Christ is not merely the constant theme of scripture, He is the only solution of the human enigma. Without Him, humanity has no hope. He is the only being who can say, on the authority of His own resurrection, "I am the resurrection and the life, He that believeth on Me, tho he were dead, yet shall he live; and he that liveth and believeth on Me shall never die."

This being the case, it is strange that mankind in general has so little interest in Him, has taken such small pains to really know Him.

Most men, who study Him at all, seize upon some special phase of His manifestation, and being fascinated by it, fail to get the rest of His marvelous personality and power. One person is entranced by His divinity so completely, they lose sight of His own designation of Himself as the son of man. Another can see only the human side of His complex nature.

They allow He is a great man, and the greatest Teacher that has ever lived, but for them He is only a great man. The divine part escapes them, and with it His saving grace. The next one sees interest in His miracle working power, and like Nicodemus, the politician, and strive to belt this on the their partisan plans, and failing in this, pass Him up as useless. Still others, like Bruce Barton, see Him as a trained athlete, a sort of an ancient John L. Sullivan, who by brute strength is able to drive the money changers out of the Temple and to impart His superabundant physical vitality to the sick and so make them well. In a recent article, Barton has refused to recognize any element of divine power to the Christ when he hushed the winds and stilled the waves, in order that the disciples storm-tossed boat might come safely to harbor.

Then again, comes one who is glad to take Christ for his savior, but refuses Him as his Master and guide. He is ready to meet Christ at the threshold of this life and declare—Lord I believe on you, for thou alone hast the words of eternal life, but I have my own plans for life in the world, and You must not interfere. I will meet you at the gate of Heaven, at the end of this life, and you must not fail to be there, for you alone can open the gate for me, but until then good-bye.

Again there comes one who rejects Christ as one who saves by grace, but is willing to accept Him as the man of his council. He believes the Christ's example the best one to follow and so takes Him for his pattern in all things, but of course finds himself unable to live the Christ life without, because he lacks the Christ life within.

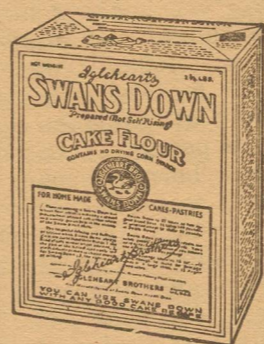

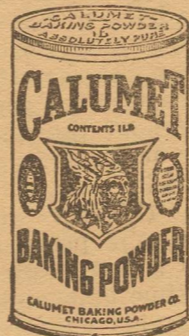
