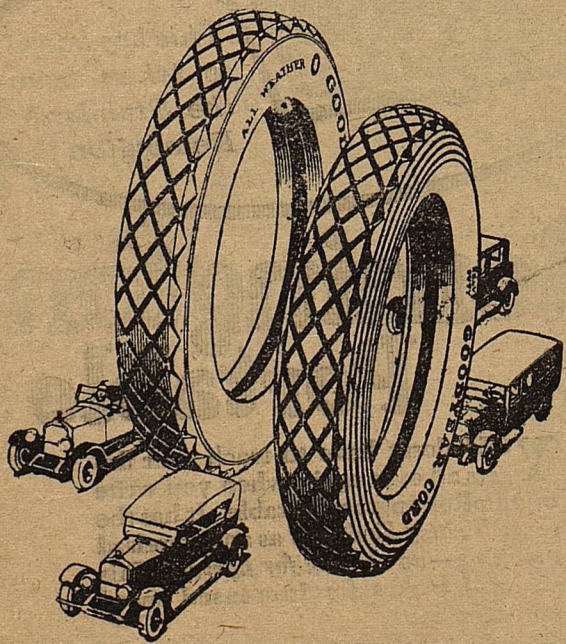

## INJUNCTION DENIED

An injunction, by which Joe Tisdale, George Baugh and Ike Honig sought to restrain August Luedecke, Schleicher County Tax Collector, from collecting a 1925 tax of 75c on the \$100 levied for the Eldorado independent school district, was denied by Judge J. F. Sutton in District Court here Saturday.

The petitioners contended that property owned by them and twenty-five or thirty others was exempt from the tax, since it was excluded from the Eldorado independent school district by an act of the legislature, which became a law in March 1925. The act reorganized the district. The injunction was denied on the grounds that the tax was levied prior to the time the act of the legislature became effective.

Notice of an appeal was given by Hill, Neill & Hill, local attorneys, representing the petitioners. The same question is pending settlement in another case now before the Supreme Court. The Tax Collector of Schleicher County and the trustees of the Eldorado independent school district were represented by J. A. Thomas and Collins, Jackson & Sedberry. The hearing was begun at Eldorado at 9 o'clock Friday morning and continued until 1 o'clock when it recessed until Saturday morning for arguing of the points of law at San Angelo, where a complete library was available. The only witnesses testifying at the hearing were T. P. Robinson, secretary of the Eldorado school board, August Luedecke sheriff and tax collector, and Don McCormick, tax assessor. Other evidence was by records.

The total tax of 75 cents was made up of a maintenance tax of 40 cents, a tax of 10 cents to retire old bonds and a tax of 25 cents to provide bonds for a new building. The bonds were sold a few days before the act of the legislature, re-organizing the school district, became effective. The re-organization excluded the schools of Cliff and Middle Valley. Schools being conducted at Middle Valley this term but arrangements could not be made in time for classes at Cliff, according to some of the petitioners for the injunction. Tax assessed against the Cliff district totaled \$1,133, based upon a levy of 50 cents on the \$100 property valuation—San Angelo Standard.

## J. T. BURLERSON.

J. T. Burlerson was born at St. Augustine, Texas, September 19, 1839, and was a citizen of Texas under three flags, at the early age of 18 years he was converted in an old time Methodist meeting and united with the Baptist Church.

He was married to Miss Parilee Wilson, of Crocket, Texas and to this union were born five children two sons and three daughters, three of which still survive him. Mr. J. T. Burlerson with whom he made his home on the farm three miles west of El Dorado, Mrs. Mary L. Beauchamp Stepenville, Texas, (she was present at the time of his death) Mrs. I. V. Beauchamp of Fort Worth Texas, (she could not be here).

Mr. Burlerson served four years in the Civil War in Walls Texas Legion under Col. Bradley, he was among the few that has lingered long in Texas to do honor to his native State. Mr. Burlerson lost his companion about 40 years ago, he moved to Schleicher County with his son J. T. Burlerson 19 years ago and has been found on the side of righteousness ever since.

The Death Angel call for him at 5:30 a. m. Thursday, January 25, 1926, and like the time when he heard the call to armed defense of what he thought was right, he was ready. Thus another name has been stricken from the everlasting roll of our old settlers, and the fast depleting roll of our Old Confederates. He was a man of generous impulse and never forgot the honorable ways of the pioneer. How much this community owes him and such as he, it is impossible to estimate, though it would be a grateful task to trace his influence through some direct channels to hold him up in these days, in his various characters of husband and father, of neighbor and friend, to speak of the son and daughters he has reared to perpetuate his name and emulate his virtues. But it comes not within the scope of this brief article to do so. Suffice it to say, he lived nobly and died peacefully at the advance age of 86 years and five months.

The funeral services were held by his pastor Bro. Paul Ray, the local Baptist minister and his remains were laid to rest Thursday afternoon in the El Dorado Cemetery, with a host of friends present to pay their last respects to this noble Christian character. He is only gone over there to be with the loved ones that has preceded him in death and await the coming of his children when they will be reunited in that home above.

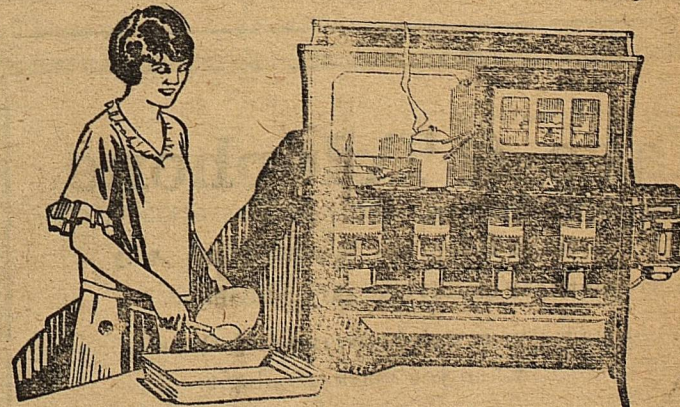

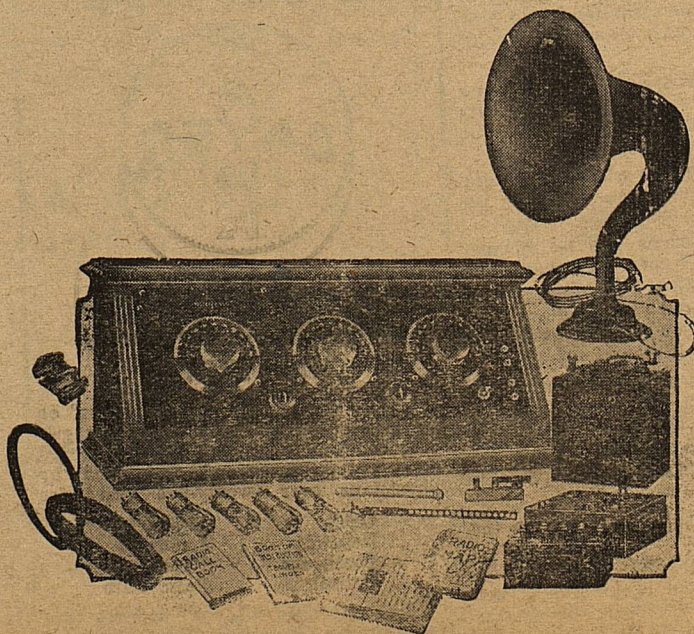

## Zero Hours of Automobile Accidents, 4, 5 and 8 P. M.

ONE thousand and thirty of Chicago's 11,785 auto accidents last year, according to the Stewart-Warner Safety Council for the prevention of automobile accidents, occurred between five and six o'clock, just when congestion is at its worst in the home-going rush. Only 47 of these 1,000 accidents were fatal.

Four o'clock is the children's zero hero. Thirty-three of the 182 children killed by autos in Chicago last year came to grief at four o'clock, playing in the streets after school.

Seven to nine is the dangerous time for adult auto fatalities, according to Chicago's 1924 record. Eighty-six of 353 such deaths occurred at and the theater-going hours.

## WOOL SELLS FOR 40C.

Forty cents a pound is the price in the first reported contract of long wool of the 1926 spring season in West Texas. Jess Neal of San Angelo has bought the fleece from 670 bred ewes owned by B. C. Mann, also of San Angelo. The flock is being wintered on a ranch near Water Valley. The wool will be delivered at the warehouse in San Angelo after shearing, probably in May.

Mr. Neal also contracted the lamb crop out of the 670 bred ewes, paying 10 cents a pound for mixed lambs. Delivery will be made in October and the lambs will be taken to Glasscock County, where Mr. Neal has about 7,000 sheep.

In earlier contracts of unborn lambs, prices are understood to have been 10 cents for the wethers and 11 cents for the ewes.—San Angelo Standard.

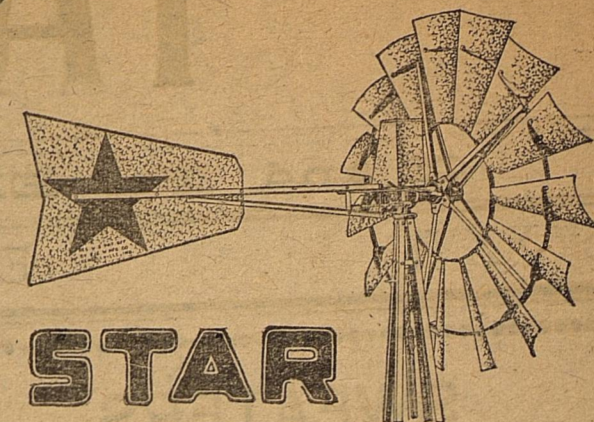

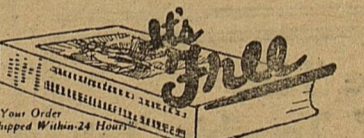

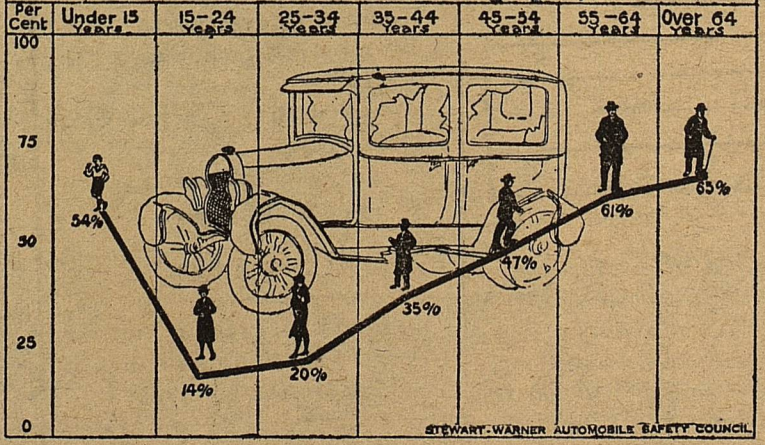

## Shakespeare Up-to-Date Tells Motorists' Terrible Toll

### SEVEN AGES OF AUTO ACCIDENTS

SHAKESPEARE'S seven ages of mankind made no reference to the number who were cut off in their prime by automobiles. If he had, suggest the Stewart-Warner Safety Council, it might have run something like this parody on his famous lines:

At first the Infant,  
Killed by a truck while in his nurse's arms,  
And then the careless schoolboy with his marbles,  
Playing in the streets after his lessons  
Are over. And then the lover,  
Absent-minded, walking with a box of candy  
Under his arm, to see his loved one,  
Is struck by a taxi and hurtled to the ground.  
Next comes the gay young blood  
Out for his evening's entertainment, whom  
Sixty miles an hour lands forty years too soon  
Upon a slab in some unfriendly morgue.  
And then the banker, full of worldly pride and honors,  
Jay-walks across the street between two mighty deals of finance,  
And wakes to find Saint Peter quizzing him.  
Next, the family man, with years upon him,  
Confused and jostled in the crowd,  
Missteps, and dies amid thanksgiving  
That his last premium was paid up.  
And last, hoary age, tottering and feeble,  
Perhaps with crutch, or eye too dimmed with time,  
An easy victim for some selfish motorist,  
Sans care, sans thought, sans skill, sans everything—but speed.

The chart above shows what proportion of all accidents happening to each age group are automobile accidents. The toll is highest for the very young and very old. This situation is explained partly by the heedlessness of the young and the infirmity of old age. Moreover, these two groups are least involved in industrial accidents which makes their automobile casualties constitute a larger part of their total accidents.
