For a School at Spearman

An enthusiastic meeting of the Hansford County Chamber of Commerce was held in the Reporter office at Spearman Monday night, and the matter of a school for Spearman was the principal subject for discussion. The meeting was well attended and everyone was enthusiastic and thoroughly alive to the importance of keeping the agitation for a first class school at Spearman going until we can announce to every one that we have school facilities second to none. It is the intention of the citizens of Spearman and vicinity to build a school here, and to start the work at once. After a thorough discussion of the mode of procedure, it was decided that it would be impossible to build a suitable school building with the funds derived from taxation and that the only thing to do was to raise the money by subscription. A committee composed of Messrs. B. V. Andrews, P. M. Maize and A. E. Townsend was appointed to make an estimate of the cost of a suitable building, the cost of equipping same and employing teachers for the 1920-21 term. This committee will report at the next meeting, which will be held at the Reporter office Monday night, March 22. After this report is made a finance committee will doubtless be appointed to raise the necessary amount. At any rate, regardless of the expense, we will have a school. The demand for a school is so great that we cannot afford to stop this great work. Many suggestions were made as how best to finance this project, among which was one by L. C. Meek, which the Reporter believes to be a good one. It is to organize a school association, sell stock in same, erect a \$20,000 or \$30,000 building and rent the same to the school board until such time as the district could purchase the same, or sell the same on the rental plan to the Spearman Independent School District. The committee appointed to the task will adopt the plan that seems to it most practicable, and it remains for every man, woman and child in the country to get behind the move for a school at Spearman and boost it through to a successful finish. The idea seems to prevail generally that we must have the very best school; where all grades will be taught from kindergarten to the completion of high school work, and that our school must be affiliated with the state schools. Hansford county people do not do things by halves. They never faltered when huge sums of money were to be raised during the war and they will not falter now. Let Andrews, Maize and Townsend bring on their report—the people will do the rest. We must have a school.

L. T. says this country certainly looks good to him and that he is figuring on buying more land here.

Strong Appeal for a School

I have read with considerable interest the various articles recently published in The Spearman Reporter with reference to the construction of a mammoth church building, to cost anywhere from \$25,000 to \$30,000, and the securing of a popular preacher to preach on popular subjects, to a popular audience which the editor seems to think would comprise the entire population of the community, regardless of creed.

Without going into the discussion of such a movement, permit me to say: That it appears to me as an idle dream, and if successful in erecting such a building, it would only prove to be a colossal monument of disdirected enthusiasm.

Let me suggest that for the present, at least, we leave the church problem to be solved a little later and turn our attention to making some sort of preparation for a public school building in Spearman. The education of our children and youth lies at the very foundation of good citizenship. The sudden springing into existence of the town of Spearman with its rapidly increasing population, makes it necessary that steps be taken at once to provide adequate school facilities. The school laws are such that it is impossible to organize an independent school district and get the necessary bonds voted and a building erected in time for the coming school year. We cannot afford to let another school year pass without some provision for a good school in Spearman.

Why not make a special effort to raise a fund sufficient to build and equip a school house? This seems to me to be the most practical thing to do and would do more toward building up the town than any other one thing that could be taken up. The one question asked by every person contemplating locating in Spearman is "What is being done toward establishing a good school?" A great many citizens of Hansford and adjoining counties, who are now sending their young folks away to school, say: That if they can be assured there will be a good high school at Spearman next year, they will make arrangements at once to patronize the home school. Many of these people will build a home and locate in Spearman while others will arrange to board their young folks during the school week and have them at home over Saturday and Sunday. As a business proposition, can we afford to let this opportunity pass, of keeping these families in the county and furnishing educational advantages for our young people?

I do not wish to be understood that I am opposed to churches. I am not. On the contrary, I want to see every possible effort put forth to develop the spiritual as well as the intellectual faculties of our children and am ready to do all I can to aid in building and supporting a church or churches to meet these needs. But it does seem to me that it is imperative that some provision be made at once for a first class high school. The only way this can be done, as I see it, is to go down in our pockets and dig up the money.

Let me suggest, Mr. Editor, that if the parties whom you suggest, are ready to subscribe \$1,000 toward building a "federal church," which is purely an experiment, will switch their liberal subscriptions toward building and equipping a first class high school, we will have the educational problem settled and Spearman citizens will soon realize their investment is not experimental, but one of permanency, necessity and profit. Who will be first to start the list with \$1,000?

You are hereby commanded to summon T. W. Henderson by making publication of this citation once in each week for four successive weeks previous to the return day hereof, in some newspaper published in your county, if there be a newspaper published therein, but if not, then in any newspaper published in the Thirty-first Judicial District; but if there be no newspaper published in said Judicial District, then in a newspaper published in the nearest district to said Thirty-first Judicial District, to appear at the next regular term of the District Court of Hansford County, to be holden at the court house thereof, in Hansford, on the third Monday in April, A. D. 1920, the same being the 19th day of April, A. D. 1920, then and there to answer a petition filed in said court on the 13th day of March, A. D. 1920, in a suit, numbered on the docket of said court No. 204, wherein The First National Bank of Spearman, plaintiff, and T. W. Henderson, defendant, and said petition alleging suit upon three promissory notes, dated on June 7, 1919, being notes No. B1152, B1153, B1154, each for the sum of \$3,000.00, \$1,426.00 and \$2,500.00, respectively. Each payable to E. J. Thayer at the First National Bank, Hansford, Texas, 90 days from date, with interest from maturity at the rate of 10 per cent per annum, each note providing for the usual 10 per cent attorney fees and signed by T. W. 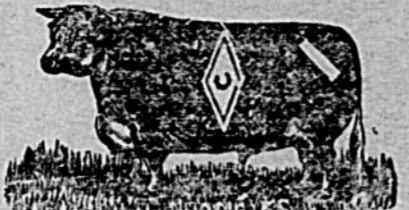

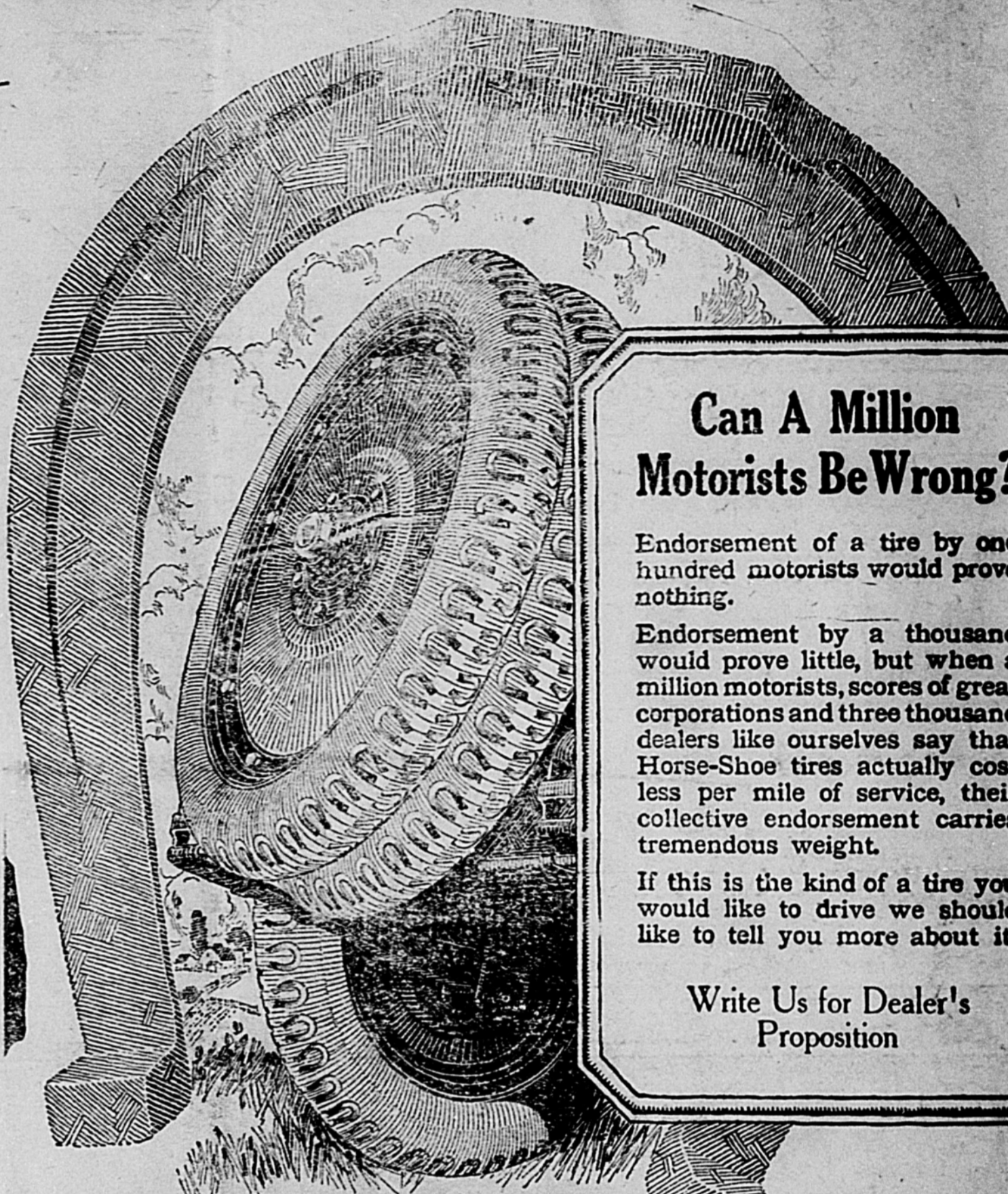

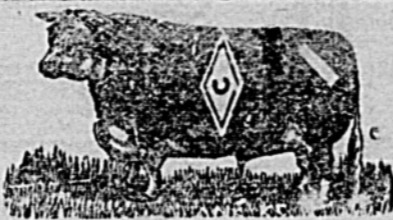
