The new maps, showing the...
route of the Lee Highway, will...
incorporate a new designation...
through Western Oklahoma and...
the eastern Panhandle, according...
to a representative of the Okla...
homa Highway Commission who...

stated to Secretary J. W. Deben...
port that the routing of the Lee...
Highway had been turned over...
to the Federal Bureau of Public...
Roads, as it will in time, become...

The federal bureau of public...
roads has designated the Lee...
Highway to pass from Lawton...
to Altus to Childress to...
Plainview to Fannell to Clovis...
The highway formerly was des...
ignated to pass from Lawton by...
way of Vernon, thence west...
through Paducah. The Oklahoma...
highway official stated that the...
building and maintenance of the...
Lee Highway will be taken over...
by the government in line with...
its policy of connecting all its...
important military centers by...
nationally maintained highways...
to meet possible military neces...
sity. The Lee Highway will...
come to mean to the south as a...
transcontinental highway what...
the Lincoln Highway means to...
the north.

portant highway through Childress...

Grasshoppers Coming

Grasshoppers have begun to...
appear in large numbers in...
some sections of the county ac...
cording to a number of farmers...
Quite a few surrounding counties...
have been reporting the hatch...
ing of grasshoppers for some...
time but it needed the recent...
rains to bring them out in large...
quantities. From now on they...
may be found in those places...
where the hoppers were noticed...
congregating last fall and we...
may expect them in larger num...
bers this year than ever before.

Years of experience have...
shown that grasshoppers can be...
controlled and killed out by pro...
per use of the poisoned bran...
mixture. White arsenic mixed...
with black strap molasses, bran...
and a flavoring extract to at...
tract the hoppers when sown...
broadcast will kill them out. It...
is not recommended that poison...
be put out for two or three...
weeks yet as the hoppers do not...
travel much until they are...
several weeks old and then time...
should be allowed for practically...
all of them to hatch. The Cham...
ber of Commerce is arranging to...
get the ingredients for this...
poison mixture so that a suppl...
will be on hand and that it may...
be distributed at the lowest cost...
possible. Directions for mixing...
the proper proportions to use...
and the method of distribution...
may be obtained from this Office...

ORDINANCE

An ordinance entitled an ordinance prohibiting chickens and other fowls from running at large within the corporate limits of the City of Matador prescribing a penalty for the violation thereof and declaring an emergency. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MATA-DOR.

That hereafter it shall be unlawful for the owner or custodians of any chicken or chickens of other fowls of any description to permit or allow them to run at large within the corporate limits of the city of Matador.

Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction in any court of competent jurisdiction shall be fined in any sum not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$100.00 and each day that such fowls as are enumerated above shall be permitted to run at large in violation of this ordinance shall be deemed to be a separate offence.

The fact that there is no ordinance prohibiting fowls from depre-dating upon the flowers, garden and yards of the property owners within the city of Matador creates an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the constitutional rule to be read on three several days be suspended and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force on and after its passage and publication and said rule is hereby suspended and so it is enacted. Passed the 4th day of May 1925.

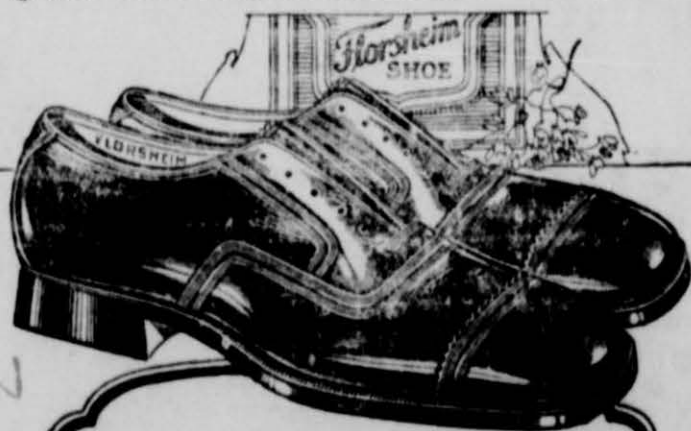

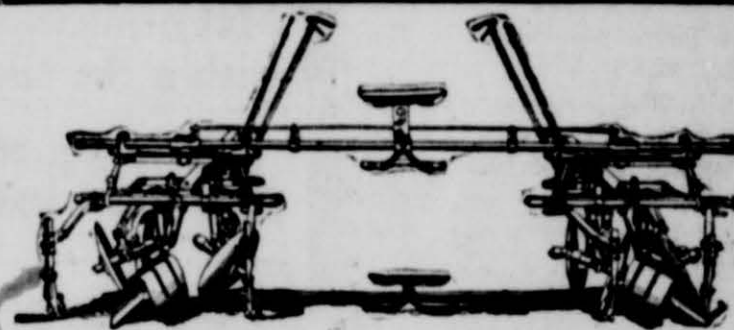
