

MOTHER AND CHILDREN SEPARATED BY BIBLE

Literal Interpretation of Scriptures Is Cause for Rift in Kansas City Family.

Kansas City, Mo. - Mrs. Leona Benedict, thirty-one, widow, with the aid and advice of Juvenile Judge Henry Meade, Kansas City, Kans., mapped out a definite campaign to win back the love of the three older of her six children.

To win that love and change their determination not to live with her, she must drive from their minds the belief that she is wicked in that she has bobbed her hair, wears a red bat and has jewelry in the form of a wed-

During this love drive the children will live with families neutral between the mother and the officials of children's home operated by the Mennonite church in Kansas City,

Slowly but persistently the mother hopes to persuade the children they need not interpret literally the fifth and sixth verses of the eleventh chapter of First Corinthians, which says: "But every woman that prayeth or

prophesieth with her head uncovered. dishonoreth her head; for that is even all one as if she were shaven. "For, if the woman be not covered, let her also be shorn, but if it be

shame for a woman to be shorn or shaven, let her be covered.". When the father of the children died, leaving the mother without means, she accepted an offer of the Mennonites to care for them tem-

She obtained employment as a housekeeper in a Kansas City home, and, after months of saving and arranging to have two rooms in the employer's house, she sought to obtain

custody of the children. Ella, nine; Catherine, eight, and Lester, five, were willing, but Helen. thirteen; Edith, twelve, and Roy, ten, rebelled.

The mother employed a lawyer and appealed to the juvenile court. There the children pointed to their mother's hair and hat and ring and quoted the Bible verses.

The children frankly said they had formed their beliefs since entering the institutional home.

"Mother does not read the Bible every day," Helen. spokesman, told the judge.

A second hearing found the children equally determined and then it was that Judge Meade assumed the Solomon role and devised a plan whereby the mother might have a chance to win back her children's

If, after a few months, she is unable to change their views, the children will be adopted in homes where they now are living.

Testimony was that Mrs. Benedict was of good moral character. "I'll win them yet," said the moth-

er. "Mother love is not weighed by enoth of hair

Mrs. Benedict's greatest worry is that she has to continue to earn her living and that of the younger children by doing housework in Missouri and will have only infrequent opportunities to visit the older children in Kansas farm homes.

Calls Cancer Noncontagious After Experiments on Self

Berlin.—Cancer is not contagious then brought in contact with a ealthy human body, in the opinion of Or. Hans Kurtzahn of the surgical linic of Koenigsberg university. Doctor Kurtzahn has astonished a

onvention of German surgeons now session here by reporting that he and experimented on himself, transfer ing a patch of cancerous growth from patient's pectoral gland to his own thigh. The cancer cells, he reported, soon died, being unable to live in a healthy body.

In an effort to test whether cancer could be cured through a serum. Doctor Kurtzahn also extracted blood from himself after an injection of cancer bacilli. He reported that he had found negative results in the serum made from this blood.

The experiments, which were made five months ago, left Doctor Kurtzahn perfectly healthy. The German physician's willingness to experiment upon nimself in the study of cancer has been acclaimed by his colleagues as an act of rare heroism.

Gold Hoarding Proves

a Boomerang in India London.-Many Englishmen residing in India have come home on vaca tion lately bringing bags of gold coin such as have not been in circulation here since the war.

They explain that sovereigns are so plentiful in India that money changers have been offering them in exchange for rupees at a lewer rate than English notes. Sovereigns can be bought in the bazaars for 13 rupees and 5 annas at the present, whereas at the end of the war it took 20 rupees to buy a sovereign.

The reason for the glut is the greed for hoarding gold in India, which absorbed half the world's output last year. Now there is more gold on hand than the hoarders and banks know what to do with.








beneficial properties. If a woman follows out the rules of diet, birthdays to her will be nothing more than an excuse for a celebration.


Purity of Milk Protected Now By Scientists His wife toils late and early,

Careful housewives constantly make it a point to ascertain the quality of each item that goes on their tables. Preparing food for the family is an extremely important job, for the proper selection and preparation of foods make in a large measure for the health and happiness of the family.

Milk is the most nearly perfect food, but it is a very delicate one as well. The keeping qualities of milk are slight. Danger from contamination is ver present. Evaporated milk, which double rich because of the removal of 60 per cent of the water, is science's

olution to these conditions. Safeguarding evaporated milk is vorked out as perfectly as man's ingenuity has been able to make the rocess. From cow to can, the milk which goes into the evaporated product is watched every step of the way



lows of the dairy herds are guarde with constant care and are subjecte to regular inspections by veterinary surgeons. Herds are carefully groomed and their yards and barns are kept crupulously clean, as are all utensils Milk condenseries are located in the neart of the big dairy regions to faciliate speedy handling, for this is essential if the milk is to be canned at "its moment of maturity." Canvascovered trucks haul the milk to market, thus protecting the product from contamination on the way. Arriving at the condensery, the milk goes through tests for acidity, sediment, flavor and butterfat content before it

is accepted. Experts watch the progress of the milk through every step of its way. It goes into the evaporating machine; to the homogenizer, which breaks up the fat globules so that the milk may be easily digested by the consumer; by way of the almost human filling machine into sterilized cans; then into the sterilizer, where the cans are surrounded by steam and boiling water destroying any possible bacteria. I. Their Birth (25:21-26)

In answer to Isaac's prayer, seed was given unto him. Before the children were born God revealed unto Rebekah the fact that the elder should serve the younger. God reversed the ordinary law concerning the position of the elder son.

II. Esau Sells His Birthright (25 27-33).

1. It was right that Jacob should have the birthright and the blessing, for it was according to God's plan which had been preannounced, but his scheme to get them is to be condemned. He took advantage of a brother's weakness to drive a sharp bargain.

2. Esau the profane (Heb. 12:16, 17)

Many think that profanity is only wearing, but swearing is not the most common profanity. To be under the sway of appetite is to be a profane erson. Esau was a supreme example. He sold his birthright for a bowl of This birthright was the ight of being at the head of the patriarchal family, a position of honor and influence, as well as being the inheritor of a double portion of the father's estate. This being a gift of God, it should not be despised. In the moment of his distress he thought only of that which would bring him some carnal satisfaction. He was willing to relinquish all claims on the future if only his present desire could be gratified. A profane person, therefore, is one who for the enjoyment of the present will forfeit all claims upon

Ison (Gen. 25:28). He ought to have toved him because he was his son. It is a sad commentary upon a father that his love for his son had such a sordid basis as that of his stomach.

2. Rebekah's scheme (vv. 5-33).

God had said to her that the elder should serve the younger. It was His plan that Jacob should be at the head, but God was able to bring His own plans to pass.

3. Esau's remorseful cry (vv. 34-36).

3. Esau's remorserul cry (VV, 34-36). When he came to realize that he had not only lost his birthright but the blessing, his conscience smote him and he earnestly begged for a blessing, even seeking it with bitter tears, IV. Jacob Meets Esau (Gen. 33:1-11)

1. As a result of Jacob's cunning and deceit he was obliged to flee from home to save his life. In spite of his selfishness and sin God appeared to him at Bethel.

2. Prayer for deliverance from Esau's wrath (32:9-12).
