## DR, TUNNICLIFF APPOINTED VETERINARIAN AT **EXPERIMENT STATION**

Dr. E A. Tunnicliff, Veterinarian, formerly employed by the University of Illinois, has been appointed as Veterinarian of the Texas Agriculturial Experiment Station and assigned to the Ranch Experiment Station located near Sonora, for the purpose of conducting work in the study of the diseases of livestock and particularly diseases most important to the sheep and goat industries of that section.

Dr. Tunnicliff is a native of Wyoming. He received his D. V M degree and his Master of Sc ience degree at Kansas Agriculturial College and has done considerable work toward his Ph. D degree at the University of Illinois He is particularly well trained for the work and will devote his time specifically and systematically to the most important disease of the range.



Moses did not originate it or authorize it, but suffered, limited and regulated it. The reason Moses even suffered it was be cause of the hardness of the hearts of the people. The existence therefore and practice of divorce indicates the coarseness and perverseness of man. The real cause is sin. There is no more real evidence of the blighting effects of sin in the world than the increasing number of di-

2. Marriage God's primal law (vv.

The ideal law of life for the subjects of Christ's kingdom is mar-This is proven by the fundamental fact of sex. "God made them male and female" (v. 6). The union of the male and female natures is physical, mental and spiritual. In marriage the male and female natures are mutually complemented. "They twain shall be one flesh, so that they are no more twain, but one flesh." God's plan is that man should not be without the woman or the woman without the man (I Cor. 11:11). 3. Marriage has God's sanction (v.

When God created Eve and brought her to Adam He performed the first marriage ceremony and declared that man should leave father and mother and cleave unto his wife. "What therefore God hath joined together, let no man put asunder."

4. Marriage of the divorced forbidden (v. 10-12).
