The Gorman Police Department, in an effort to the rising tide of theft and burglaries, has implemented "Operation Identification", a program designed to serve a two-fold purpose; First to accurately identify stolen items and return them to their rightful owners. Secondly to discourage theft before it occurs.

Funderburg says the program can be accomplished by marking all valuables and personal belongings with owner's Texas Drivers license number, using an electric engraving pencil. He stated "research has proven that burglars are reluctant to steal any item that can be easily identified, so this program will serve as a deterrent to theft. And in the event that items are stolen or lost, the identification number engraved on them will allow prompt identification and return of the items, even if they are recovered in another state."

Funderberg states that, "an engraving pencil will be available at the Police Department at City Hall in Gorman and will be loaned to persons who desire to mark their own items of value. You may also bring items to the department and Funderberg will gladly mark the items for you. For persons who do not have Texas drivers license for identification, the department will issue a special identification number which will be entered on the police files.

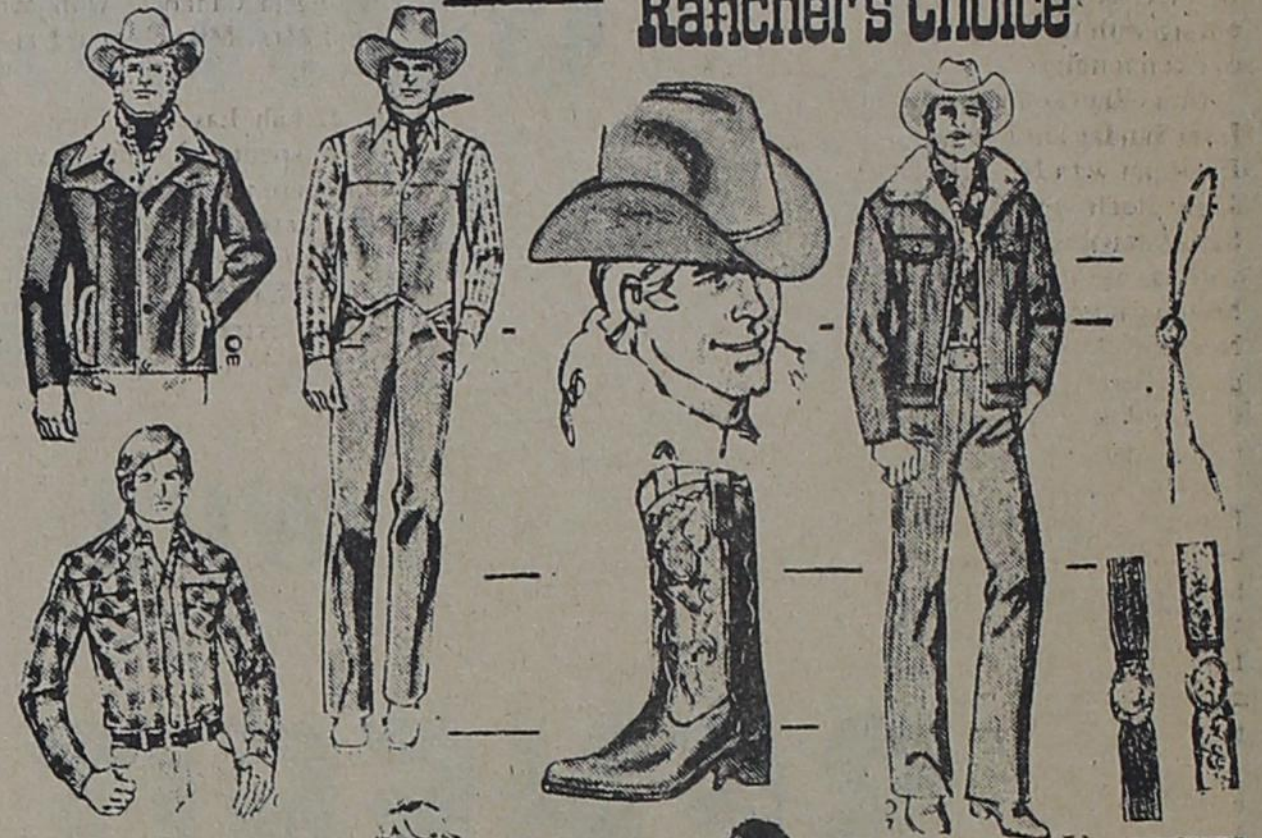

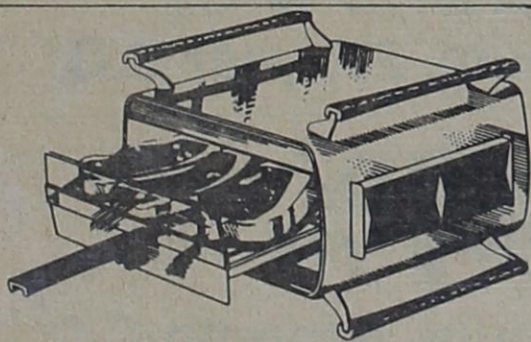

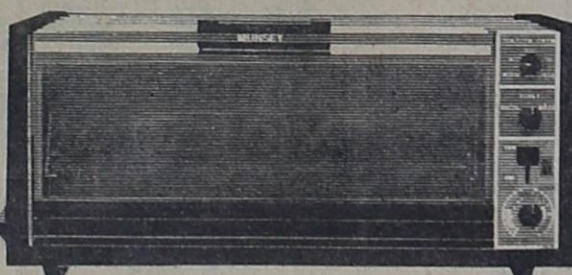
