## DR. TUNNICLIFF APPOINTED VETERINARIAN AT EXPERIMENT STATION.

Dr. E. A. Tunncliff, Veterinarian, formerly employed by the University of Illinois, has been appointed as Veterinarian of the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station and assigned to the Ranch Experiment Station located near Sonora, for the purpose of conducting work in the study of the diseases of livestock and particularly diseases most important to the sheep and goat industries of that section.

Dr. Tunncliff is a native of Wyoming. He received his D. V. M. degree and his Master of Science degree at Kansas Agricultural College and has done considerable work toward his Ph. D. degree at the University of Illinois. He is particularly well trained for the work and will devote his time specifically and systematically to the most important disease of the range.

The Ranch Station near Sonora has a fairly well equipped veterinary laboratory, which, together with the animals and traps available, will afford Doctor Tunncliff an opportunity to make progress in these studies. Supplemental to the work which will be done on the Station, Dr. Tunncliff will maintain close contact with any disease and problems which may occur on the different ranches and ranges, from which additional data may be gleaned contributing toward a full knowledge of the studies being made at the Station. These contacts through the courtesy of ranchmen afford a means of greatly augmenting the data relative to the nature, cause, and behavior of these troubles. Much basic information is available as to the more common troubles and both Doctor Tunncliff and Mr. W. H. Dameron, Superintendent, feel that an aggressive and systematic study of these troubles will result in sufficient additional information to point the way to the exact nature and cause of some troubles and relief or partial relief from the losses encountered.

## LYING FOR LOVE

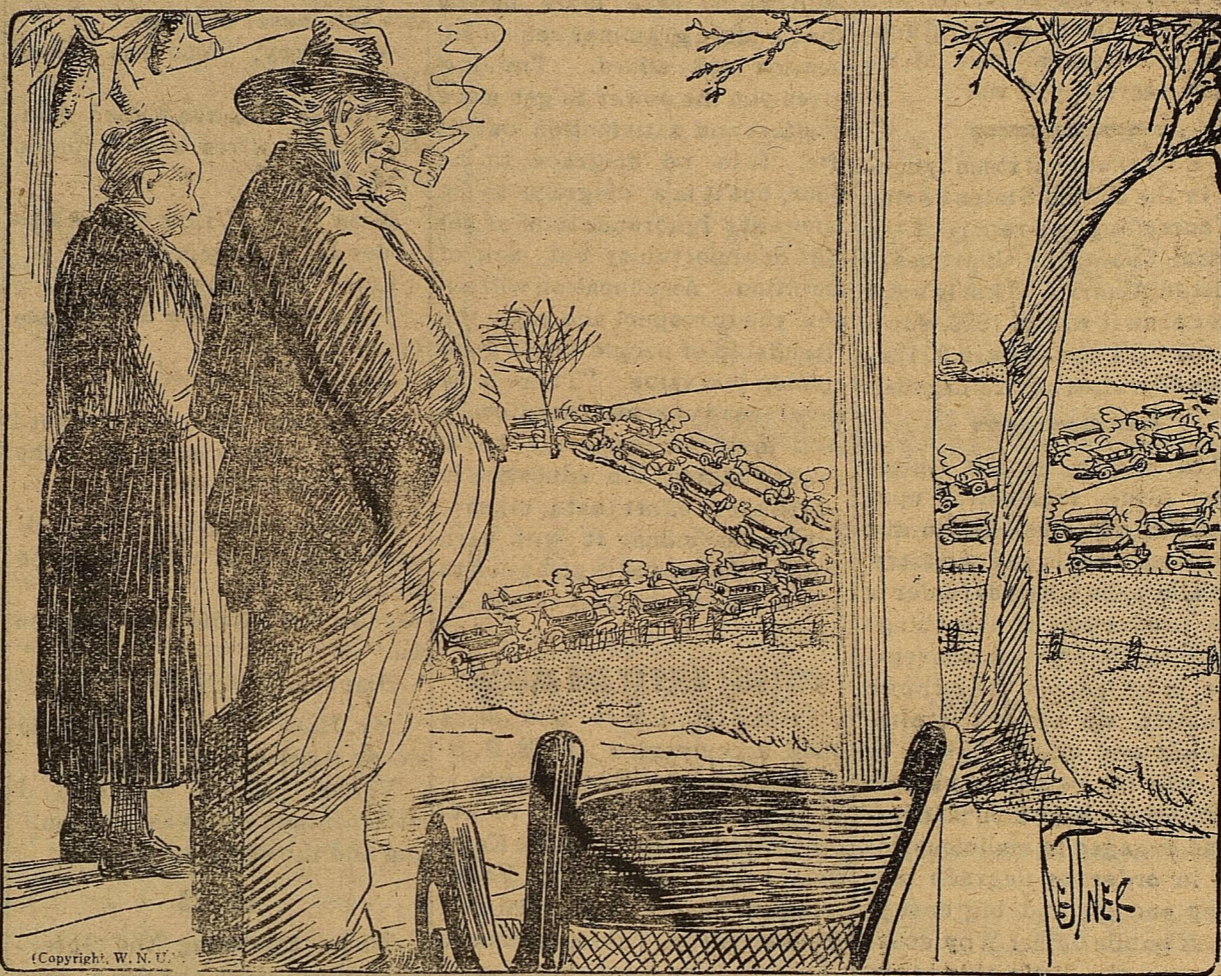

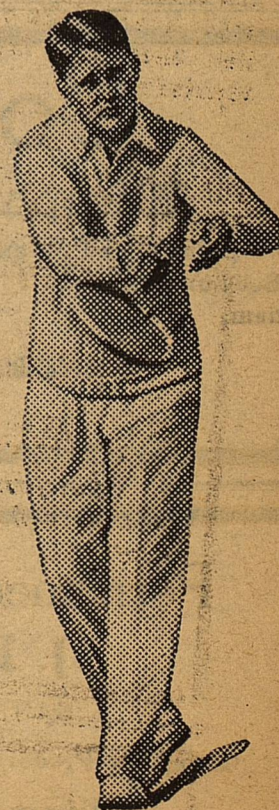

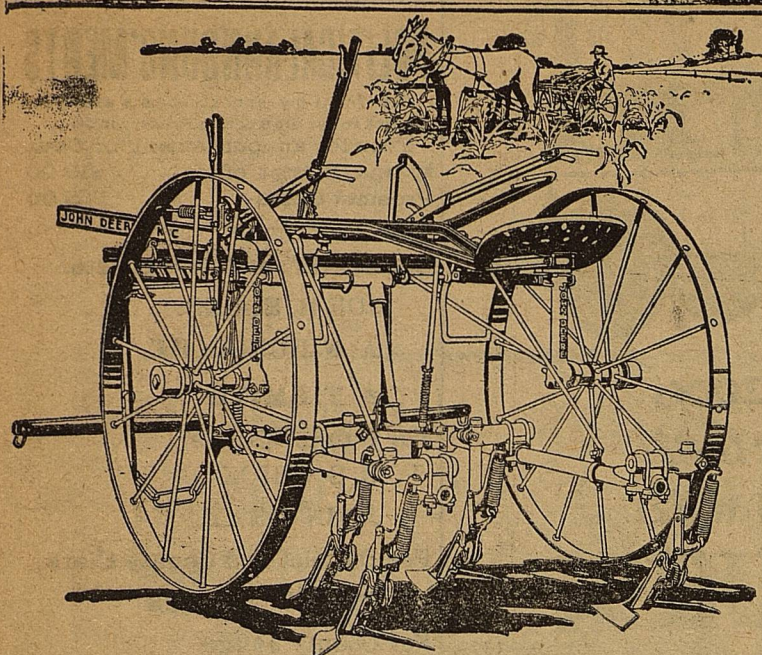

Sealed proposals addressed to the State Highway Engineer of Texas covering the following maintenance work will be received at the office of the State Highway Engineer at Austin, Texas, until 10.00 A. M. Tuesday, April 24, 1928, and then publicly opened and read.

#### Schleicher & Sutton Counties.

492,274 square yards of one course asphalt surface treatment on 29.95 miles of Highway No. 27 from Sonora East to the South draw of the Llano River, 7 miles West of the Kimble County line, and on 17.5 miles on Highway No. 30 from Sonora in Sutton County North to the South end of the present asphalt surfacing South of Eldorado in Schleicher County.

On the above jobs the surface treatment consists of 0.5 gallons of 250 penetration asphalt and 1 cubic yard of cover material to 40 square yards of surfacing in accordance with State Highway Department Standard Specifications, Item—A.

Separate bids are to be submitted for each job and the right is reserved to accept or reject any or all proposals or waive all technicalities.

Specifications and proposals can be had from the office of the State Highway Department, Austin, Texas.

Proposals shall be submitted in sealed envelopes and marked 'Bids for Maintenance Surface Treatment in Schleicher County enclosed in another envelope and mailed to Gibb Gilchrist, State Engineer, Austin, Texas.

A certified, or cashier's check for not less than 5 per cent of each bid, made payable without recourse to the order of the State Highway Commission of Texas, must accompany each proposal as guarantee that the bidder, if successful, will enter into contract and make bond.

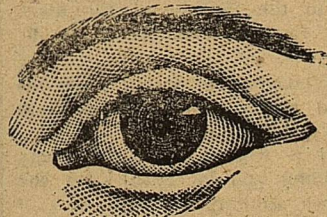

**Lesson for April 22**  
**JESUS AND THE HOME**

**LESSON TEXT**—Mark 10:1-16.  
**GOLDEN TEXT**—Honor thy father and mother, which is the first commandment with promise.  
**PRIMARY TOPIC**—Jesus Loves Little Children.  
**JUNIOR TOPIC**—Jesus Wants Children to Come to Him.  
**INTERMEDIATE AND SENIOR TOPIC**—Being a Christian at Home.  
**YOUNG PEOPLE AND ADULT TOPIC**—The Christian Family.

In this scripture we see Christ as a teacher.

1. Concerning Marriage (vv. 1-12). The question touching divorce, which the Pharisees temptingly put to Christ, brought forth teaching which exhibits marriage in its true light.

2. Marriage should not be degraded by divorce (vv. 1-5). Divorce was not instituted by God. God ordained the marriage relation and intended it to be indissoluble. Moses did not originate it or authorize it, but suffered, limited and regulated it. The reason Moses even suffered it was because of the hardness of the hearts of the people. The existence therefore and practice of divorce indicates the coarseness and perverseness of man. The real cause is sin. There is no more real evidence of the blighting effects of sin in the world than the increasing number of divorces.

3. Marriage God's primal law (vv. 6-8). The ideal law of life for the subjects of Christ's kingdom is marriage. This is proven by the fundamental fact of sex. "God made them male and female" (v. 6). The union of the male and female natures is physical, mental and spiritual. In marriage the male and female natures are mutually complemented.

"They twain shall be one flesh, so that they are no more twain, but one flesh." God's plan is that man should not be without the woman or the woman without the man (I Cor. 11:11).

4. Marriage has God's sanction (v. 9). When God created Eve and brought her to Adam He performed the first marriage ceremony and declared that man should leave father and mother and cleave unto his wife. "What therefore God hath joined together, let no man put asunder."

5. Marriage of the divorced forbidden (v. 10-12). The marriage relation should only be broken by death and sin. In response to the request of the disciples for further information He declared:

(1) "Whoever shall put away his wife and marry another committeth adultery against her."  
(2) "If a woman shall put away her husband and marry another she committeth adultery."

6. Concerning Children (vv. 13-16). The union of the male and female natures, according to God's primal law of marriage, lays the foundation of family life. The normal issue of such a union is children. In connection with the divine law of marriage it is fitting that Jesus should set forth His estimate of children and show His interest in them. Christian men and women will regard children as the property of the Lord and will esteem it a high and holy privilege to train them for Him. Observe:

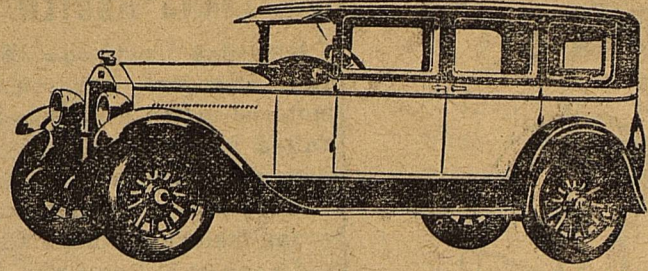
1. Children brought for the touch of Jesus (v. 13). It is incumbent upon all parents to seek for their children personal contact with Jesus.

2. The parents rebuked by the disciples for bringing their children (v. 13). They seemed to think that attention to children was beneath the dignity of Christ.

3. Jesus' reply (vv. 14, 15). He was displeased—really indignant at their words. He is displeased today over those who are hindering their children from coming to Him.

(1) "Suffer the little children to come unto Me and forbid them not. For of such is the Kingdom of God" (v. 14). The kingdom belongs to the children.

(2) "Whoever shall not receive the Kingdom of God as a little child

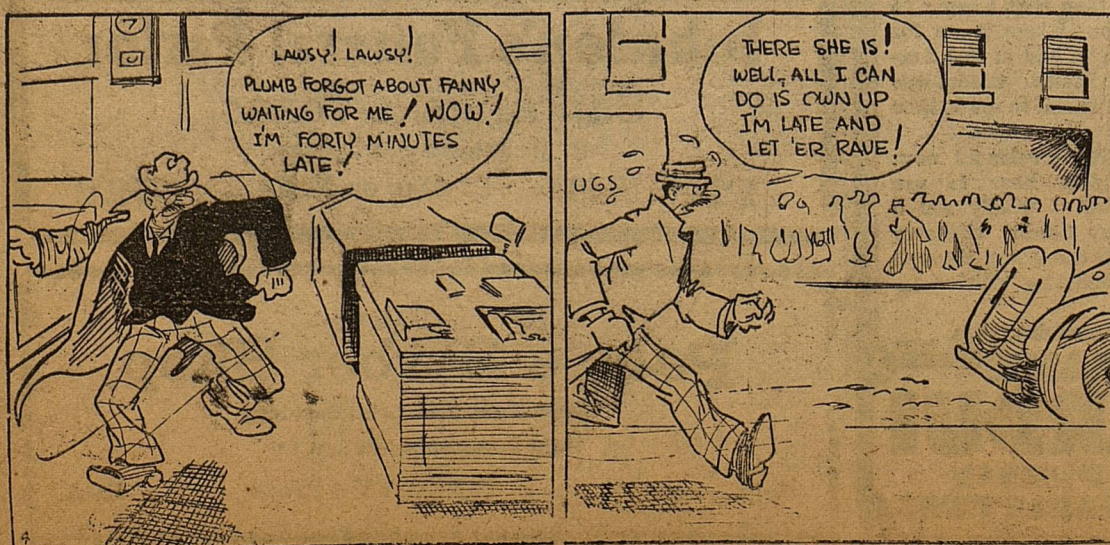
