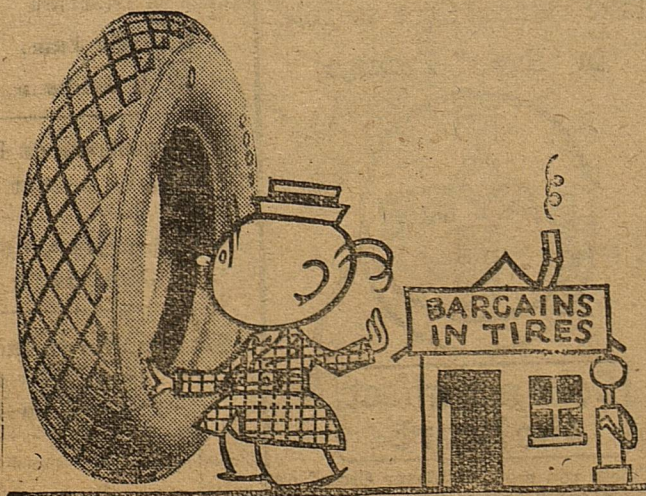

FACTS ARE STUBBORN THINGS, FIGURES

WONT LIE, AND MURDER WILL OUT

The following is the substance of a conversation held in front of a garage about seventy miles from San Angelo one day last week. If you will do some substituting of cost of cars, miles run, money spent for repairs etc., you will force yourself to the same conclusions as did this man. Count up the amount you have spent for and on cars in the last two years and then read the following dialogue.

"Hello Bill, how are you this morning?"

"Fine Tom, how have you been lately? Give me ten gallons of gas and a quart of oil."

"Surest thing you know. Fixing to go somewhere Bill?"

"Yeah, got to run up to Angelo today to see about them muttons I shipped last week. Shouldn't get returns on them before this."

"Well Bill I see those tires are getting pretty weak. Don't look much like they'll last this trip. Better let me put on a new set for you before you start."

"No I guess they'll make it all right. Haven't been on there more than four or five months. They ought to be pretty good yet."

"Yes your right Bill. It's just been five months since I put them on for you, but you must remember, Bill, you do a good deal of running around first and last, I took your speedometer reading when I put them on. Now lets just see how far you've been on these tires. Your speedometer reads now 21,559 and my record shows that when you put these on you had run 10,425. That makes 11,134 miles you've run these tires which I say is a pretty good mileage."

"By Jo! I didn't know I'd gone that far. A man sure does run more than he thinks for, don't he? How much does them tires cost now Tom?"

"Well the regular price on heavy duties of this size is \$41.25 but we've just got in some, that we bought pretty close and we can fix you up at \$38 apiece, and you really need four new tires. If you'll look you'll see that all of these are worn through the fabric and that nothing is holding them but the shock pads. These tires wouldn't get you 10 miles."

"Why Tom Spencer! Do you

realized that I had five new tires on this car just 11,134 miles back and that it cost me \$190 to put them in as they were then?"

"Sure I do. You don't think you can run a car for nothing, I think you have done pretty darn good myself."

"Good gracious man! Stop and figure awhile. Can't you see that it costs me nearly 2 cents a mile just for tires alone, to say nothing about the other expenses of running this car. Why my land, at that rate cost me over 2 dollars and a half every time I go to Angelo and back. And not only that but the way gas and oil is selling now it costs me two dollars and a half more for that. That makes five dollars that I can't keep from spending every time I drive this thing up there and back."

"Why you bet your life it does Bill and that's the worst of it yet. Didn't you pay about \$1800. for that car something like a year ago?"

"That's what I did Tom."

"And haven't you run it 21,559 miles now?"

"Yes, that's what the speedometer says."

"Well what do you suppose you could get for it today on a new car?"

"Why I give about six or seven hundred dollars and there it's eleven hundred more it costs me to run this 21,559 miles, not to mention the interest on my money for that length of time, so here's another 5 cents a mile that I've got to spend to run my car. Lets see that makes it cost me \$8.40 to go up and back and I still said any thing about repair bills, storage while in San Angelo and etc. Tom let me tell what you do. You just take care of this car 'till I get back. I don't figure that I'll need them tires any ways soon. There is two buses a day going and coming between here and Angelo and I figure that I can go and come on the bus for about half what it costs me to drive this car. And since I know how hard I have to work to make money I am going save what I got. So its me for the buses from now on."

Moral: When you don't ride with us we bush lose money.

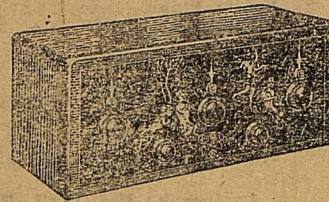

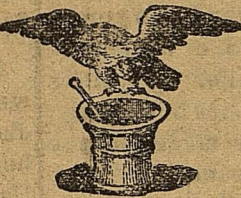

Lesson for June 13

JOSEPH'S FIDELITY

LESSON TEXT—Genesis 39:1-23.
GOLDEN TEXT—Seest thou a man diligent in his business; he shall stand before kings.—Prov. 22:29.
PRIMARY TOPIC—A Noble Slave Boy.
JUNIOR TOPIC—How Joseph Behaved as a Slave.
INTERMEDIATE AND SENIOR TOPIC—Passing Severe Tests.
YOUNG PEOPLE AND ADULT TOPIC—Triumphing Over Trials.

I. Joseph, the Well Beloved Son (37:3).

He was Jacob's favorite son, partly due to the fact that he was the son of the wife of his first love and the son of his old age, but mainly because of the superior qualities he possessed.

II. Joseph's Fidelity as a Son (37:12-17).

Joseph's brethren had gone to Shechem, some fifty miles from Hebron, where there was plenty of pasture for their flocks. After a time Jacob became anxious as to their welfare and dispatched Joseph, now about seventeen years old, for the purpose of finding out their condition. He did not allow the envious hatred of his brethren to deter him from his duty, but willingly responded, "Here am I." He no doubt realized that his mission was fraught with great perils—exposure to wild beasts, robbers, and the murderous hatred of his brethren. His fidelity is shown in two ways.

1. The fact that his father sent him on such a long and dangerous journey to bring back word concerning his brethren shows that he had proved himself to be a trustworthy character.

2. His brave and glad response to his father's request. He responded to his father's confidence.

III. Joseph's Fidelity as a Slave (39:1-19).

1. Sold to the Ishmaelites (37:28). At the sight of Joseph, the murderous envy of his brethren was stirred up. They first proposed to kill him in order to prevent his dreams coming true. Finally, the prudent suggestion of Judah to sell him to the Midianites prevailed and he was carried to Egypt and sold to Potiphar as a slave.

2. His prosperity while a slave in Potiphar's house (39:2-18).

The secret of Joseph's prosperity was that the Lord was with him (v. 2). This prosperity consisted:

(1) Of being accorded the privilege of Potiphar's house, i. e., his private residence instead of his fields or public buildings.

(2) He became Potiphar's personal attendant (v. 4). Observing Joseph's fidelity Potiphar chose him to give attention to his personal affairs.

(3) He was made overseer over Potiphar's house (v. 4). As a personal attendant he proved himself to be so capable that he was made administrator over his estate including his household. He no doubt purchased all supplies and had charge of the servants.

(4) He brought prosperity to Potiphar (v. 5).

The Lord blessed Potiphar for Joseph's sake.

(5) He possessed an attractive personality (v. 6). His fine physique and commanding personality were gifts from God. All our gifts should be consecrated to the Lord who gave them.

3. His temptation (vv. 7-17).

His very attractive person became his peril. Potiphar's wife became infatuated with this handsome slave, and attempted to induce him to commit adultery with her. He resisted this temptation because yielding would have been to sin against his master and his God. The man who is faithful to God will be faithful to his fellowmen.

IV. Joseph's Fidelity as a Prisoner (vv. 19-23).

Being defeated in her wicked purpose, Potiphar's wife accused Joseph falsely. Because of her charge he was thrust into prison. Potiphar must not have really believed his wife or else he would have put Joseph to death. He did to him the least that was possible under the circumstances. Because of his purity and unflinching loyalty to God and man, God was with him even in the prison.

1. The Lord gave him favor in the sight of the keeper of the prison (v. 21). This keeper was none other than Potiphar himself (40:3, cf. 39:1).

2. He was given charge of the prisoners (v. 22).

Potiphar knew Joseph's ability and faithfulness, therefore gave him employment in this new place.

3. The Lord made him prosperous (v. 23).

Joseph's success was due to the hand of his God upon him.
