Mrs. B. K. Cheek Suffers With Membranous Croupe



Jones, agent in animal husbandry at Texas A. and M. College. Many inquiries are being received by him from West Texas as to the feeding value of this field damaged grain. "Such milo is damaged as a feed, how much we do nat know," he says, but it is safe to say that with the exception of poultry, such heads and the threshed grain therefrom may be freely used on the farm. It will not be so palatable as bright feed and when thoroughly dried and ground will make a dusty feed. If fed to cattle it would be well to use with it a relatively large amount of cottonseed meal (about one-eighth of the entire grain and hay ration) to make it more palatable."


