City Receives Sales Tax Check

State Comptroller Bob Bullock said Friday his office has mailed monthly city sales tax rebate checks totaling \$22 million to 867 Texas cities and towns that assess the one percent tax. McLean received a check for \$1,109.91.

The May checks bring to \$235.3 million the total rebates for the eight months of the current fiscal year, a \$44 million increase over the same period for fiscal 1976, Bullock said.

Well, it has finally happened! I am ready for it to quit raining for a few weeks. Now six weeks ago, I think I would probably have said it will never get too wet for me. But, farmers sure do need to get some field work done and alfalfa hay needs cutting. I certainly hope everyone got all the corn planted that they wanted before this week's rain. By the time fields get dry now, corn planting season will have passed.

This wet weather has certainly been nice on all of the lovegrass that has been planted this spring in the McLean area.

CATTLE IMPLANTS

With all of this rain and lush pastures, now is an excellent time to implant yearling cattle or suckling calves. Mr. Floyd Hines, Lefors, called earlier in the week about implanting some yearling steers.

Research has shown that implants improve daily gain 8 to 12 percent and feed efficiency by 8 to 10 percent. Implanting suckling calves with Ralgro has shown an improvement in weaning weight by 20 to 25 pounds. A fact sheet, L-1402, contains information and recommendations for using implants on cattle. Call or come by the Extension Office for your copy.

MULCH GARDENS

Mulching your vegetable garden can make a marked increase on production if the procedure is done correctly.

Mulching is a way of retarding weeds and protecting plant roots from adverse conditions

with some type of ground covering. There are four basic types of mulching materials--clear plastic, black plastic, paper and organic mulches such as grass clippings, sawdust and compost.

Plastic is becoming a widely used ground cover to provide the same results as paper, straw and other mulches. Plastics tend to raise soil temperatures from 5 to 10 degrees F. while paper and organic mulches tend to lower soil temperatures by about the same amount.

Both clear and black plastics may be used and both types warm the soil earlier in the season than most mulches. Clear plastic has one distinct disadvantage of allowing weeds to grow.

laid over seeded row to speed up seed germination. Of course, it must be removed as soon as the seedlings emerge.

Black plastic drastically cuts down weed growth with the exception of nutgrass. Holes or slits should be cut through the plastic to allow seeding or transplanting and to permit sufficient moisture to reach the garden bed.

Paper mulches are among the older types of coverings for vegetable gardens. Since paper mulch can reduce soil temperature and thereby inhibit plant growth, it should be put down after plants are well into the growing stages.

Paper mulches have one of the benefits common to organic mulches--they decompose and therefore need not be removed at the end of the gardening season.

Organic mulches are still the most popular today. They are effective in retaining soil moisture, in controlling weeds and soil erosion and in reducing fruit rot. Organic mulches also improve the soil's physical condition where plowed under at the end of the season.

When using organic mulches, the amount of fertilizer applied to the garden soil should be increased by one-fourth to compensate for the nutrients used in breaking down the organic materials.

Using mulches effectively, regardless of the type of material, can help insure high yields of quality vegetables.

"REPENT YE, AND BELIEVE THE GOSPEL . . ."

(Mark 1:15)

The field of Biblical Exegesis is a most neglected subject. For those that might not understand what it is, God explains it simply in 2 Tim. 2:15: "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing (handling aright ASV) the word of truth." "Rightly dividing" or "handling aright" the word of truth results in sound Biblical exegesis or "sound doctrine."

Consider Mark 1:15 - ". . . repent ye and believe the gospel" is often cited as what to do in order to be saved. But does repentance precede faith?

1. If repentance is represented as necessary to salvation and precedes faith, then it (repentance) is SIN! Romans 14:23 states: ". . . for whatsoever is not of faith is sin." Faith comes by hearing the word of God (Rom. 10:17). If. . . repentance precedes faith, it is no part of faith and is therefore sin (Rom. 14:23).

2. If repentance is Biblical doctrine one only learns of it after hearing the word of God (Rom. 10:17). Then, one, by faith, is lead to repentance! Jesus said that the men of Nineveh "repented at the preaching of Jonah" (Matt. 12:41). Their repentance came when their faith (belief) in the message of Jonah - the word of God - led them to it!

Does this then make of no value the exhortation or command of Jesus in Mark 1:15? No way! Every fact, commandment, prohibition, warning, exhortation, example, prophecy and promise MUST BE CAREFULLY KEPT IN ITS PROPER SETTING TO BE UNDERSTOOD. If we will apply seven simple questions - sound rules of Biblical Exegesis - to this passage or any other passage, untold difficulties will be eliminated. They are:

1. Who is speaking (or writing)?
2. To whom is he speaking?
3. About whom is he speaking?
4. When was it spoken?
5. Where was it spoken?
6. What were the circumstances?
7. Why was it spoken?

Consider Mark 1:15. Jesus was speaking to Jews who had faith (belief) in God - but were rejectin Him. Notice verse 14 says He was "preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God . . ." At their rejection of Him and His message, He told them "the time is fulfilled, and the kingdom is at hand, repent ye (of what? their rejection of Him) and believe the gospel (gospel of God concerning His son Jesus Christ . . . Rom. 1:1-3).

Those to whom Jesus was speaking were believers not "rightly dividing" or "handling aright" the Word of God. Jesus said the time is fulfilled! The Messiah had come, the kingdom was at hand! (Read Deut. 4:1-2; 11:32; 12:32; Isa. 2:2-4; Dan. 2:31-45; Micah 5:2; Mal. 3:1-3; 4:4-6). Why would they not accept Him and His message in the light of all the evidence --- both prophecy and miraculous confirmation? Because they had made up their minds in the matter and closed their eyes and ears to the Truth!

May we always come to the Bible to seek our doctrine and not to "prove" a doctrine. If found to be wrong as the Jews were to whom Jesus was speaking, may our faith ever be strong enough to lead us to repentance, to obey all the commands of the gospel in order that we might be saved.

Heaven is too precious to stand on tradition, ceremony or pride.

1. SOURDOUGH STARTER

- 1 package active dry yeast
- 2 1/2 cups warm water (105° to 115°)
- 1 cup instant nonfat dry milk
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 4 cups all-purpose flour

a) Stir yeast, water, dry milk and sugar in 2 1/2 quart crock or non-metallic bowl until yeast is dissolved. Stir in flour gradually until a smooth batter forms. Let stand loosely covered in warm place, 3 to 5 days. Stir down batter occasionally. Store loosely covered in refrigerator.

b) Replace exact amount of starter used for each recipe by stirring equal amounts of homogenized milk and flour back into starter. (For example, replace 1 cup starter with 1/2 cup homogenized milk and 1/2 cup flour). Let stand loosely covered until it bubbles, overnight. Stir down. Each time this process is repeated, the starter becomes more active and develops a more sour flavor. Note: if stored as much as two to three weeks between usings, just pour off the watery layer on top and replace following procedure in (b).

2. SOURDOUGH BREAD STICKS

- 1 cup instant nonfat dry milk
- 1 cup warm water (105° to 115°)
- 1 cup Sourdough Starter (see Recipe No. 1)
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 3 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 to 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/4 cup butter or margarine, melted

a) Mix dry milk, water, Sourdough Starter and 2 cups flour in metallic bowl, cover loosely. Let stand in warm place until mixture is coarse and bubbly, at least 8 hours.

b) Mix oil, salt, sugar and baking soda into sourdough mixture in enough of the remaining flour to make dough easy to handle. Knead dough lightly on well-floured board, about 2 minutes.

c) Roll dough into rectangle, 15 x 10 inches, on well-floured board. Cut into fifteen 1-inch strips. Roll each strip into even round stick. Place bread sticks on greased baking sheet; brush with melted butter. Cover with plastic wrap. Let rise in warm place until 1 to 1 1/2 hours.

d) Heat oven to 375°. Bake bread sticks until golden brown, 30 minutes. (Makes 15).

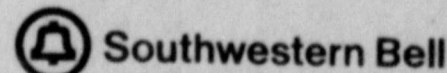

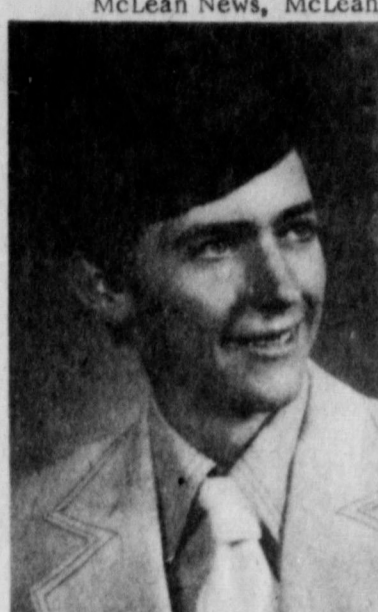

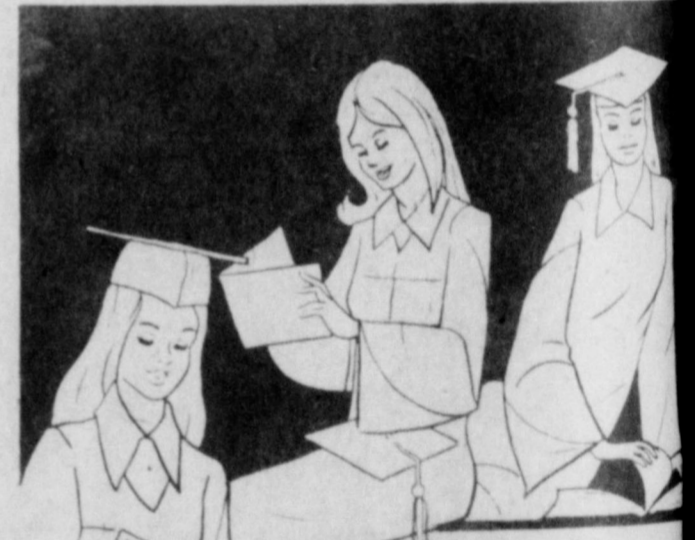
