ROACH BROTHERS LEASE OUT RANCH.

Sell Cattle, Goats and Sheep 10,240 Acre Leases for 60 Per Acre.

A. J. Roach was in the city Tuesday and reported that they were closing the deal whereby the Roach Brothers ranch containing 10,240 acres, had been leased to W. R. Nicks at 60c per acre. Mr. Nicks also bought 250 head of cattle paying \$30 for cows, \$22.50 for yearlings and calves thrown in, about 1,400 head of Sheep, ewes at \$7, yearlings \$8.00 and lambs \$3.50, 1,500 head of goats sold for \$3.20 per head. Mr. Nicks has ranch-ed in this County all his life and knows the business. The stock was counted out and possession of ranch turned over Tuesday afternoon.

J. O. Willoughby sold last week to Ohio parties 1,532 head of yearling ewes at \$9.00 per head.

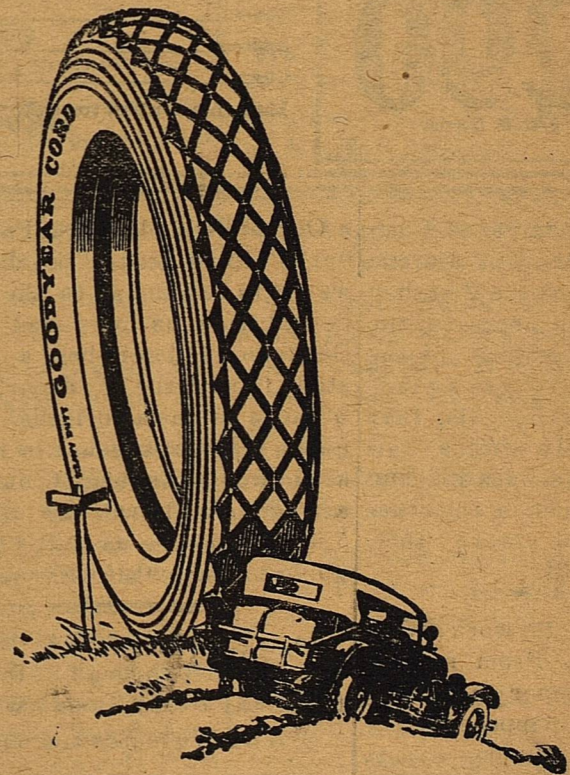

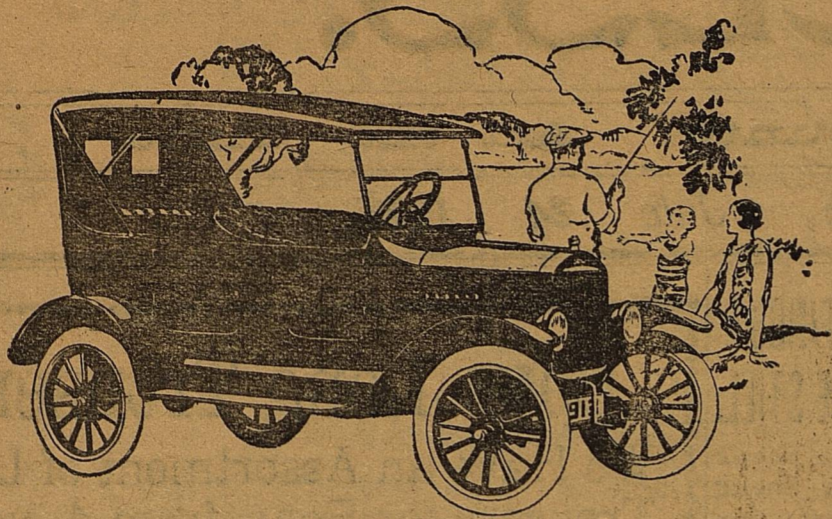

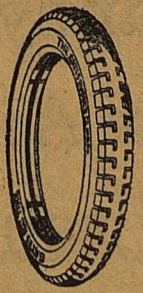

Texas News

Work of shelling the Alvin-Friendswood highway is well under way at the present time, and when completed will close a gap in the chain of hard surfaced roads in that section that has long been needed.

Acting on the advice of County Agent H. C. Robinson, DeWitt County farmers are planting grain sorghums, sudan, sweet sorghums, cow peas, etc., to lessen the burden of feed cost inflicted by the drouth.

The first train on the Santa Fe's extension from Doud to the New Mexico line across Bailey and Hockley counties, in Texas, will enter Leveland, August 6, it was announced this week.

The commissioners court of Washington county has fixed the tax rate for this year at \$1.68 on the \$100 valuation, a reduction of 2c from the rate of last year.

A bond issue for a \$20,000 rural high school was carried in an election recently held in the newly consolidated school district comprising Sparks, Little River and Academy districts, south of Temple. The school will be built immediately.

In line with its general policy of improving its roadbed in Texas wherever and whenever feasible, the Missouri-Kansas-Texas railroad is now engaged in laying 32 miles of 90-pound rail on the San Antonio division between Temple and Granger.

Value of exports handled through the port of Houston for the fiscal year, ending June 30, increased \$268,258,971, or 147 per cent, over the preceding year, according to the annual report just compiled by W. E. Baker, deputy collector of customs.

The State Master Plumbers Association and the Texas Laundry Owners Association have notified Fred Herndon, convention and publicity secretary of the chamber of commerce of San Antonio that they would hold their 1926 conventions in San Antonio.

Twenty-one Texas concerns, one New York and one Oklahoma concern have received contracts for groceries for 18 eleemosynary institutions by the board of control for three months' supplies, with the privilege of taking out a six months' estimate in the quarter.

Three allotments of road building aid were granted this week by the highway commission. Galveston County received the \$471,000 necessary to complete paving its Galveston-Houston highway. Houston County was allotted \$37,500 and Uvalde County \$8000.

The taxable values in Brazoria county this year will be \$30,500,000, a loss of \$2,000,000 from last year. The principal part of this reduction is due to the slump in the oil fields at West Columbia and Damon. The tax rate was reduced from 65c to 55c on the \$100 valuation.

Green peas in Henderson County are being marketed several weeks earlier than usual and one-half the crop of the county will be marketed during July. The pea crop in Henderson County this year will amount to 65 carloads which at present prices should bring the growers \$70,000.

A strange malady affecting sheep in the San Angelo section of West Texas has stockmen and veterinarians guessing. It appears to be a type of the "creeps," causing the sheep's legs to stiffen and their backs to arch. They stumble and fall and are unable to go to feed and water. Losses so far have not been heavy. The outbreaks have been sporadic and widely scattered, occurring in Tom Green, McCulloch and neighboring counties.

Bonds for the city of Dallas, aggregating \$2,000,000 and bearing 4 1/4 per cent interest and maturing serially, received approval of the attorney general's department. The bonds are: \$1,000,000 school; \$300,000 sanitary sewers; \$250,000 parks; \$250,000 street improvement; \$100,000 storm sewer; \$100,000 garbage incinerator.

Four million pounds of figs will be produced in Galveston County this year, representing an increase of 100 per cent over 1924, it was estimated this week by E. N. Holmgren, county farm demonstration agent, after a careful survey of the orchards. The production of the gulf coast area as a whole will be approximately three times as large as it was last year, due to increased acreage in bearing orchards and the fact that the older orchards produce more from year to year.

Advisability of establishing a fish hatchery at Kerrville on the Guadalupe river is being considered by Turner Hubby, state game, fish and oyster commissioner.

Airplane mapping of Texas streams by United States army aviators has saved the State of Texas much money and has located reservoir sites with an exactness of detail not possible under any other scheme, said A. H. Dunlap, member of the state board of water engineers. The United States geological survey is co-operating with the board in locating reservoir sites and in determining and mapping the water resources of the state. Half the cost is borne by the state and half by the federal government.

WILLIAM JET SPRADLING.

Rev. J. C. Young received a telephone message Saturday night announcing death of William Jet Spradling, infant son of Mr. and Mrs. W. L. Spradling of San Angelo, but up to a few weeks was with the Yancy Implement Co. here. William Jet, was born January 4, 1924, and during the 18 months he was in the home had entwined the cords of love around the heart of his parents, with his little prattle, coos and smiles, but today their hearts are bleeding, a stillness is in their home, little William has been wafted into the Heavenly kingdom where his smiles still beckon for mother and father, may they look through the dark shadow that over hangs their home and see that heaven is brighter and sweeter. The remains were laid to rest Sunday afternoon in Fairmount cemetery at San Angelo, Rev. J. C. Young went up to conduct the funeral services.

FAVOR JUNIOR COLLEGE.

The consensus of opinion of a group of San Angelo citizens interviewed Saturday on the proposition of adding to the curriculum of the local high school, a two-year college course of the junior college type brings a unanimous poll in favor of translating into action this epoch making steps in San Angelo civic development.—San Angelo Standard.

We note that the entire teaching faculty of the Sterling City school, last year, has been rejected and accepted their positions for another term, the teachers had no complaint, the trustees had no complaint and not a single complaint from the patrons. We call that 100 per cent people.

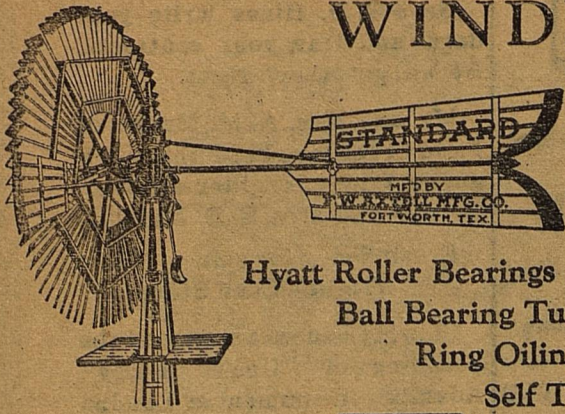

Members of the State Board of Water Engineers have opened negotiations with the State Game, Fish and Oyster Department, for the loan of two boats for an inspection trip through Devil's River. The boats would be supplemented with pack animals which would traverse the bank with this "amphibious caravan."

A requisition on the Governor of Oklahoma for E. A. Pruitt, charged by indictment in Grayson County with theft of more than \$50 has been issued by Governor Miriam A. Ferguson. Pruitt is in the custody of the Sheriff in Cleveland County, Oklahoma. He is wanted for automobile theft.

Resignation of Dean Spurgeon Bell as head of the University of Texas School of Business Administration to become head of a Bureau of Business Research for the University of Ohio, has been announced. Dean Bell will leave at the close of the present Summer term, July 20, to start work immediately at the University of Ohio. His family will leave as soon as Austin property is sold.

The Big Lake Oil Company has remitted \$105,053 to Land Commissioner Robinson as June royalty on oil produced on University lands in Reagan County. This is \$18,314 less than the May remittance. The Texon is yet to report for June. Mr. Robinson ascribes the decrease to the agitation in the board of University regents regarding the validity of oil leases on University lands.

The Revised Code of Criminal Statutes has been printed and a page of errata is being sorted. When that is finished the volume will be ready for distribution, which is expected to be not later than Aug. 1. The code goes into effect on Sept. 1 and supersedes all existing criminal law. The two volumes of the Revised Civil Code will not be ready for some time, the approximate date not being known.

Prof. S. M. N. Marrs, State Superintendent of Public Instruction, directs attention to the fact that the new textbook law reduced from 15c to 7c the amount of the State school tax which can be used in any one year for the purchase of free textbooks. With the usual deduction for assessing and collecting it would not cover his net bill of \$2,389,000, as indicated to the State Board of Education.

In an opinion by Assistant R. J. Randolph the Attorney General's department holds that the University regents may grant easement or right of way over University lands to the American Telegraph and Telephone Company for lines of telegraph and telephone. It is held that the Legislature had the right to grant such easement and that the regents were authorized to carry out the legislative intent.

W. L. Hill, well-known Houston lawyer, saw Judge John M. Scott, Texas Commissioner of Insurance, in behalf of the return to Texas to loan money to three large insurance companies which withdrew in 1907 when the Robertson compulsory investment law was enacted. Judge Hill said the Texas life companies, or most of them, do not object to the return of the large companies for the purpose of loaning money and are willing to see them admitted to Texas without the payment of penalties.

It has been announced that all three members of the Railroad Commission will go to Plainview to sit in the consolidated railroad cases to be called on July 20, wherein the Santa Fe system, the Burlington Railroad and the Texas Panhandle & Gulf are all seeking to build more mileage in that part of Texas and on an extensive scale, and are fighting each other to have the exclusive privilege. The commission consists of Clarence E. Gilmore, chairman; V. Terrell and Lon A. Smith.
