
S.H.S. Choir Magazine Sales

Several people have expressed a desire for the printing of another book after reading the first volume. This second book is being prepared for the children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren not yet born.

and "Newcomers" each have the responsibility of preserving their family story for future descendants. Tribute pages will be available to honor living family members. Memorial pages to write the stories of deceased family members. There will be a business/organization section to tell that part of history. If your story does appear in Volume I, the same story will not be accepted again. However, you may up-date your family story in the 500 words. Do you have a new baby? A new son-in-law? Perhaps, you were only able to tell a part of your story because of the word limit. Tell the rest of your story in this

second book and add a new picture. After seeing the first book, many people told the committee that they also had pictures of Old Hansford, old school pictures, etc. Share your pictures in the second book. This book must be completed in a very short time because of the ever increasing costs of publication. There is no time to delay. Start writing your family story now. Only a short time can be allowed. Help will be available in each community. This announcement will appear in next weeks paper. If you have family members who now live far away, but at one time they lived in Hansford County contact them and tell

them of this opportunity to become a part of recorded history. The first volume of Hansford County History was sold to libraries across the State of Texas, including Dallas Public Library and Houston Public Library. The book was also purchased by several University Libraries to be used in their Genealogy Research Departments. It is important to record this story for the future.

The weather was perfect for football, and the game was excellent, with the Lynx "still in the game" until the last few minutes. Dennis Randall scored the touchdown for the Purple team, and Monty George kicked the extra point.

Family disturbances head police reports

Property damage vied with domestic disturbances for "top billing" in the reporting period of Spearman Police Department activity from Friday, Sept. 18 to press time this week, according to Police Chief Ron Robinson. Two damage reports Saturday were the first items on the blotter. The cable TV company reported 350 feet of line damaged at a location behind the U.S. Post Office. Investigation disclosed the damage was done by a Baker & Taylor Truck with gin poles. Payment of damages was agreed upon, the incident was recorded as a traffic accident and no charges were filed. Also on Saturday, Bill Hand reported to police that persons believed to be juveniles were

taking vehicles onto the airport runway and "cutting donuts" damaging the finish on aircraft parked there with flying gravel and debris. Police are investigating. To make Saturday a totally busy day, police began their investigation of a reported 15-year old girl who ran away from home. This incident ended on a happier note than most runaway reports: the girl returned home of her own accord. Another juvenile female figured in police activity Sunday. The girl complained she was being harassed and threatened by other juvenile females. Complaints were filed and the matter referred to the court. Monday brought the third damage complaint for the

reporting period. Three windows of five foot square plate glass suffered 43 hits by B-Bs at Longley's Cabinet Shop, 303 N. Bernice. Police are investigating this incident. The first domestic disturbance of the reporting period came Monday when a couple in the 200 block of S. Brandt got into a quarrel. The incident was resolved with no complaints being filed in the matter. Disturbance of domestic bliss took a different turn, Tuesday, when a fight broke out at the mall involving a husband and wife and a single man. This was quelled at the scene only to break out again later at Allsup's store. Everybody filed charges against each other and the matter was referred to the

court, according to Chief Robinson. The week was quiet from that point with only one other incident, a domestic disturbance in the 100 Blk. of S. Haney. The reporting period was free of accidents for the first time in weeks, a welcome relief noted by the police chief. What was not so welcome, Chief Robinson reported that the total number of all offenses had already exceeded the number last year with three months yet to go. The chief said incidents involving non-residents or "outsiders" accounted for much of the increase.

drugs. Later that day, Scott experienced a spiritual "rebirth" and was set free from the chains of drug addiction. Since his spiritual "metamorphosis", he felt a calling to go and reach others with this message of deliverance through the power of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Hinkle graduated from Christ For the Nations Institute in Dallas, Texas, and was ordained into the Full Gospel ministry in 1974.

Along with his wife, Nancy, who also has a tremendous testimony of deliverance from drugs, Hinkle directed a "New Life for Girls" program in Arizona and Mississippi. He also served as an assistant pastor in Pennsylvania.

luncheon beginning at 11:45. Nightly services begin at 7:30. Pastor Rogers of Union Church invites the public to attend. A nursery will be provided for each service.


