The 36th Annual Texas Tech N.I.R.A. Rodeo, the world's largest indoor collegiate rodeo was held October 24, 25, & 26, in the Lubbock Municipal Coliseum. Tech is in the Southwest region and former students from Spearman participated in the rodeo representing their respective colleges and regions. Hadley Reed and Travis Patterson from Tarleton State University in Stephenville and Mark Pearson from Texas Tech all did well in their events on Saturday night.

In conjunction with the rodeo there was also the Miss Rodeo Texas Tech contest. On Saturday night the winner was announced. Miss Ken Wedeking, Stamford, Texas was crowned queen for 1985-86. Miss Shelley Cook of Spearman was named first runner-

up and also won the horsemanship award. Shelly also had the privilege of singing the National Anthem at all three nights performances.

Stacey Cook also of Spearman was presented with a belt buckle during the Saturday night performances. Stacy was one of two to receive the Lenore M. Tunnell Memorial Award which is presented to male and female Texas Tech University student and Rodeo Association member each year. The annual winners are chosen by Association members. Mrs. Tunnell was an Assistant Professor in the Department of English and a ten-year sponsor of the Texas Tech Rodeo Association.

### Karen's Kozy Korner

Halloween treats may seem more like "tricks" to parents who want to keep their children from filling up on candy. Here are some suggestions on how to keep the holiday treats safe and curb your child's urge for overeat sugary foods:  
--Let children trick-or-treat only in familiar areas and neighborhoods.  
--make sure children eat before going out and don't eat anything out of their bags before coming.  
--After trick-or-treating, share the fun by letting the children show you their treats. Throw away any unwrapped items or those with torn wrappers. Wash fruit and cut into small pieces to make sure nothing has been placed

inside.  
--encourage your children to save some candy by suggesting that they eat one or two pieces a day, at snack time and as a dessert following a meal.  
--along with the sweet treat at snack time or dessert, offer the child some milk or juice to drink.

### FCIC set up Hearings

Responding to the need for farmer input, the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation (FCIC) has set up a series of producer hearings across the U.S. The action was taken as a result of Board of Directors resolution delaying a change in unit definitions for insurance purposes, and comes after similar sessions held in Washington to hear insurance industry and agricultural interest representatives. FCIC Manager Merritt W. Sprague commented that, "These sessions will give producers an opportunity to tell us how the Crop Insurance program meets their needs and what they would do to improve the program." Two teams of FCIC representatives, one headed by Manager Sprague and the other led by Deputy Manager, Edward D. Hews, will begin conducting public forums November 7, in twelve cities across the country. The sites were chosen to geographically represent the in-

surance now available. The scheduled local site is the Community Center, Nazareth, Texas, on November 14 at 1:30 p.m. "During our public forum in Washington," FCIC Manager Sprague noted, "the needs of the producer, the reactions of the producer, the willingness of the producer, and the problems of the producer as they relate to Crop Insurance were all represented by others in response to FCIC proposals. We hope that these listening sessions will give the producer the opportunity to speak for himself." Deputy FCIC Manager Hews commented that the sessions would also, "Provide us, Board members and managers, who have responsibility for the program a chance to exchange ideas with producers. We look to sharing views which will contribute to a stronger and more effective crop insurance program."

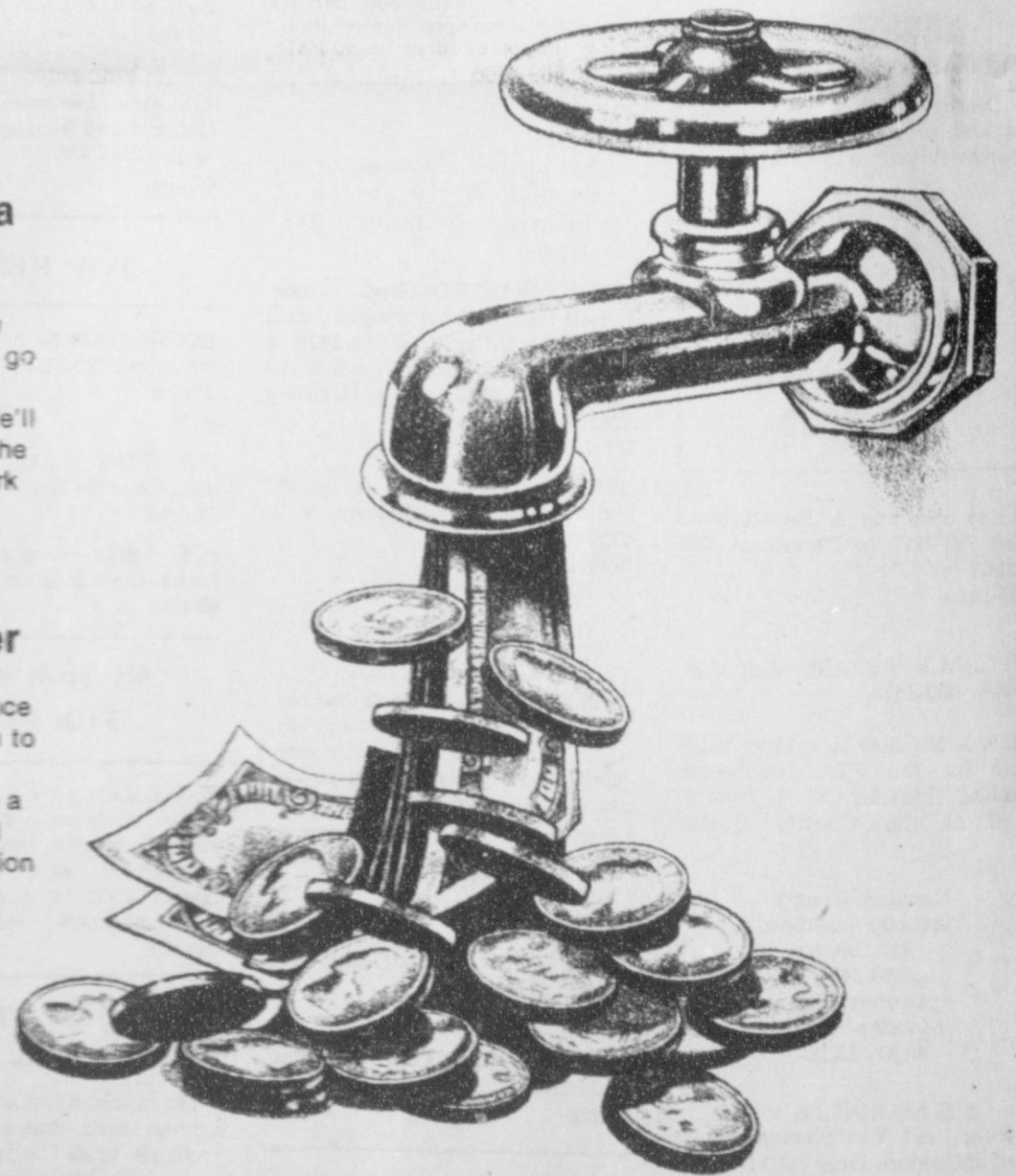

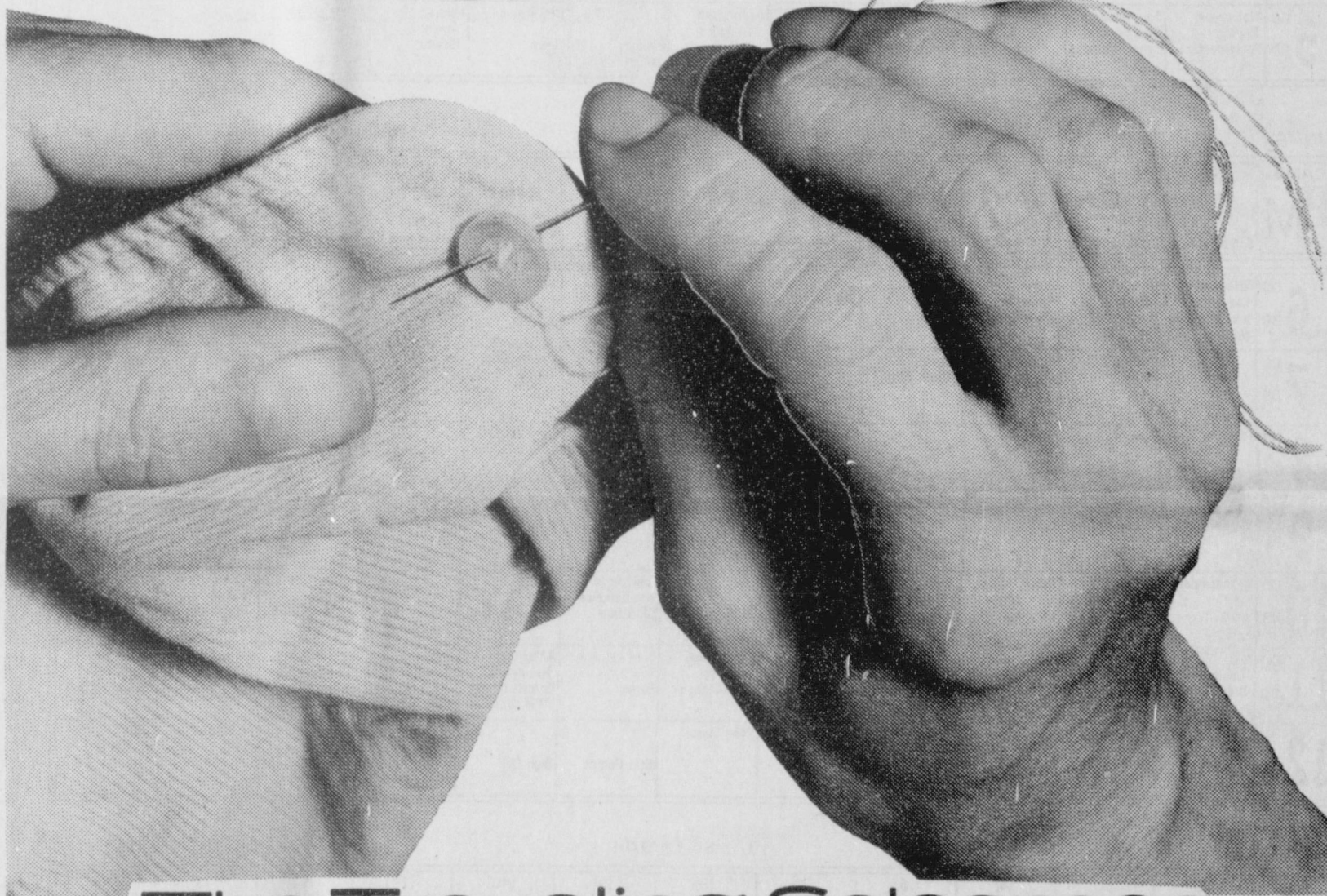

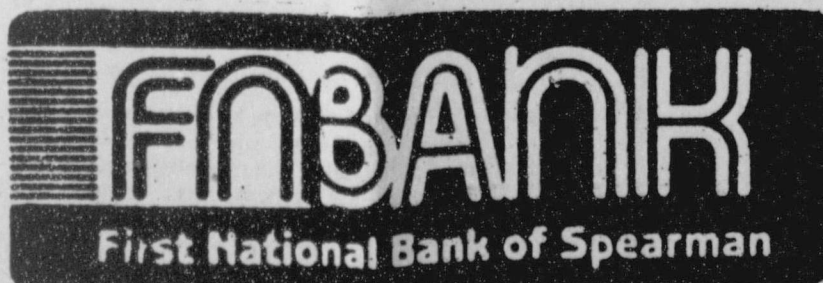
