lifestyles of long term care facility residents. It is the first such state-operated program in the nation.

Dr. David R. Smith, Texas Commissioner of Health, said that volunteers add "a priceless touch of humanity to the nursing home environment. No matter how thorough a nursing home is in providing for its residents, the unpaid kindnesses of volunteers often are what sustain a resident's well-being."

He said, "Statistics show that as many as 50 percent of

nursing home residents have no spouse or close relatives, and 60 percent have no regular visitors. For these people, the visits and activities freely given by volunteers can almost define the quality of life."

Dr. Smith explained that the Adopt-A-Nursing Home idea originated with one of Gov. Ann Richards' citizen advisors. The TDH volunteer program in the Public Health Promotion Division adapted the concept for use statewide. TDH licenses more than 1,000 nursing homes with about 120,000 beds.

Texas nursing home statistics show that one in four women and one in seven men will reside in a nursing home during their lives. Women currently outnumber men in nursing homes by three to one.

Sharon Rowley, Adopt-A-Nursing Home program manager, explained that the program helps the state's nursing homes by recruiting, training and recognizing the contributions of volunteers. The

program staff gathers information from nursing homes and community groups to match available services to residents' needs.

"Not only do the volunteers provide specific services for nursing home residents, their general concern and attentiveness while in the nursing facility greatly helps to improve morale of all residents," Rowley said.

"The guidelines for volunteer adopters are relatively simple," she said. "A minimum of three volunteers must commit in writing to donate at least four visits or agreed activities during a year. Such contributions may be one-on-one visits, parties, musical performances, oral histories or other services."

Rowley said there are no age requirements for volunteers. Also, established volunteer programs and organizations are invited to become nursing home adopters. Rowley and TDH regional staff members are available as speakers to potential volunteer groups.

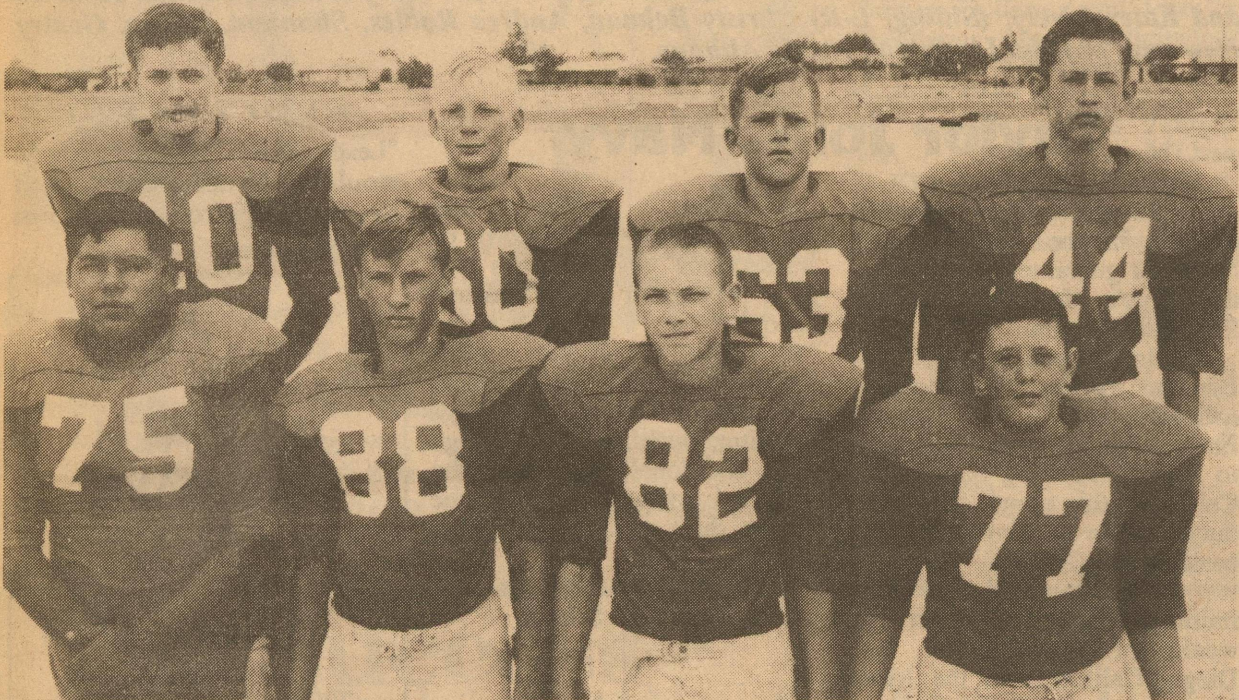
