## "Holiday Skies"

Angelo State University's Planetarium will present the annual "Holiday Skies" star program beginning Thursday, December 2nd, and running through Saturday, December 18th.

The "Holiday Skies" program traces a number of secular and religious holiday celebrations of the season to their roots in astronomy, according to Dr. Mark Sonntag, director of the University Planetarium at ASU.

The planetarium star projector will be used to travel across space and time to explore the possible astronomical origins of the "star of Bethlehem," Hanukkah candles, and Christmas tree lights. The planetarium projector's ability to

show the sky from any place on the earth and at any time will be used to show the night sky of 2,000 years ago and the annual path of the sun across the sky.

"The brilliant stars that grace winter evening skies will also be identified during the holiday season program," said Sonntag.

The ASU Planetarium is located in the Nursing-Physical Science Building. Show times for "Holiday Skies" are Thursday evenings at 8 p.m. and Saturday afternoons at 2 p.m. Tickets for the show are \$3 for adults, and \$1.50 for students, senior citizens, and ASU faculty and staff. The library staff is in the process of updating the patron address cards so that each reader can be given a new library card and "number." The library will receive a "Book Charger" machine in mid-December so each person will need a number as we will no longer put names on the check-out card. Because we are a small library we will be able to keep each persons card on file rather than have you keep up with the card each time you come to the library.

Past due books are a real problem at the library, so we feel this will eliminate some of our loss. Since January 1, 1993, the library has \$2870.00 worth

We are sorry to take such drastic steps, but we cannot afford to loose \$2870.00 worth of books either.

We ask you to be patient with our library staff if we are a little longer checking you out until we learn this new procedure. We may also ask you to fill out a new card.

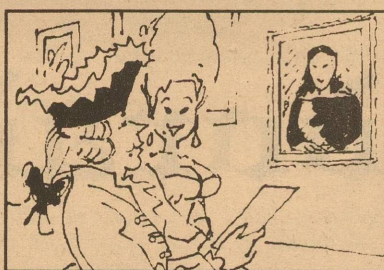
**Claudyne Yocham**

## Texas Commission For The Blind

The Texas Commission for the Blind offers a variety of services for children who are blind or visually impaired through the Blind and Visually Impaired Children's Program.

Early detection of potentially disabling eye conditions makes it possible to treat many of these children. In some cases, full sight can be restored; in others, blindness can be avoided and existing sight can be conserved and enhanced through visual aids.

Young children whose vision cannot be restored or corrected will need intensive specialized developmental stimulation, and their parents will need an equally strong support system during the early learning years. Service geared toward physical, mental, social and emotional development are critical.

Prevocational guidance, counseling and advocacy all apply important roles. Dependent upon the degree of vision loss, various types of low vision aids and technological equipment are needed to enhance learning, traveling and communicating skills.

Through a caseworker in its San Angelo office, the Commission offers service to blind children and their parents living in this area. If you or someone you know has a child who is blind or visually impaired, contact the Commission's San Angelo office at (915) 949-4601 or call toll free 1-800-252-5204 to find out more about agency services.

## "Book Thieves"

Book thieves and absent-minded readers cost America's libraries an estimated \$50 million a year, the American Library Association said.

Some libraries are turning to collection agencies.

"We've had people who lost material in high school and as adults go out to refinance their homes and discover their credit report says they owe money to the Schaumburg Public Library," said Jane O'Brien, circulation director at the Chicago suburban library.

"They're in shock, but we think it helps people realize the

value of the materials," she said. "A library card is just like a charge card."

The library loses an estimated 2 percent of its 500,000 volumes annually. About 1 percent of check-out books nationwide are never returned, according to the Chicago-based library association.

In an extreme example, police said two people last week confessed to stealing an estimated \$75,000 worth of books from Chicago's branch libraries.

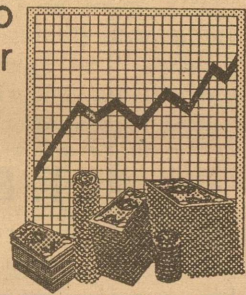
