




What Ransome Saw

Eldorado Gin Co.

The Eldorado Gin was the first gin to be built in the city, came into existance in 1904. under the management of P. H. McCormick, and was owned by Eldorado citizens, built for the purpose of helping to develop the farming interest of the county, and at that time all cotton that was raised had to be carried to San Angelo on wagons to be ginned. The Eldorado Gin ginned its first bale in Septemper 1904. The Gin remained in ne nands of the McCormick family, they buying out all the smaller interest, and selling the plant to the present owners Mr. R. T. Crain, who came here from San Saba and has operated the gin through three ginning seasons. Giving the people a most courteous service.

"J. H. Lohman brought in a wagon load of cabbage Saturday. The b oys thought they would weigh one of the heads and found it weighed 91-2 pounds. How's that for cabbage? The cabbage was raised by Mr. Lohman on his ranch without irrigation. Schleicher county will produce any thing that will be planted and worked. It is the garden spot of Texas."
