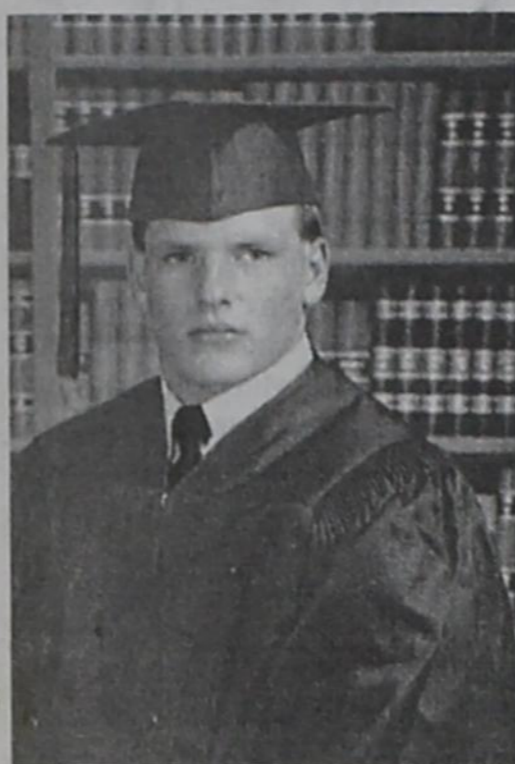
She played basketball her freshman, sophomore and junior years. Ran track her freshman and sophomore years, and Cross Country her freshman and sophomore years.

The score stayed 3-0 until the Panthers erupted for six more runs in the top of the third inning. Donald Majors opened the inning with a single and then stole second. He moved to third on an error and scored on another wild pitch. Then Nick Guthery and Kris Carlton singled and both scored on a two run double by Adon Rodriguez. Jason Johnson followed with a single to score Rodriguez and then scored himself on a triple by Don Mauney. Ronald Majors provided the final run of the inning when he walked, stole second and third and scored on another error by the catcher. After the third inning the Panthers led 9-0. In the fourth inning the Panthers scored three more runs on four hits. Carlton opened with a single and moved to second on a single by Johnson. Postal Reclassify Attack On Small Business

The American Small Business Association today charged the Postal Service reclassification plan is a "bunch of smoke and mirrors" that would result in a shift of millions of dollars in mailing costs from the largest advertising and magazine mailers to small businesses.

The reclassification plan was filed today with the Postal Rate Commission. It would change the way mail is categorized and change the current rate structure.

Vernon Castle, executive director of the association, which is a member of the Coalition to Make Our First Class Mial FIRST CLASS, denounced the plan after Postmaster General Marvin Runyon unveiled it on a nationwide satellite hook-up.

"This plan invites advertising mailers to stuff your box with even more unwanted mail, while squeezing out local businesses who may find it too costly to communicate with customers," said Castle whose organization represents 150,000 small businesses nationwide.

First class mail is monopoly and the Postal Service forces its trapped customers to pay more than their fair share of overhead costs," Castle said. "While first class mail is only about half the post office volume, it covers almost 70% of the overhead."

"By toughening bulk mail standards and adding bar code requirements, the reclassification plan will force many small businesses into the highest mailing rates."

Castle called on the independent Postal Rate Commission (PRC) to take a hard look at the pain and make sue it is equitable for all mail users, especially those forced to use first class.

CFSA Designates Nine Counties As Disaster Areas

In response to a request from Gov. George Bush, the Consolidated Farm Service Agency (CFSA) has designated Callahan County as a disaster area and has identified eight contiguous disaster counties.

The governor's request came on the heels of damages and losses caused by tornadoes, excessive rain and hail which occurred on May 29, 1994.

The contiguous counties are Brown, Coleman, Eastland, Jones, Kinney, Shackelford, Taylor and Zavala.

The designation allows family farmers in both primary and contiguous counties to qualify for CFSA low-interest emergency loans for damages and losses caused by the severe weather. CFSA county offices can provide affected farmers with further information and assist them in completing applications for assistance.
