Panhandle Short Line.

A special from Hereford, Texas, to the Dallas News, reads: That the Panhandle Short Line railroad is now sure to be built is the announcement made by W. A. Squires, president of the Northwest and Oklahoma Construction Company, who has received word from A. D. Goodenough, general manager of the St. Louis, Springfield and Oklahoma Western railroad, at Sulphur, Okla., that the contract for the road had been let to the Cullen Construction Company, of Newark, N. J., and that Samuel H. Wandell, who accompanied Mr. Cullen, has formed a syndicate to take the bonds of the company on the whole line.

Construction will begin Feb. 1 1908, from Lawton to Salisaw, Okla., a distance of 250 miles.

Mr. Cullen will return to Newark, N. J., and Mr. Wandell to New York. On January 15 or 20 next Mr. Cullen will return with a party to go over the line from Hereford to Stanton, to San Angelo and into San Antonio, and should the inspection show up as expected, the contract will be let, it is announced, for the whole line into San Antonio. A syndicate is already formed to take the bonds on 480 miles, the distance from Hereford to San Antonio, via San Angelo.

Maj. Squires and Col. Ransom are in high spirits and feel confident that they have scored a success in the building of the line.

FROM ALL OVER TEXAS

Albert Montgomery, aged twelve years, was accidentally shot while hunting near Elkhart.

Neches, Anderson County, was visited by a fire on Christmas Eve, and several houses were burned.

Ex-Governor Lanham is quite ill, having had a nervous collapse a few days ago as a result of the grip contracted last spring.

The Queen City Furniture Company's plant at Shreveport, burned Friday, entailing a loss of \$110,000; it was insured for \$75,000.

Mrs. W. N. Humes, of Tarrant, a station on the Rock Island in Tarrant County, gave birth to healthy, well-developed triplets last week.

The West Texas Bank and Trust Company of San Antonio now has things shaped up to open early in January—not later than the 5th.

John Cope, a young man about twenty-two years old, was stabbed and died Thursday night while en route to a dance, about three miles north of Grand Saline.

Y. Streetman of Roanoke was run over and had both legs crushed by a freight train Friday morning. They were amputated by physicians, and he died twenty minutes later.

The lumber yards near the court house at Waco, the property of the Owent Lumber Company, partly burned Friday night, the loss being about \$40,000, with \$32,000 insurance.

The depot at Phelps, Waller County, burned Wednesday night. Nothing was saved but the stoves. Sanford Sloan was hurt by one of the safes falling on his leg while getting it out.

An accidental killing is reported from the northern part of McLennan County, near Aquilla. Two boys, Arthur Keene and Jim Rodgers, were out hunting, when Keene was accidentally shot by Rogers and killed.

A male child about a year old and well dressed, was deserted at the Union Depot in Denton Thursday night. The police have taken charge of the child. Telegrams were sent out to apprehend the mother.

Misses Lucile Cauthen and Florence Wolf, two young ladies of Lampasas, enjoyed the novel experience of killing a fine big buck with six prongs last week on a visit to Mr. and Mrs. Jess McDonald at their ranch in Burnet County.

Fritz Hartwig, a Deputy Sheriff of Marion, Guadalupe County, lies in a bad condition in San Antonio at the Santa Rosa Hospital. He was out hunting on the Cibola with a party of friends and was accidentally shot in the left arm, tearing it from the shoulder.

Last Thursday morning while J. M. Brammer, a well-to-do farmer living three miles west of Rhame, was out getting some wood to start a fire, his wife administered a fatal dose of carbolic acid to the baby and took a dose herself that ended her life in thirty minutes.

The Hlec Ice & Cold Storage Company, that was organized and chartered a few months ago, has now begun the erection of the plant, and as a good portion of the machinery is now on the ground it will not be long until the plant will be in operation.

The executive committee of the Texas Local Option Association and some of the field workers of that organization held a conference in Dallas last Thursday, and it is predicted that a State campaign is about to be opened.

Ed Ross, a negro, was shot twice, once in the head and one in the body, and instantly killed in that quarter of Texarkana known as the Sand Flats Wednesday night. Arthur S. Herrington, a druggist, surrendered to the officers.

Theodore Pauluck, a Bohemian track man on the Brown Valley, was run over and fatally injured by a hand car Wednesday. He died from his injuries Friday. The incident happened at Deceola.

The jury in the case against Dr. J. J. Lockhart, transferred from Neches, Cocho County, for the killing of Ollie Brack, returned a verdict of guilty of murder in the second degree and gave him sixteen years in the penitentiary.

W. H. Perkins, a well-to-do farmer who lived across the river from Upton, was struck by a northbound Katy passenger train some time Thursday night about five miles north of Marshall, and instantly killed.

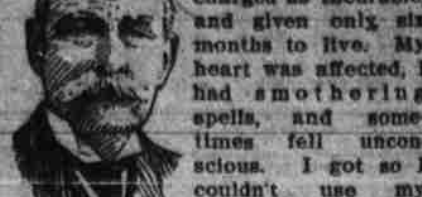

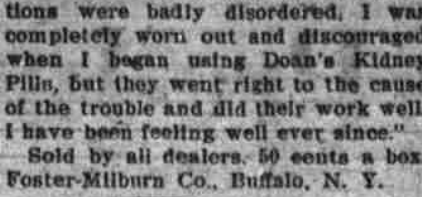

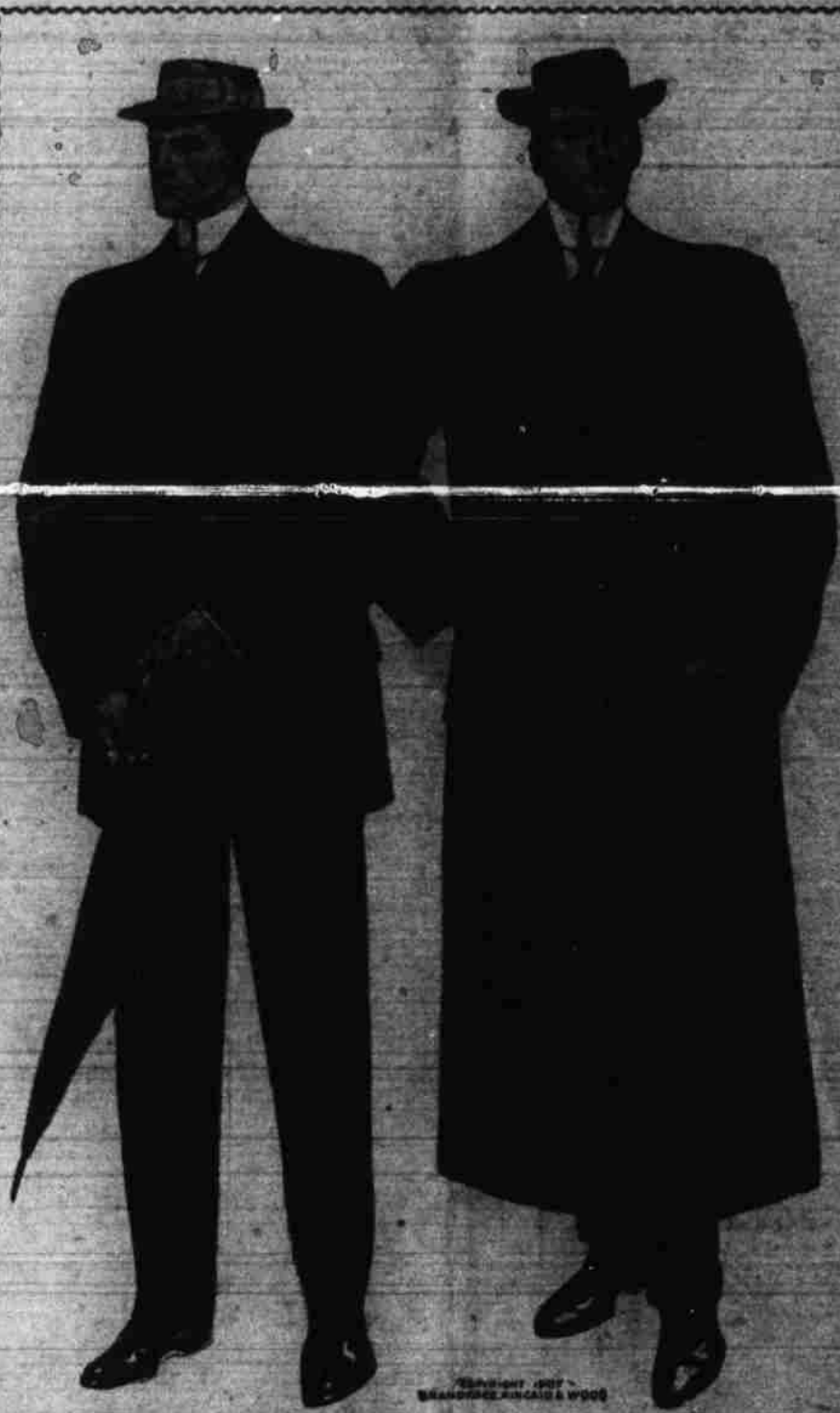
