

Zetta Marie Gowan Battenfield Laid To Rest Monday


Marie Zetta Gowan Battenfield, 89, died Friday in a De Leon nursing home.







Stenholm Introduces Rule **To Improve AtoZ**

JUNE 23, 1994

Washington, D.C. - Congressman Charles Stenholm on May 27th introduced the A Plus Spending Cut Process, an improved version of a rule to discharge the A-to-Z spending cut bill from committee and bring it before the full House of Representatives for consideration.

"As a co-sponsor and strong supporter of the A-to-Z legislation, I am concerned that the current rule for the discharge petition does not lay out the process for a logical and top-to-bottom review of the budget, which I believe we should have,' said Stenholm in introducing his plan. "The A Plus Spending Cut Process, or Real A-to-Z, will guarantee a full examination of the budget, and enable us to make informed

decisions about cutting spending." Real A-to-Z differs from the original rule in several respects:

1) Real A-to-Z examines the entire budget function by function.

2) The ability to offer a range of amendments and the possibility of debate are not denied under Real a-to-Z.


3) Real A-to-Z requires amendments be submitted 5 days before debate, instead of only 24 hours, therefore, allowing time for public review and comment.


4) The Congressional Budget Office (CBO) is required to do an objective estimate of savings under Real A-to-Z.

5) Procedural amendments and motions, wheih can prevent straight up-or-down votes, would be prohibited under Real A-to-Z.

"With our introduction of the A-to-Z Spending Cut Process, my colleagues and I have developed a rule which meets the goals of up-or-down votes on every budgetcutting amendment which is offered, without forcing Members to vote on 100 or 200 amendments which they have not had adequate time to study, and which have not received full public debate," said Stenholm.

"My commitment to the A-to-Z spending cut bill is as strong as ever, and I will work with those who have already signed the discharge petition to ensure that the House of Representtives will carefully consider serious cuts in spending.'




