## Jaycee Chapter to man Jerry Lewis Telethon pledge center

Spearman will again be one of over 30 cities taking part in the Panhandle segment of the Jerry Lewis Labor Day Telethon with a special Pledge Center located at the Chamber of Commerce office. Mike Cudd is serving as coordinator for the pledge center which will be open throughout the Telethon from 8:00 p.m. Sunday, September 2nd until 6:30 p.m. Monday, September 3rd, Labor Day Weekend. A special phone number, 659-5555 has been assigned for use by the people of Spearman to phone in their pledges.

Originating from Las Vegas,

the 22½ hour TV marathon is held to benefit the medical services and research programs of the Muscular Dystrophy Association (MDA). Telephone pledges and donations made through the Spearman Pledge Center, to be manned around the clock by members of the Spearman Jaycees, will be credited to the citizens throughout the Telethon. The Panhandle show will again be broadcast by KFDD-TV 10 in Amarillo and will feature Mark Robertson-Baker as host and Bob Arnold and Patricia Logan (KFDD news personalities) as co-hosts. They will interview patients from

pledge center towns, and will recognize various fund-raisers throughout the Panhandle, in addition to first-hand reports of pledge center activities. This year, for the first time "The" Telethon will be aired live from the newly remodeled Western Plaza Mall. The new location should generate a lot of excitement, as well as increased dollars for the fight against muscular dystrophy. A variety of special events will take place in the mall in conjunction with the marathon show, including various radio station promotions, clowns and a carnival.

Children wishing to collect door to door for "Jerry's Kids" are asked to come by the pledge center location no later than noon on Labor Day to pick up an official badge and canister. Anyone wishing to organize a special fund raising activity or help out in any other way should call Mike Cudd as soon as possible at 659-2568. Funds raised through the Telethon by Spearman citizens will be spent in the Panhandle area to assist patients with muscular dystrophy and to advance MDA's worldwide research program.

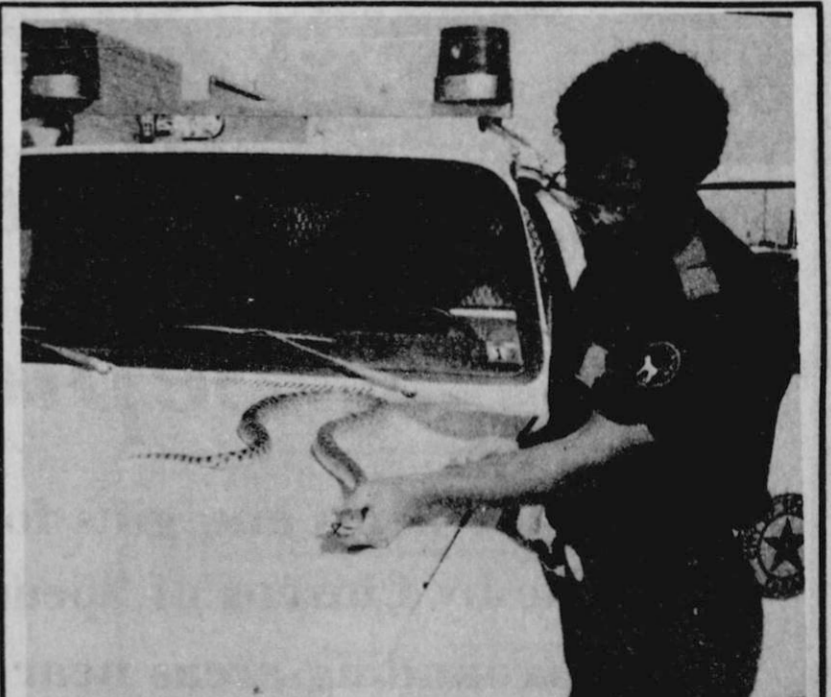

## Our Heritage of Faith...

The movement in being justified by God does not belong to the person nor is it a merit of worthiness, thus a merit of justification, and nor it is not by God and man cooperating in some way, but rather from God alone. The direction of the moment is always from God to man; to us! It is not based on who I am as a person and what I can do or what I can not do but it is by who God is, what God is, and what He intends for me. It needs to be mentioned that God does business with sinners because of His graciousness, His love, and His mercy.

The word, "justification" has legal connotations where the scene is the courtroom. God is the judge and man is the accused and is found guilty. In this case God acts by freeing the accused and the guilty for Christ who on the Cross has handed down to God the verdict of not guilty. We are also included in this by our Baptism (Romans 6:4).

Even though the term justification by grace through faith is Biblical and confessional, there are other descriptions or definitions of God's act of establishing relationships as found in the Bible and in the confessions. Charles Anderson in his book, "Faith and Freedom" mentions the following: forgiveness of sins, absolution, righteousness, and reconciliation. All of these words describe God's action not our actions. God justifies, freely by grace because of Christ through faith. Here grace is not conceived as some sort of infused power which enables me to do God's pleasing work and thus be acceptable. It is not the substance that is given out by the church through the sacraments, and which also may be withheld by the church; for grace is an attitude within God. Grace is His disposition of benevolence, of kindness towards sinners. It is the favor of God.

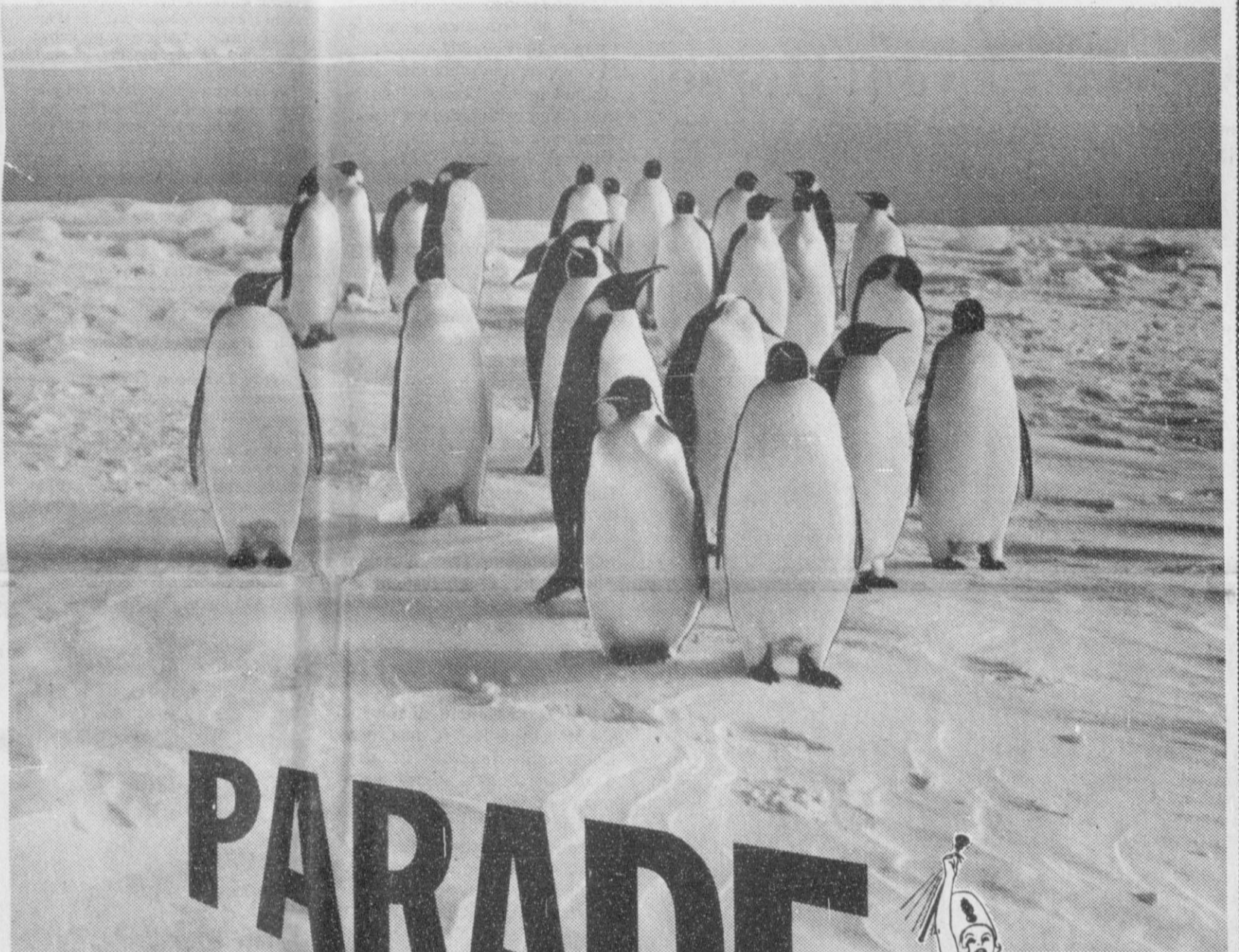

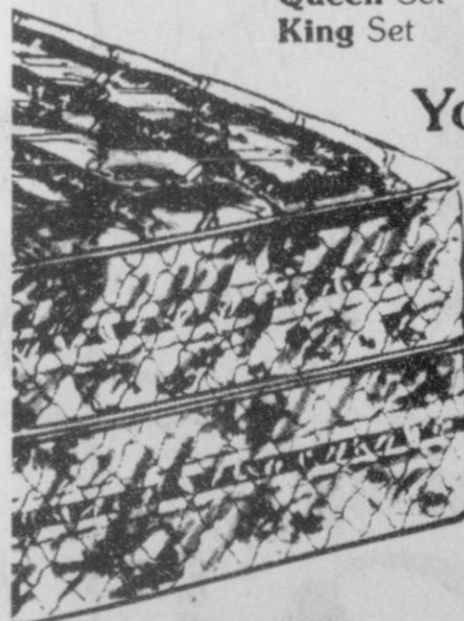

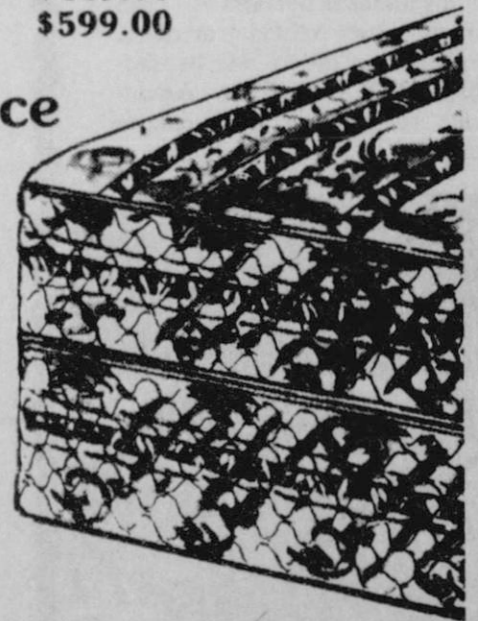
