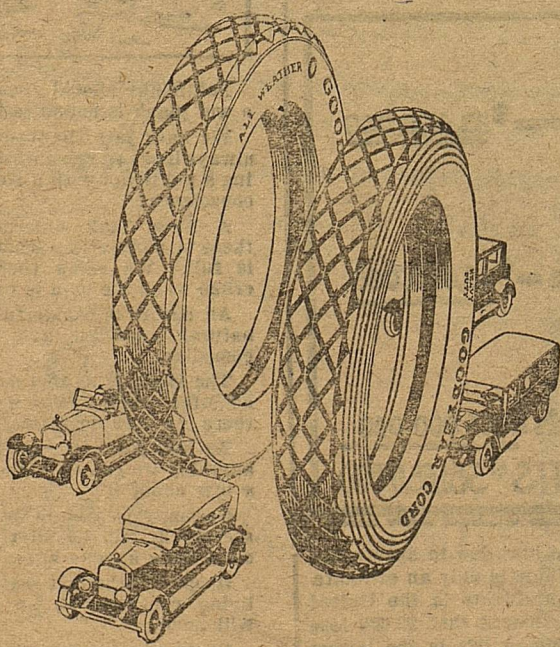

"MY HAT IS IN THE RING," SAYS TITHING EVANGELIST

From Dallas News.

In my feeling out statement to the public I announced my intention of making the race for Governor of Texas, provided the God fearing men and women of Texas demanded a change from an unrighteous government, from political fetters to Golden Rule freedom, from tax burden to tax ease, from monkey education to God creation, from road speculators to road builders, from political throne power to God throne power, from criminal loose to criminal bound and from Fergusonism in any shade or color whatever.

Had I discovered in the flood of appeals that came to me from every part of Texas a desire to try out either Mr. Davidson or Mr. Moody, I would have bowed to the will of the God fearing men and women of Texas. But I found it not. The 100 to 1 opinion is that any candidate who supported the Fergusons in the general election would not be acceptable to Texas. And in order that our State may be free from Fergusonism that all Ferguson supporters must be set aside.

A superastounding fact is that in all the flood of appeals received Ma was mentioned but three times, showing that Texans believe that as Jim goes so goes Ma.

I find that Mr. Davidson is given no consideration whatever as a possible winner and that Mr. Moody is given no credit for his claim to consideration on account of his road prosecutions, the general opinion being that any lawyer would and could have made capital of the opportunity.

The general opinion summed up is that any clean-cut anti-everything Ferguson will be in the running with Ma and that in the race between Ma and Jim that Jim comes under the wire, while Ma is at the half-mile post. These are facts exactly as they come to me from outstanding, clean-souled men and women of Texas.

As regards the klan, the majority opinion is that Mr. Moody and Jim will force it on me as an issue. This can hardly be, as I am not a member of the Ku Klux Klan and furthermore the klan is not an issue. My statement in the News of March 20 as regards the klan had to do with their principles and not their organization. My grandfather and my father were South Carolina born, 100 per cent Americans. The principles of loyalty to American institutions were bred into me long before I ever hear of the Ku Klux Klan and these principles advocate constitutional courthouse law enforcement. My father lived and died for these principles. So can I, and so will I if necessary.

If Texas desires a Governor who will measure his every administrative act by the standards of Jesus Christ and give every honest man a square deal and every criminal constitutional courthouse justice and who will neither cringe, fawn nor sell himself for gold, she has the opportunity to get him.

My hat is in the ring. If Texans will vote as they pray, Jim will be the next Governor.

My battle cry is, "Where does God Fit In?"

My speaking route lies from the Chamber of Commerce up to

EL DORADO HIGH SCHOOL DEFEATS DEL RIO.

Game Hard One With Thirteen Innings, Score 3 to 4.

The El Dorado Eagles went to Del Rio Friday afternoon knowing when they went that they had to cross bats with one of the strongest High School teams in the State. Coach Clary coached his team from the time they left El Dorado until the victory was won. No better team work is seen among the professional ball players than was manifest in this long game. Wilford McLeod the captain and pitcher was in fine form and fanned 22 men during the game with only four hits for the Del Rio team.

Del Rio pitched two men changing at the beginning of the sixth inning, and giving El Dorado ten hits during the game. Wilford McLeod led the hitting for El Dorado with three hits to his credit and Con Isaacs came next with two hits. Paul McLeoue, Cicero Swift, Edward Ratliff, Prince Murphy, and Truett Ray each registered a hit.

Del Rio scored first in the second inning, then again in the fifth and their third and last score was made in the sixth. El Dorado, crossed the home plate twice in the fourth again in the fifth but from that time on until the 13th inning they failed to score again.

From the very beginning both teams were determined to win. There were no grandstand plays, no home runs, only three two base hits, and very few errors the entire game. The final score was four and three in favor of El Dorado. Spectators said that this was the best and hardest fought game they ever witnessed by High School players. Del Rio has an excellent coach with good helpers but when they saw the discipline and team work of the El Dorado boys, some one said, "What if Del Rio had El Dorado's coach, 'Well, all we can say is that Clary is ours."

Del Rio had rooters there by the hundreds and they sure supported their team, but when Bro Ray's hat would go high in the air and he himself suspended in mid air, all Del Rio knew that he was proxy for every rooster in Schleicher County. Bro. Young was there in his usual silent mood, and Mrs. Murphy succeeded in keeping the whole El Dorado crowd orderly on both sides of the river.

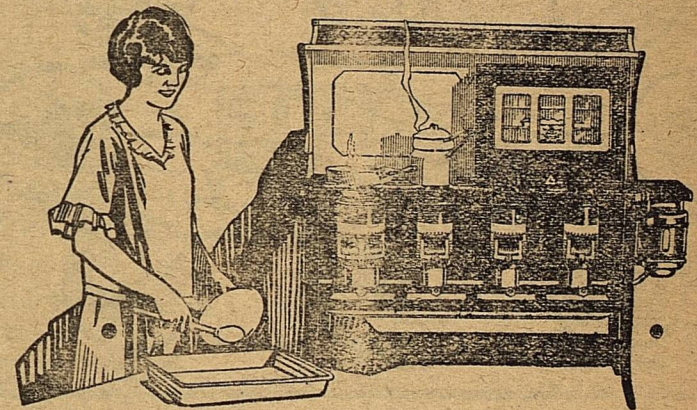

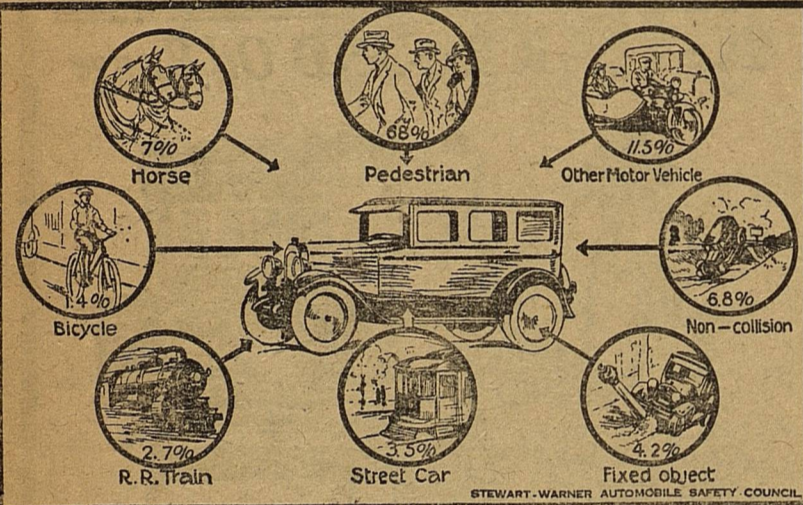

Pedestrian Greatest Victim of Automobile Accidents



THE PEDESTRIAN is the greatest sufferer in automobile fatalities, according to records analyzed by the Stewart-Warner Safety Council for the prevention of automobile accidents. No complete record is available for the United States as a whole, but a report based on 3,023 auto fatalities occurring in the first seven months of 1925, covering a population of thirty-one million, is significant. Two thousand of these 3,023 fatalities have been classified according to type. Sixty-eight per cent of the victims were pedestrians, 11.5 occurred with another motor vehicle; 7 per cent with horse vehicles, 4.2 with fixed objects such as lamp posts, 3.5 per cent with street cars, 2.7 with railway trains and 1.4 per cent with bicycles. The remaining 6.8 per cent involved no collision. The small proportion involving railway trains is encouraging and doubtless due to the gradual abolition of unguarded grade crossings. The menace to the pedestrian, however, is alarming, and calls for greater care on his part in crossing streets and on the drivers for more careful driving.

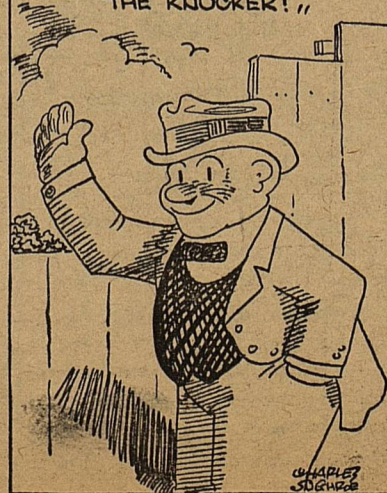

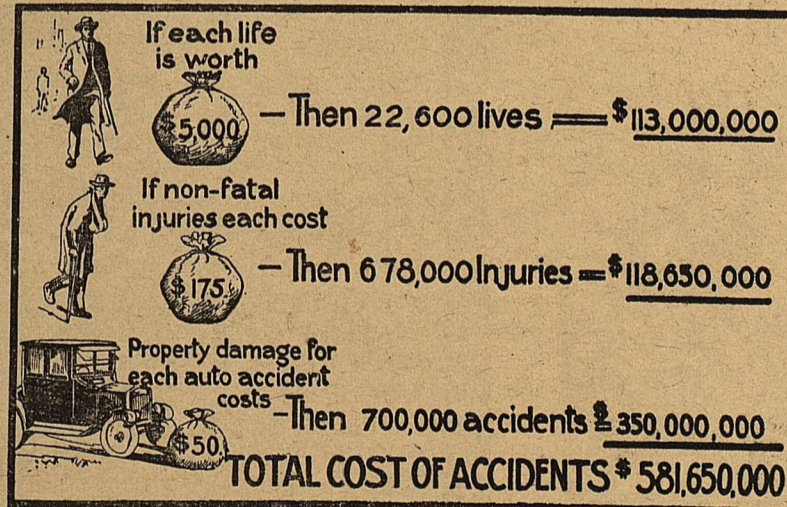

**\$600,000,000 a Year Loss
Caused by Auto Accidents**



CLOSE to \$600,000,000 a year is the annual economic loss due to automobile accidents, both fatal and non-fatal. This appalling sum is only an estimate, as no complete figures on the number of automobile accidents in the United States are available, but it has been conservatively estimated that 22,600 lose their lives each year by automobiles, and \$5,000 a human life is the lowest value put on it by economists.

Of non-fatal accidents 678,000 occur annually, causing average cost of \$175. Then, each accident averages \$50 property damage, insurance records show. This makes the staggering total of \$581,650,000 a year.

No account is taken here, points out the Stewart-Warner Safety Council for the prevention of automobile accidents, of the economic value of time lost by the injured due to delays caused by accidents or to minor property values, such as bent fenders, expense incurred while motor vehicles, particularly the commercial ones, are out of service, due to accidents. Were all these taken into the reckoning, the total figure would surely be doubled.

Some idea of the enormity of this economic loss, most of which is avoidable, can be gained by such relationships as these: it is twice the cash income of the 1923 wheat crop; it is equal to about one-third of the much-discussed French debt to this country; and, finally, this loss would buy the entire city of Chicago at its present realty assessment valuation.

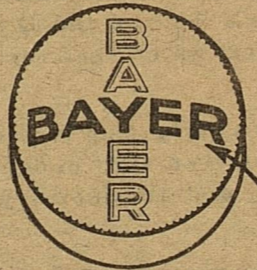
