

The Texas Commission for the Blind offers a variety of services for children who are blind or visually impaired through the Blind and Visually Impaired Children's Program.

Early detection disabling potentially conditions makes it possible to treat many of these children. In some cases, full sight can be restored; in others, blindness can be avoided and existing sight can be conserved and enhanced through visual aids.

Young children whose vision cannot be restored or corrected will need intensive specialized developmental stimulation, and their parents will need an equally strong support system during the early learning years. Service geared toward physical, mental, social and emotional development are

Prevocational guidance, counseling and advocacy all important Dependent upon the degree of visual loss, various types of low vision aids and technological equipment are needed to enhance learning, traveling and communicating skills.

Through a caseworker in its San Angelo office, the Commission offers service to blind children and their parents living in this area. If you or someone you know has a child who is blind or visually impaired, contact Commission's San Angelo office at (915) 949-4601 or call toll free 1-800-252-5204 to find out more about agency services.




