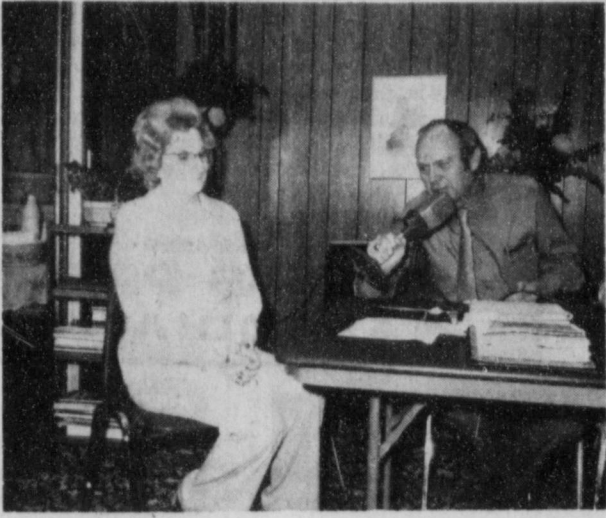

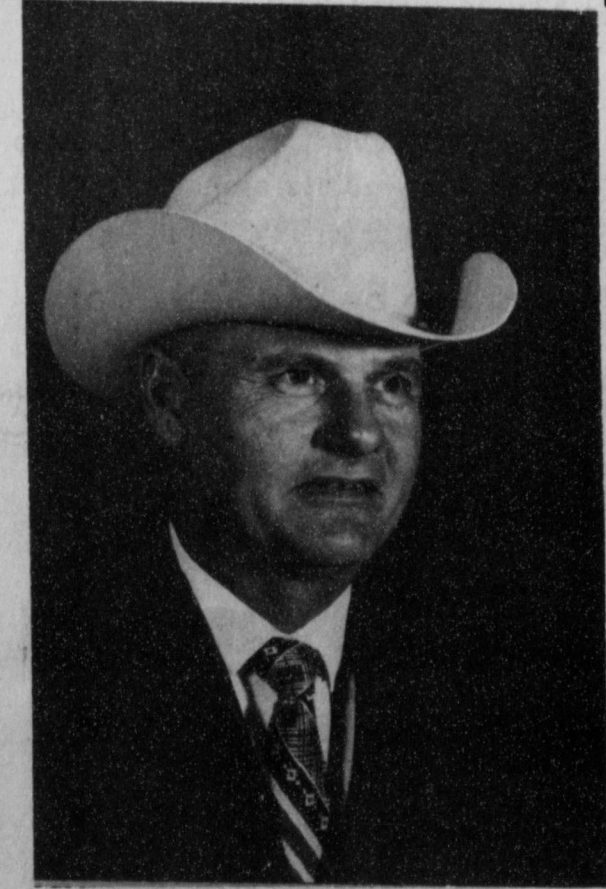

## PHSA Okays 'Need' Petition

The second bid for a certificate of need to construct a convalescent home by the Hansford Hospital District, passed both the Panhandle Health Systems Agency review committee and the board, Thursday night. Hansford Hospital Administrator, Jerry Taylor, was jubilant. "We are on our way to Austin," he said Friday morning. Actually, June 5 is the date representatives of the hospital district go to the state capital to pursue the trail of paper work and hearings that will ultimately lead to the construction and operation of the convalescent facility at Spearman. At the initial meeting of the review committee last week to consider the application for a certificate of need, it was temporarily turned down. Hospital district representatives at that review hearing on the application, were told to go home and "get their act together." Following that meeting, Administrator Taylor admitted there was a point here and there in the bid that might have been clearer for laymen buy they involved items that would have saved money had they sufficed as they were. An example was the computer "run". The group went into the hearing, Thursday night, with the new printout that required no transposition to the other substantive material. "The procedures at Austin will be more technical," Taylor explained. "We will have our architect's drawings and we will be ready to discuss equipment and other technical aspects of actual construction and operation."

## Accident Kills Long-time Gruver Resident

One man, Harry John Roscoe 83, died, another was seriously injured and five escaped serious injury in a three-car accident at Loop 143 and US 83 at Perryton about 5 p.m., Wednesday. Roscoe, a long-time Gruver resident and currently living in a retirement home at Perryton, was a passenger in a car driven by Scott Hintergardt, 20, Gruver when it was in collision with a welding truck which, in turn, spun from the force of the crash and struck another vehicle. Hintergardt was treated at Ochiltree General Hospital then transferred to Northwest Texas Hospital, Amarillo, where he is reported in serious condition. His twin brother, Guy Paul, a passenger in the car, did not even require hospitalization. Mrs. Anna Barlow Cooper, 72, Gruver, also a passenger in the Hintergardt car, was treated at the Perryton Hospital and released. A native of California, he had been a Gruver resident 60 years prior to taking up residence at the retirement home at Perryton. He had been an employee of Cooper Farms a number of years before his retirement. Funeral services were at 2 p.m., Friday, in First Christian Church, Gruver with Dr. J.W. Duke, pastor officiating. Burial was in Gruver Cemetery under the direction of Boxwell Brothers.

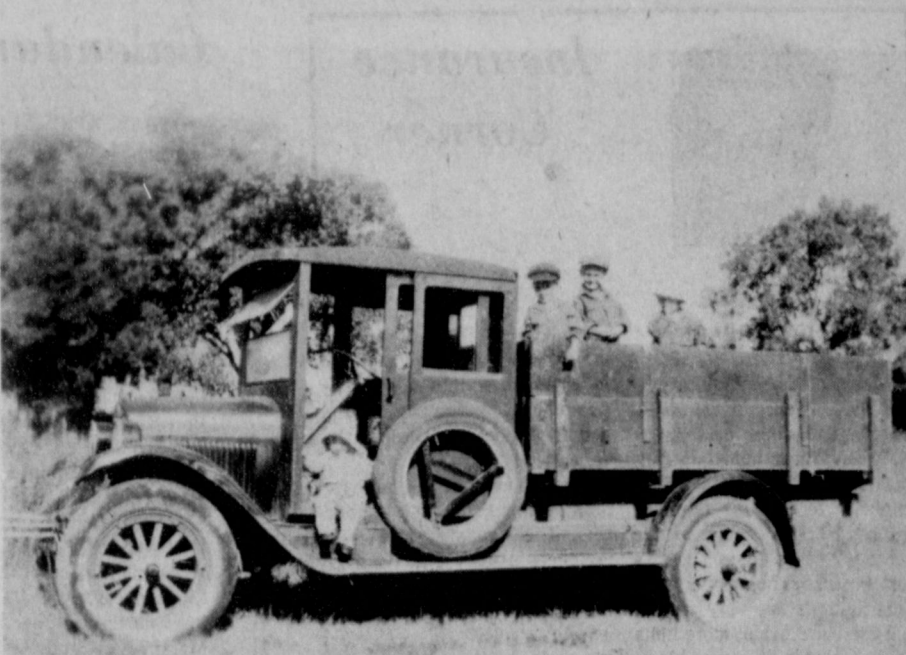
