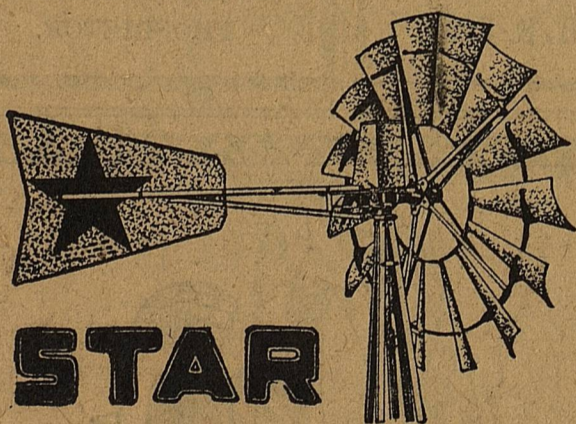

REPRESENTATIVE KING ISSUES CALL FOR LEGISLATURE

The Daily papers of Saturday carried a call from Representative A. H. King of Throckmorton asking that the Legislature meet in extra session to consider important matters.

The text of the call follows:

"To the members of the Thirty-Ninth Legislature of Texas: I, A. H. King, by the authority vested in me by the constitution and as the direct and constitutional representative of the 113th representative district as the indirect representative of all of the people of Texas, and as citizen of Texas with all the inalienable rights of such citizen do hereby call an extraordinary session of the Thirty-Ninth Legislature to convene in the city of Austin at 12 o'clock on the second day of November A. D. 1925, for the following purposes, viz:

"First. To amend or repeal a certain law passed by the last Legislature changing the rules of evidence and making it more difficult to obtain convictions for law violations.

"Second. To amend or repeal the law known as the search and seizure act, which handicaps peace officers in their efforts to protect society from criminals.

"Third. To investigate all State Departments and State institutions to the end that efficient service in public officials may be commended and unworthy ones, if any, may be exposed and punished.

"Fourth. To tighten the prohibition laws so that the sale of 'jake', 'noc' and other poisonous concoctions may be stopped.

"Fifth. To investigate the abuse, if any, of political powers and prerogative by State officials.

"Sixth. To exercise the collective wisdom of the Thirty-Ninth Legislature for the welfare of the people of Texas.

"Seventh. The doctrine has been settled for more than a thousand years that a free people have the right to act through their lawful representatives at any time to protect themselves from actual and threatened dangers.

"Eighth. It is to be hoped that the Governor of Texas will see that imperative needs of this extraordinary session and supplement this call with the usual proclamation and in case the Governor does not do so it is hoped that the Speaker of the House will take such action in order that there may be no quibbling as to the constitutionality of the action of the special session of the Legislature."

Speaker Lee Satterwhite, in a statement to the press, asserted that if Representative A. H. King procured the names of 50 members of the house for a special session, and that Governor Miriam A. Ferguson did not herself call one, that by authority vested in him by special statute, he would issue a formal call.

CONDENSED AUSTIN NEWS

A standard form for textbook bids
will be used in Texas for the first
time on Oct. 12 when the recently
appointed text book commission
opens bids to supply a number of
important texts to the schools of
this state.

James W. Stratton of Fort Worth
was named president of the engineer-
ing department of Texas University.
Other officers are J. W. Akkerman
of San Antonio, vice president; Carol
McKeever of Austin, secretary-treas-
urer, and L. H. McCutcheon of Aus-
tin, sergeant at arms.

There was on hand to the credit
of the general revenue fund \$970,561
at the close of business Sept. 30,
it was announced by W. G. Hatcher,
State treasurer. The treasurer said
something like \$500,000 was received
the last day of the month, which is
not counted in the above balance.

Abolition of the Pat Neff
honor farm by the Prison Commission
meets with the approval of Gov.
Miriam A. Ferguson, she said recent-
ly upon her return to Austin from
Victoria. Former Governor James
E. Ferguson also said the com-
mission was right in abandoning the
honor farm.

City Fire Marshals or County
Superintendents of Schools for every
town in Texas will receive an inspec-
tion blank which when filled out will
show the conditions of every school
building in its relation to the fire
hazard, John E. Robertson, chief of
the fire prevention department of
the State Fire Insurance Commis-
sion, announced.

Railroad Commissioner Lon A.
Smith is making an inspection trip
over the shallow oil fields in Cal-
lahan and adjoining counties. He has
heretofore visited and studied the
fields of Central and Southeast Tex-
as, and as he finds time to do so
will visit all of the oil fields for the
purpose of observing first hand con-
ditions.

Announcement of the appointment
of Pete Norfleet, son of J. Frank
Norfleet, of Hale Center, to be a
special Deputy Game, Fish and
Oyster Commissioner and assignment
to him of a territory in Central
Panhandle was made recently. Nor-
fleet worked continuously with his
father to round up and convict the
gang of crooks who fleeced the elder
Norfleet out of \$45,000.

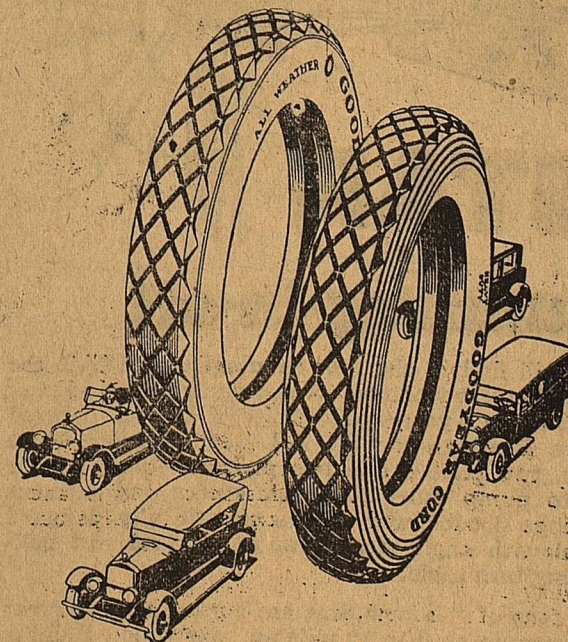

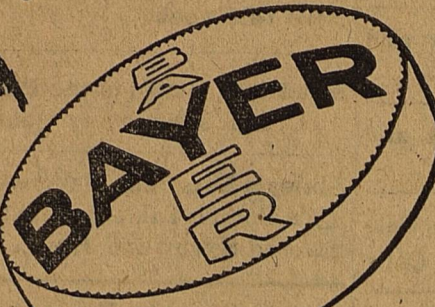

Texas News

It appears now that the annual meeting of the Texas Editorial Association to be held in Brownsville Dec. 3, 4, and 5, will be the largest in the history of these veterans.

San Jacinto County Saturday voted a million dollar bond issue to construct 60 miles of approved highway. The issue carried by a majority of six to one.

Voters of Bryan have approved a \$25,000 bond issue for the erection of a 400,000-gallon water tower. The tower will be 140 feet high.

Tax Assessor F. W. Rogers has completed the Jackson county tax rolls for 1925, which show a total valuation of \$8,886,142.

The state highway department has a force of men at work varnishing state highway No. 3 through Flatonia.

El Campo gains passed the 10,000-bale mark last week.

The city commission of Galveston adopted the report of the grade-raising board for the continuation of grade-raising activities under the \$2,000,000 bond issue recently voted for this purpose.

At current prices for cotton and cotton seed, the cotton from the 1925 crop received at Troup have already amounted to \$983,250. Troup will receive at least 10,000 bales of cotton this season.

East Texas is to have a fish hatchery, located five miles southwest of Tyler at the famous Greenbriar Club lake, work of surveying for the construction of the hatchery having been started.

The largest deposits of native sulphur known to exist are now working in Southern Texas. There are several large producers operating in the fields, producing about 90 per cent of the sulphur consumed in the world.

Out of the entire legislature only 15 members informed Governor Ferguson that they would oppose voting a deficiency to pay for the fight against the foot and mouth disease in South Texas, Former Governor James E. Ferguson says.

Surfacing the Dixie highway between Starrville and the Gregg County line in the eastern part of Smith County has been completed, a coat of two inches of asphalt having been laid over the iron ore gravel road which has been built for four years.

Revaluation of approximately 800,000 acres of forfeited public lands will be begun within the next two weeks by him, provided his health continues to improve, State Land Commissioner Robison said this week. Most of the land is in nine counties west of the Pecos River.

One million dollars' worth of truck was produced in Galveston County during the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1924, and ending June 1, 1925, according to an estimate by H. L. Roberts of Hitchcock, one of the largest shippers in the county, after a careful investigation of the production at various points.

The western part of DeWitt County has voted an issue of \$300,000 in road bonds. Two roads will be constructed, one from Cuero to Kenedy and the other from Stockdale to Goliad. Both roads will pass through Yorktown. The North and South highway, Stockdale to Goliad, will connect with the Glacier-to-Gulf highway at Stockdale and with the Jefferson Davis highway at Goliad.

The fig industry to South Texas will eventually become what the orange industry is to California, in the opinion of leading horticulturists who have devoted considerable time to the proper cultivation of this crop in the gulf coast country during recent years. Just now this industry is making rapid strides forward, due to the success with which its development has met within the past four years.

Authority granted carriers for half tons in feedstuffs going to the drought-stricken area on the Southern Pacific and International-Great Northern railroads have been amended by the Texas railroad commission to include cotton seed cake, meal and hulls and rice hulls, Commissioner Lon A. Smith announced. The Southern Pacific drought-stricken area was extended to include Freestone, Kendall and Kerr counties.

Shipments of 60,000 lambs from San Angelo to Denver began this week, all restrictions of the foot and mouth quarantine now having been removed.

Highway Commissioner Joe Burkett of Eastland last week conferred with the governor on plans to build a \$1,000,000 paved highway in Tom Green county. He says that the county has voted \$500,000 in bonds, which have been supplemented by the highway commission, for 70 miles of paved roads. When this project is completed the county will have 120 miles of paved highways, ranking fifth to Dallas, Tarrant, Bexar and Harris counties in paved highway mileage.

CAMPING AND PROBLEM OF FOOD

There is no healthier sport than camping. During the warm and balmy spring and summer days, it is real recreation. To get out in the fresh air and sunshine, free from worry and care, enhances the health of any one, be he office man, salesman or what not.

But due to the entirely inadequate means of food preservation and refrigeration found in the majority of camps, there is the ever-present danger of sickness from infected foods. The utmost care must be taken in order that this may be avoided. Butter and eggs should be bought only as used. The milk is a problem in itself. Perhaps the solution lies in the use of a milk other than market milk, in order that purity and sterility may be assured. For such use, evaporated milk is ideal. Many people are wont to confuse evaporated and condensed milk but there is no similarity between the two. Condensed milk is a combination of sugar and milk and can be used only when both of these substances are desired. Evaporated milk is merely pure, fresh milk with about sixty per cent of the water removed and the nutrient content left intact. It is absolutely sterile and pure, having been sterilized before leaving the factory. The water, removed by evaporation, may be replaced very easily and the milk returned to its original volume. Evaporated milk may be obtained in small cans, containing six ounces or in larger ones containing sixteen and can be taken to the camp in quantities sufficient for the needs of the entire period, thus assuring a constant supply of pure, fresh milk without the worry or the danger attached to the use of the market product.

Following are recipes for a few dishes that are best adapted for camp consumption because of ease of preparation, purity and food value.

Tomato Soup.
 1 pint tomato pulp 1/4 cups water
 or canned tomato soup Salt and pepper to taste
 1/2 cups evaporated milk 1/2 tsp. soda

Bring tomato pulp or soup to the boil, add the seasonings and soda. Heat the milk and water and combine slowly with the tomato mixture.

Stirred Eggs.
 1/2 cup evaporated milk 1/4 tsp. paprika
 6 eggs 2 tbsp. fat
 1/2 cup water 2 tbsp. fat
 1/4 tsp. pepper Grated cheese
 Beat the eggs, add the milk, water and seasonings. Melt the fat in a frying pan. Add the egg mixture and stir until the mixture is creamy. When almost done, sprinkle with grated cheese. Serve on slices of bread, toast or crackers.
