Future Farmer of America and 4-H groups the past year received bobwhite quail for stocking through the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

Four additional clubs will receive birds shortly. FFA and 4-H students interested in a quail management program contact the department through the instructors and county agents. Then under carefully controlled and supervised programs, bobwhite quail are furnished at no cost.

Such shipments follow a habitat improvement project, and after release the birds are checked and managed on a prescribed basis. Previous releases of birds in this manner have proven successful and every effort is made to insure the survival of the pen-raised game birds.

Visiting preacher at Heald Sunday morning was Rev. Norman Grigsby of Gruver. Rev. Jack Riley of Sudan led the singing.

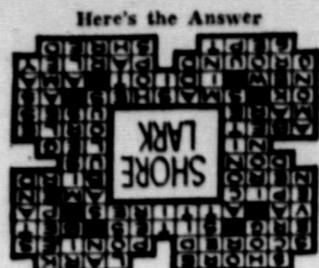

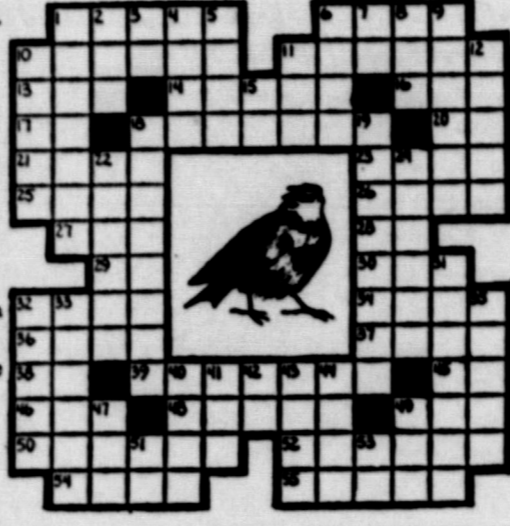

**Gun Perils Cited For Hunt Fans**

Scores of hunting trips are marred every year in Texas by shooting accidents, many of them fatal, grimly reminds the Texas Park and Wildlife Department.

In a pre-dove season opener plea (north zone Sept. 1), the department said that since the oldest causes are the most common causes of field tragedies, they are being repeated:

Removing a loaded gun muzzle first from a vehicle.

Crawling through or over a fence with a loaded gun.

Failing to notice that dirt or foreign substance blocks gun barrel.

Jumping up in front of a companion into the line of fire. Dropping a loaded gun.

Pointing a loaded gun at another person.

And, of course, "I didn't know it was loaded."

Besides being careful with fire arms, hunters, according to the department, should operate cautiously in hot weather. This is because of the general utilization of

air conditioning that provides a serious contrasting temperature hazard, particularly for persons not in the best of health.

**Cotton in 7-In. Rows**

They're growing cotton in narrow, 7-inch rows at Texas A and M University's South Plains Research and Extension Center near Lubbock. Researchers say yields have been slightly higher in narrow rows, compared to standard 40-inch rows, and costs have been cut as much as 27 per cent.

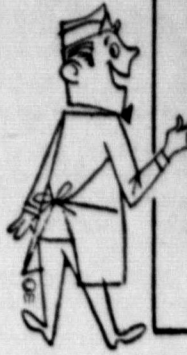
