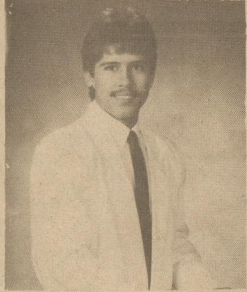

Placing in the finals were both, the 400 and the 800 Relays each with second place. These relays are made of Leigh Barton, Kathy Mangram, Yulanda Campbell, and Kammia Pitts. Joely Ewing placed first in the discus and Natalie Burkes placed fifth. Joely also placed third in the shot put. Kathy Mangram won first in the long jump and Yulanda Campbell placed second. Kathy Mangram also placed second in the triple jump and Yulanda Campbell finished with fifth place. Brandi Barton finished second in the high jump and Leigh Barton placed third. Kammia Pitts placed second in the 100 meter dash and Amy Stephens finished fifth. In the 200 meter dash Kathy Mangram placed second and Yulanda Campbell had third place. Amy Stephens finished fourth and Chandra Brown came in fifth in the 100 meter hurdles.

The Motley County Lady Matadors participated in a meet last Friday in Aspermont. The team as a whole received the first place trophy at the meet. The 400m relay won first place and the 800m relay placed second. Joely Ewing won first place in the discus and third in the shot put. Kammia Pitts placed first in the 100m dash and Kathy Mangram placed first in the 200m dash. Yulanda Campbell came in fifth in the 200m dash. In the high jump Brandi Barton placed second and Leigh Barton placed third. Amy Stephens placed sixth in the long jump and Chandra Brown placed seventh. They will be participating this Friday in the District Meet which will be held either here or in Plainview. If the new track is finished it will be held here. If not it will be in Plainview.

tance contract would only cost \$350 a year. The Court discussed this issue with the County Clerk and elected to purchase the new copier.

Darla Gwinn, representing the Motley County Library Board had a request for an Assistant Librarian to be hired. Jimmy Hunter, Librarian has asked that due to health reasons she needed to cut her hours from thirty to twenty. Gwinn stated that the Board had talked to Wilda Dixon and she was willing to be Assistant Librarian for twenty hours a week and do the bookkeeping during that time and be paid for the twenty hours only. Gwinn stated Dixon had creditation for this position. The Court elected to amend the budget for this request.

The Court opened bids on fuel for the county at this time from Cooper Oil Co. for the sale of Regular gas-\$93.9, Diesel-\$71 subject to change as fuel cost changed. Davis Fuel for the sale of Regular-\$99.31, Diesel-\$73, subject to change with fuel cost and that the county furnish own storage tanks.

After lengthy discussion the lowest bid was accepted from Cooper Oil.

The reports were read by the court, with the J. P. collecting \$4,293.00 in fines for March.

The commissioners elected to ask for bids on three tractors

The County Agent asked for extra storage room and also informed the court that he would need a computer hookup in his office in the near future. The Court asked him if he would be interested in moving to the office space previously occupied by the SCS Office, as this office is already wired for a computer and has more storage space. The Agent agreed to this move, as soon as the elevator work is complete.

The Court read the report from the Texas State Bridge Inspector on the recent inspection. Russell informed the Court that the bridge replacement in his precinct cost approximately \$10,000.

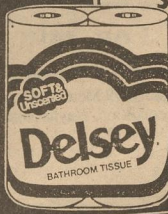
