

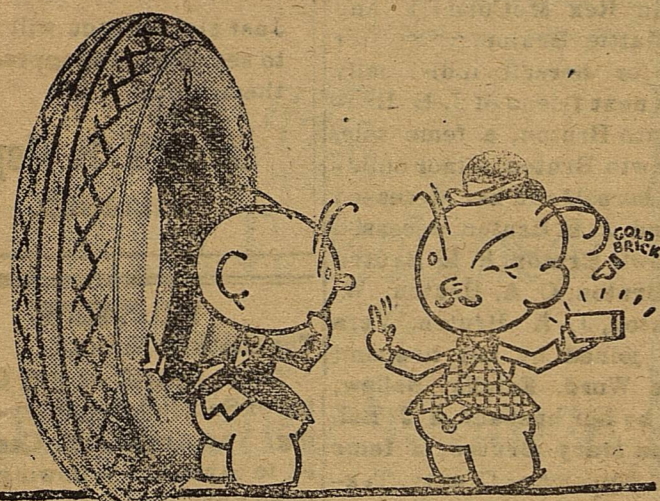

SONORA HIGH'S FAILS TO OUT PLAY ELDORADO.

Friday October 8th, El Dorado defeated Sonora at the Fair Ground Athletic Field, here, in an exhibition of clean, hard, consistent football. The Eagles romped over the field at will. They completed two thirds of their passes against none completed by Sonora. The Sonora line gave way before the powerful El Dorado backs; while the El Dorado line played havoc with Sonora's sluggish offence. Sonora was clearly out classed and out played in every phase of the game.

The game was called at 4:15. El Dorado received, facing the wind, Stewardson kicked on the fourth down; Sonora fumbled and Ballew recovered for El Dorado. El Dorado then marched for the fifty yards through Sonora's line until Alexander, El Dorado fullback, crashed over for the first touchdown. Cain kicked the goal making the score El Dorado 7, Sonora 0. Sonora received and attempted to run the ball down the field, but were forced to kick on the fourth down. The quarter ended with the ball near El Dorado's thirty yard line. Score El Dorado 7, Sonora 0.

The second quarter opened with a punting duel between Stewardson and the Sonora fullback, Stewardson kicked fifty yards and Sonora returned 25. Alexander then passed twenty yards to Heavy Sitton. El Dorado

do's fullback, who ran about 40 yards for the second touchdown. Cain failed to kick goal. The score then was El Dorado 13, Sonora 0. Sonora received and returned the ball to their twenty yard line, they lost eight yards and attempted to punt on the fourth down. Cain smashed through and blocked the punt while Heavy Sitton covered the ball on Sonora's five yard line. Sitton advanced the ball three yards and Alexander smashed it over for the third touchdown. Cain failed to kick goal. The half ended with Sonora on her thirty yard line fighting desperately against a strong El Dorado offense, the score then was 19 to 0.

The second half opened with Sonora in possession of the ball. El Dorado kicked and Sonora ran the ball back to their own 40 yard line. They came down the field fighting desperately and finally, a fleetfooted Sonora back, slashed off 25 yards around his own right end placing the ball in El Dorado's ten yard line. The El Dorado defense solidified and the quarter ended with the ball on El Dorado's five yard line in Sonora's possession.

Sonora lost the wind and the last quarter opened with El Dorado sullenly waiting on their own five yard line. Sonora attempted a plunge and fumble but recovered on El Dorado's two yard line. They, then, attempted a short slashing end run but Sitton tackled the back for an eight yard loss. Sonora attempted to kick a field goal but Soup Young, El Dorado end, easily blocked the kick. Pat Finley, El Dorado guard, covered the ball on El Dorado's 20 yard line. An exchange of punts brought the ball to the 50 yard line where Alexander passed to Cain who twisted, stumbled and stiff armed 35 yards for the fourth touchdown. Cain missed the kick. The score was then 25 to 0. Sonora kicked and came only saved them from the furious offensive launched by El Dorado in the hopes of scoring in the last three minutes of the game. The game ended with the ball in midfield, the score was El Dorado 25, Sonora 0.

Features of the game were: Alexander's powerful plugging and passing; Sitton's tackling and winning; Stewardson's punting and tackling; Ratliff's beady quarter backing; Floyd Young's consistent and excellent playing; Joel Ballew's and Cecil McClatchey's fierce tackling; Prince Murphy's and Pat Finley's eager and efficient guarding; Captain Cain passing and aggressive tackling and running; the evasive of Mr. Barber's coaching; El Dorado Pep Squad's cheering; Ted Lane's refereeing; and Mr. George Williams' able field managing.

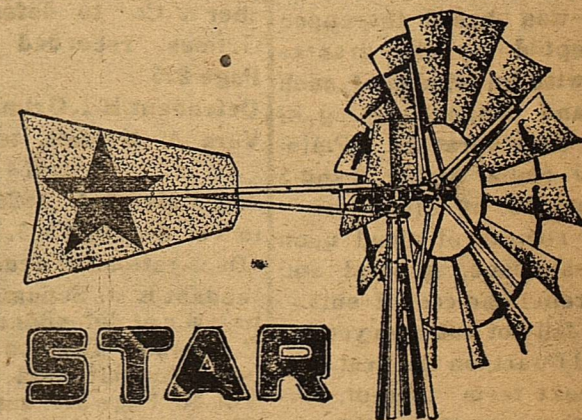

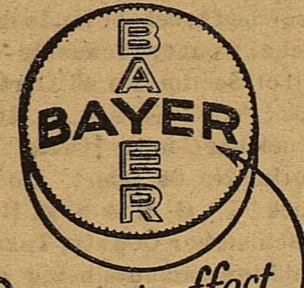

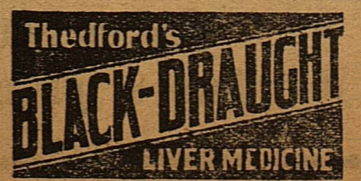
