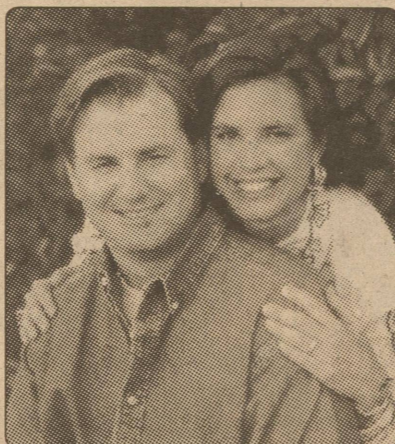

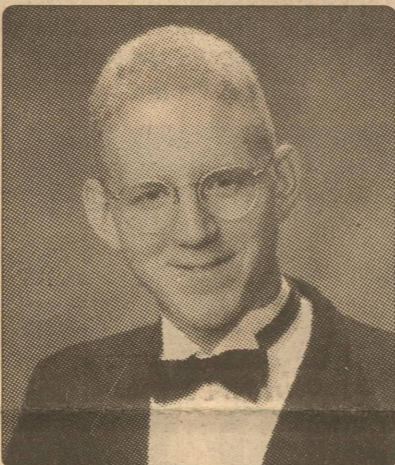
Stubbs-Griffin engagement

Dear Editor,

The Eldorado Ministerial Alliance is an association of Christian churches in Eldorado for the purpose of helping out those who need help. Our funds come basically from donations, and from offerings at our annual Thanksgiving service and Ice Cream Social. The citizens of Eldorado are what makes it possible for us to help others. We help people out regardless of religious belief, or no religious belief, whatever their age, race, sex, health condition, or disability. This help is given in the name of Christ, but no pressure is placed on anyone to adhere to any specific belief or domination.

In the thirteen months from February 1, 1997 to February 28, 1998, we made 57 disbursements for a total of \$3,805.46, for individuals or families of up to ten persons. We helped an estimated 200 people. Help included food, bus tickets, gas, car repairs, and overnight lodging for stranded travelers; and food, medicine, gas, clothing, burial expenses, and utility assistance for people who are residents of our town.

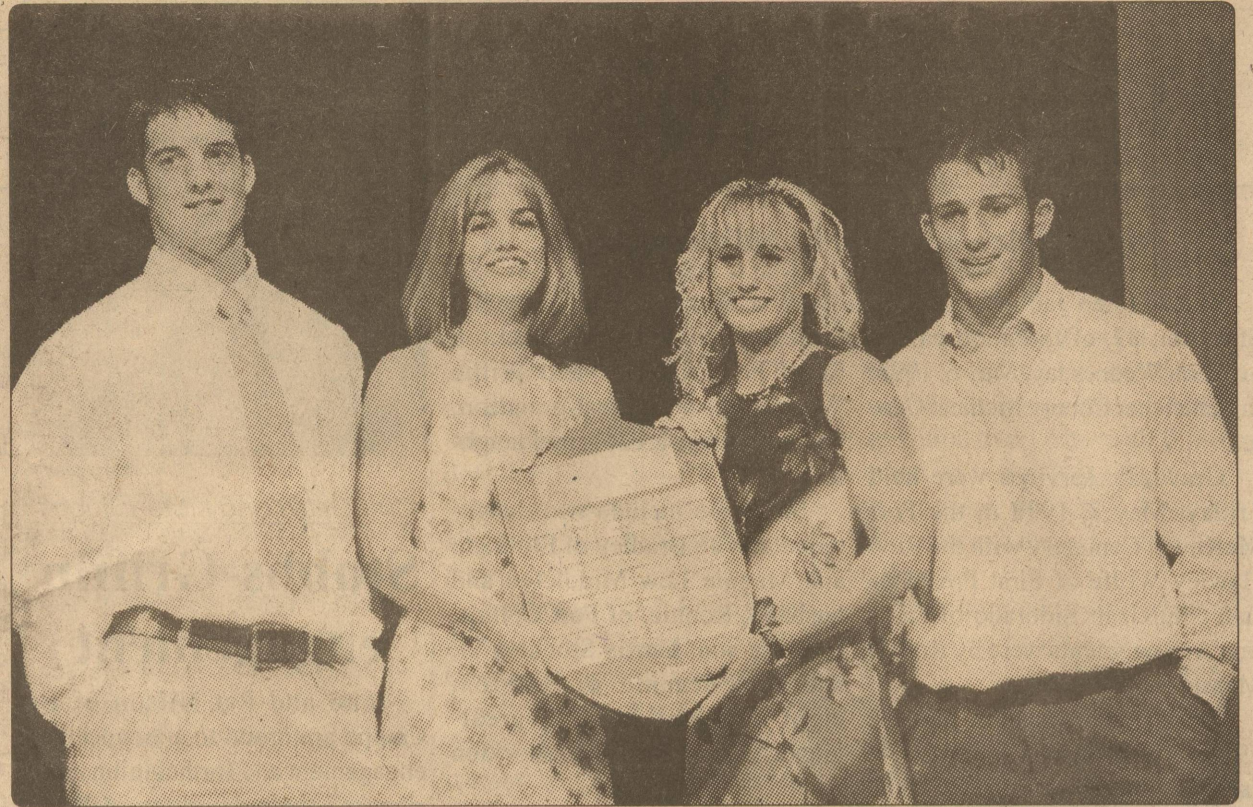

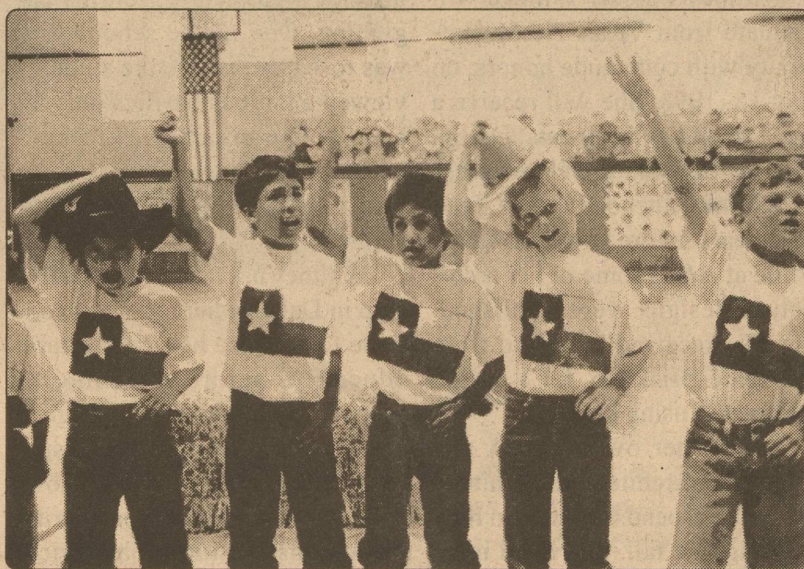

Plastic recycling event May 12 - June 13 in San Angelo

After trying for several years, the San Angelo Friends of the Environment (SAFE) are finally able to accept plastics...but only at specific times. You see, a company called USAg Recycling from Pasadena (Texas, that is) is willing to drive to San Angelo periodically to pick up plastic from the SAFE Citizens' Recycling Collection Center. USAg travels throughout Texas picking up used pesticide containers at the Coun-

try Cleanups sponsored by the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission.

USAg has agreed to make another trip to San Angelo in late June. Once again, they have pointed out that the main reason they are willing to come back is because the plastic that was collected in the first two recycling events was very clean, unlike most other community collections.

The third Plastic Recycling

Event is scheduled for May 12 (Tuesday) through June 13 (Saturday). ALL types of plastic will be accepted. Number 2 plastic should be separated from all the rest, as it is the easiest to recycle, and there is more demand for it.

Number 2 plastic is usually water jugs, milk jugs, juices, shampoos, antifreeze, and detergent bottles (any color). RINSE and remove the caps and lids. The caps and lids are placed with the Mixed Plastic.

Mixed plastic (numbers 1,3-7) can be soft drink bottles, medicine bottles, butter tubs, cookie trays, peanut butter jars, syrup bottles, lids and caps, etc. RINSE and re-

move any metal.

Anything plastic will be accepted except PVC pipe.

The plastic goes through a chipping process and is blown into large nylon bags (about a thousand pounds each), then the bags are transported to USAg warehouse in Pasadena. The chips are then sold to manufacturers.

Even though SAFE is unable to accept all of the time, we are very fortunate that USAg is willing to accept ALL TYPES of plastic. The plant in New Mexico has developed a way to fuse different types of plastic together through a chemical process instead of a melting process.
