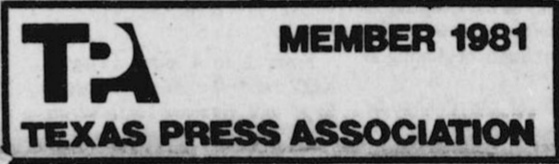

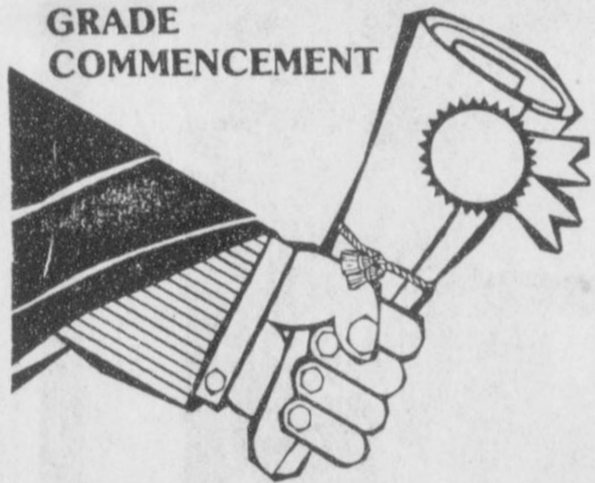

THEME: "SOCIETY'S PRESSURE POINTS"

Soil Stewardship week will be held nationwide this year May 24-31, according to Charles Brillhart, Chairman of the Hansford Soil & Water Conservation District.

Since 1955, Soil Stewardship Week has been recognized in millions of churches and schools across the nation. It is designed to focus on the nation's natural resource problems and to consider ways to solve them.

"This country must, at whatever cost, maintain the capacity of the land to produce food and fiber," cites the National Association of Conservation Districts (NACD) in its booklet for the 1981 observance. NACD sponsors Soil Stewardship Week in cooperation with the nation's 3,000 soil and water districts.

"With our own population at 220 million and growing and with many regions of the world depending on the United States to supplement their food supply, the need to maintain our productive capacity becomes increasingly apparent," according to NACD.

This year's event focuses on "Society's Pressure Points" as its theme and covers such topics as soil and water conservation, urbanization, and loss of prime farmland.

Pantex Plant Fate Studied

Hansford County residents were apparently passed over lightly with regard to a meeting scheduled at Amarillo, Thursday, regarding the environmental impact of the Pantex nuclear arms plant near Amarillo and its possible future.

With typical federal "gobbledegook" the meeting is called a "scoping" meeting for it is to explore the scope of continued operation of the Pantex plant and its possible expansion.

Some counties were notified, seemingly "sotto voce," that those wishing to speak to the purpose, make a statement orally at the meeting, should make such a request by 4:15 p.m. LAST THURSDAY!

No one in Hansford knew about it ahead of the deadline.

However, such statements might possibly be made from the floor AFTER all duly requested statements have been made, if there is time.

The meeting will be in two sessions at the Hilton Inn on

I-40 East of downtown Amarillo. There will be a hearing at 1 p.m. and at 7 p.m., Thursday, May 28.

Pantex, currently occupying more than 10,000 acres of Panhandle land both assembles nuclear weapons and disassembles them for checking, maintenance and/or modification before returning them to the nation's arsenal of such arms.

Under consideration will be a number of alternatives including continued operation at the present location with possible expansion, moving some or all of the facilities to an existing location near Burlington, Iowa or to a third, undisclosed location.

Many Panhandle area residents feel adversely about having the facility in this area.

The environmental impact study is to bring a statement in October, 1982 with a final statement on the fate of the facility in mid-1983.

Newton serving as youth director

Cost of Living Drops

The cost of living dropped almost one-third of a percent in the Texas Panhandle during April, due primarily to substantial decreases in food and transportation costs.

News of a .30 percent cost-of-living decrease in the Panhandle last month was released today (May 22) by Security Federal Savings, sponsor of the monthly Panhandle Cost-of-Living Index.

"The significant drop in the cost of living her during April can be attributed to seasonal declines in produce prices and the first decrease we've seen all year in motor fuel prices," said Aubrey Steele, president of Security Federal Savings. He explained that food was down more than two percent for the month due to the decrease of almost 20 percent in produce prices.

"Tomatoes and green peppers during April cost just half what they did during March, and other produce including lettuce, onions and potatoes also showed significant decreases," Steele said. "Shelf items such as sugar were also down. Meat was up about three-fourths of one percent, however."

Steele said that because of the decrease in motor fuel prices, the transportation category showed a .75 percent decrease during April.

In other areas surveyed: Medical costs were up by 1.58 percent, very similar to last month's increase of 1.60 percent.

Clothing costs were up by 1.68 percent due to increases in children's wear.

Utility costs were up by 2.26 percent due to a 4.03 percent increase in electric fuel adjustment charges.

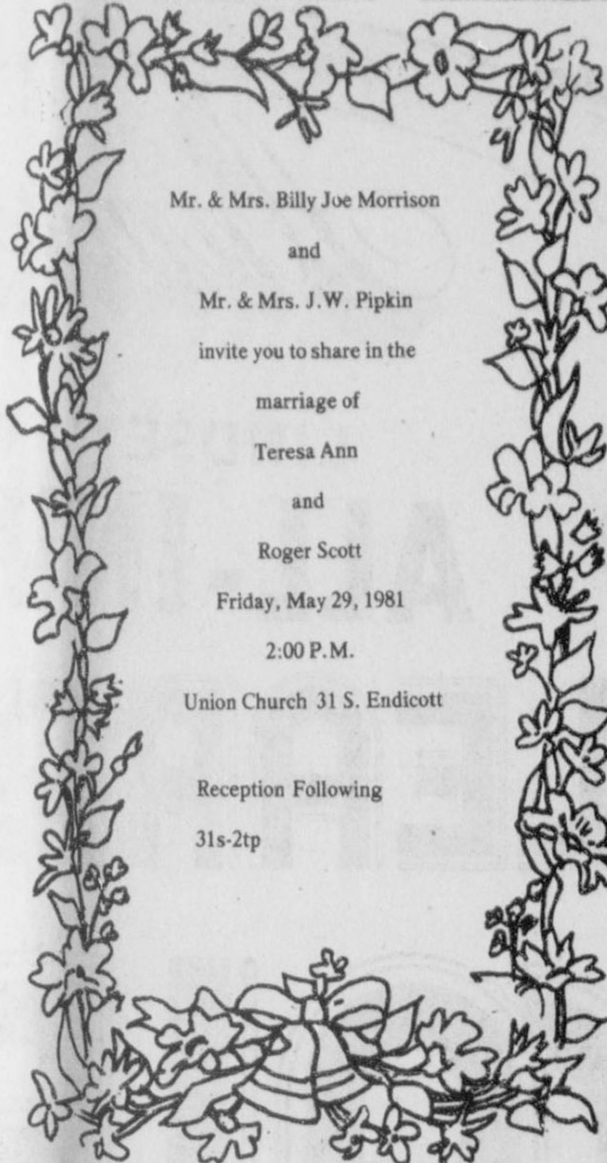

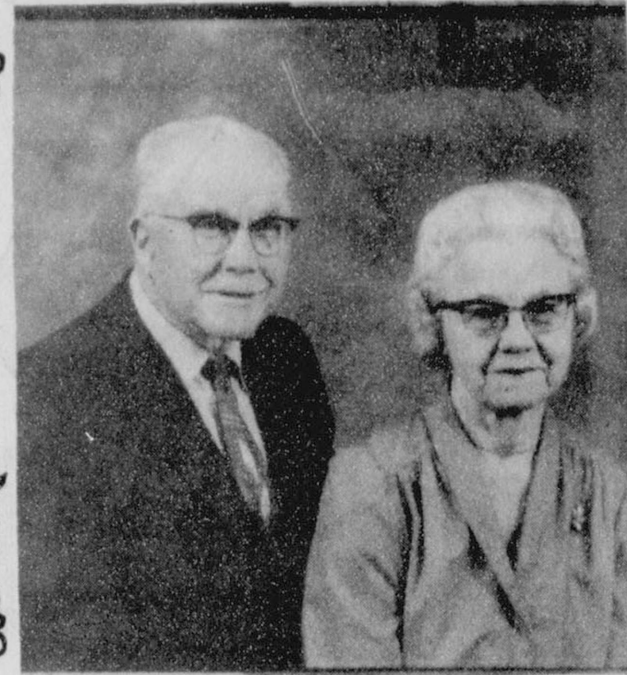
