First Shipment of Cattle

Fourteen cars of cows and calves were loaded at the Spearman stock pens today, for the Kansas City market. The cattle belong to Bud Bennett and were brought from the Steele ranch on the Palo Duro. This was the first shipment of livestock from this point. The railway company is putting in big stock yards here and Spearman will be the popular shipping point of the ranchmen along the Coldwater, Palo Duro and Canadian.

Busy at the Coble-Heywood

L. W. Beechtel, field superintendent, and J. Sid O'Donnell, connected with the fiscal department of the Coble-Heywood Oil Syndicate, were in Spearman Wednesday looking after business matters connected with the drilling of the test well in the Turkey Track pasture, 19 miles south of Spearman. These gentlemen were jubilant over the prospects of drilling soon to begin. Mr. Beechtel informs us that the 84-foot standard derrick is completed and ready for the tools to be installed. The tools were shipped from Goldthwaite, Texas, and are expected to arrive in Spearman within the next few days. A splendid graded road was built by the Coble-Heywood people through the rough country between Spearman and the well in order that no difficulties may be experienced in hauling out the heavy machinery. Mr. Beechtel says this is the best road in either Hansford or Hutchinson counties. While they are waiting for the tools to arrive the crew is busy laying a pipe line from Bent creek to the well, which will furnish them a water supply. They have also dug a ditch from the cellar under the rig, through which the drillers may escape in case an exceptionally strong flow of gas is struck and it should catch on fire. This is merely a get-away place for the drillers and was decided on at a recent conference of W. Scott Hey-

Grandpa Maize Dead

George W. Maize, a Hansford county pioneer, died at the home of his sons Finis and Ben Maize, three miles south of Spearman, on Wednesday, December 17, 1919, at 10 o'clock a. m. Grandpa Maize was 70 years old at the time of his death. He leaves four sons, P. M., Finis, Ben and Elmo, all of whom were with him when the end came. The Maize brothers are well known all over this section and are highly respected citizens. Grandpa Maize had been a citizen of this county for the past twenty years and has always born the reputation of being a fine, christian gentleman. His health has been failing for several months and death was not unexpected. He was buried in the Hansford cemetery Thursday morning at 10 o'clock, the funeral services being conducted by Rev. S. Walsh Franklin of Texhoma.

High Class Cattle

Jesse Engle & Sons, Sheridan, Mo., topped the American Royal Hereford sale at Kansas City, Mo., on November 21, for both bulls and heifers, with their Beau Blanchard's. Belle Blanchard 63d topped the females at \$5250 and Beau Blanchard 88th topped the bulls at \$3100. Their three head averaged about \$4000 each. The bull calf, Beau Blanchard 88th, selling at 14 months old for \$3100, is a full brother to Beau Blanchard 33d, that was purchased from Engle & Son two years ago by Pronger Bros. of Stratford for \$2950 and also a full brother to Beau Blanchard 5th, sold to A. Christensen, Eagle, Colorado, for \$2600, and Beau Blanchard 77th, sold to J. E. Summers & Son, Gilliam, Mo., for \$3000, all four being sired by Beau Blanchard, and out of a cow by "Old" Domino. Mr. Engle remarked at the time of sale, that Beau Blanchard 33d looked more like Domino at his age than any bull he had ever seen. Pronger Bros. now have some very choice calves of both sexes from Beau Blanchard 33d, about 12 months old and out of Pronger Rupert and son 12th, dams. Spearman's Future

Anyone who is at all familiar with conditions and the general history of the Spearman country will tell you that Spearman will make one of the very best towns in the north Panhandle, or the entire southwest. Why?

Spearman has a trade territory extending 90 miles east and west and sixty miles north and south. This immense territory is populated by a high class citizenship, which is engaged in one of the surest and most profitable industries known to man—stock-farming. The people of the Spearman trade territory are the most prosperous in the United States, taken as a whole. There is not a man living between the Frisco and the Canadian who is not making good money if he is making the proper effort, and we have fewer drows and naer-de-salla here than in any country on earth.

We have just harvested and threshed and are now marketing one of the very largest wheat crops the country ever produced, and all other crops were equally as good. The present season in the ground almost insures another bumper crop. Even if the next five years are just moderate crop years—we never have a total failure—we have enough in sight to insure happiness and prosperity during that time.

Our natural resources, oil, gas, etc., have not been touched. They are just as they were when the Lord created them. Down on Dixon creek in Tom Coble's pasture, natural gas is bubbling up through the water; can be caught in a vessel and will burn. It has been given a thorough test and found to be of a superior quality. The Coble Heywood Oil Company is putting down a test well near this place, which is 18 miles south of Spearman, and geologists tell us that they have every indication imaginable of striking oil in great quantities. Over on the Coldwater, 25 miles north of Spearman, a rig is up, tools in readiness and everything in shape to begin putting down another test well. They have the same assurance of making a strike as have the Coble-Heywood people. The machinery is being unloaded in Spearman this week for drilling the third well in the Spearman territory, but we are not at liberty to say more of this venture at this time. A company of local land owners are making preparations to begin putting down test wells in the Palo Duro valley during the coming summer. Should oil be found by any or all of these pioneer drillers, Spearman is the logical location for their refineries.

The house will be 24x56 feet and will have 24 rooms. This is one of Spearman's greatest needs at the present time, and it is to be hoped that the building will be put up in a hurry. Visitors to Spearman can find no place to sleep and are obliged to leave in time to reach another town before night. We have three good restaurants, but the average layman wants a warm place to sleep these cold nights. The Wilbanks rooming house is greatly needed and its completion will be heralded with glad tidings of great joy.

Everything about the Coble Heywood equipment is first class and modern in every respect. The rig is one of the best that can be built, they are using heavy 6-inch rig irons, the tools are first-class and the drillers claim they can go down 4,000 feet without any difficulty. The machinery will be enclosed in order that the work may not be delayed by bad weather. Mr. Beechtel says he hopes to spud in within thirty days, tho this depends largely on the weather.

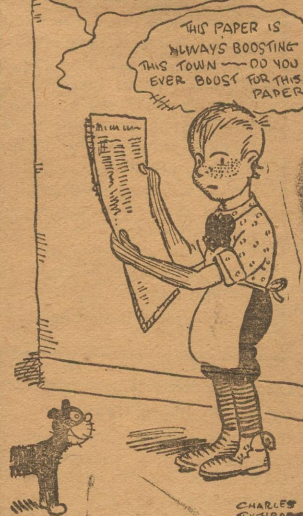

How It Comes That Political Bosses Control Public School Systems

By JACOB M. LOEB, Chicago Board of Education

To build political systems' fortunes upon the school system is trafficking in children's souls.

During more than five years of service as school trustee one sees much of school boards, something of the public, and very little if any co-operation between the two.

To appoint as school trustees men and women unknown and untried is taking a gambler's chance. To commit the administration of a vast business enterprise to those without experience or training is poor judgment. To confer upon hucksters the responsibility of preparing budgets, of expending millions, or negotiating leases, of making real estate transfers, is signal improvidence.

The public is divided into three classes: The educated, who keep aloof from public questions; the class that can think but won't, and, thirdly, the class that cannot think for itself and accepts the ready-made judgment of others. The latter class is led by various types---the parlor propagandist, the agitator and the political type and the boss type, more dangerous and controlling than the others.

So we have a public a part of which is thoughtful but inactive, a part unthinking and directed by vicious leadership.

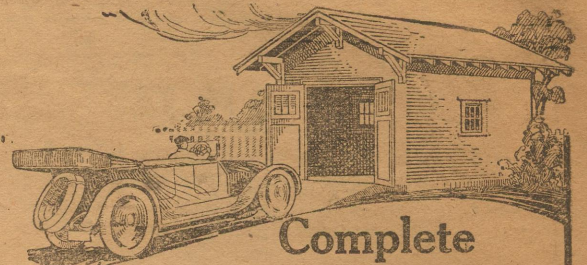

Now that he is out of it I want him to forget military channels and tell his troubles directly to me. The red chevron on the discharged service man's sleeve does not mean that the army is through with him. There are more than enough jobs to go around. The problem is to get the jobs and the men together.

These men have just come back from participation in the greatest experience that will occur in your lifetime or mine. They are veterans, trained by hardship, discipline and loyalty to high ideals to take their place as more useful and more valuable citizens of America than they ever were before.

They need work, but the work needs them just as much.

What we intend to do is to act as a helpful point of contact among all the organizations in the United States which are so splendidly endeavoring to put our returned soldiers into jobs fitted for their abilities and training.


