 Honored On Birthday**



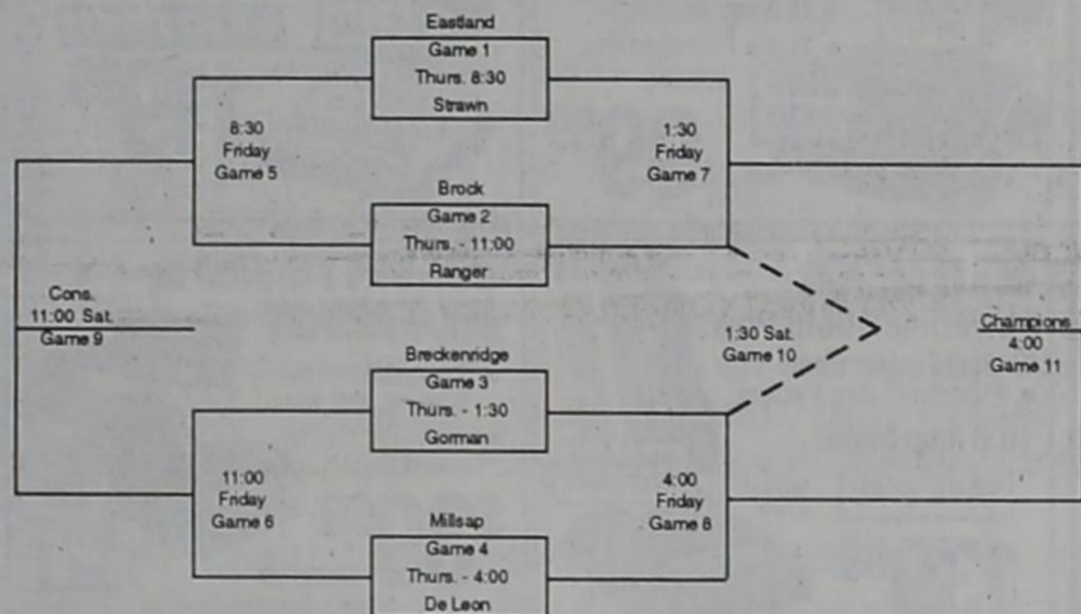

The money from the sale of the annuals goes back into the annual fund. Due to increasing costs and low number of ads purchased this year, the annual staff is having trouble making ends meet.

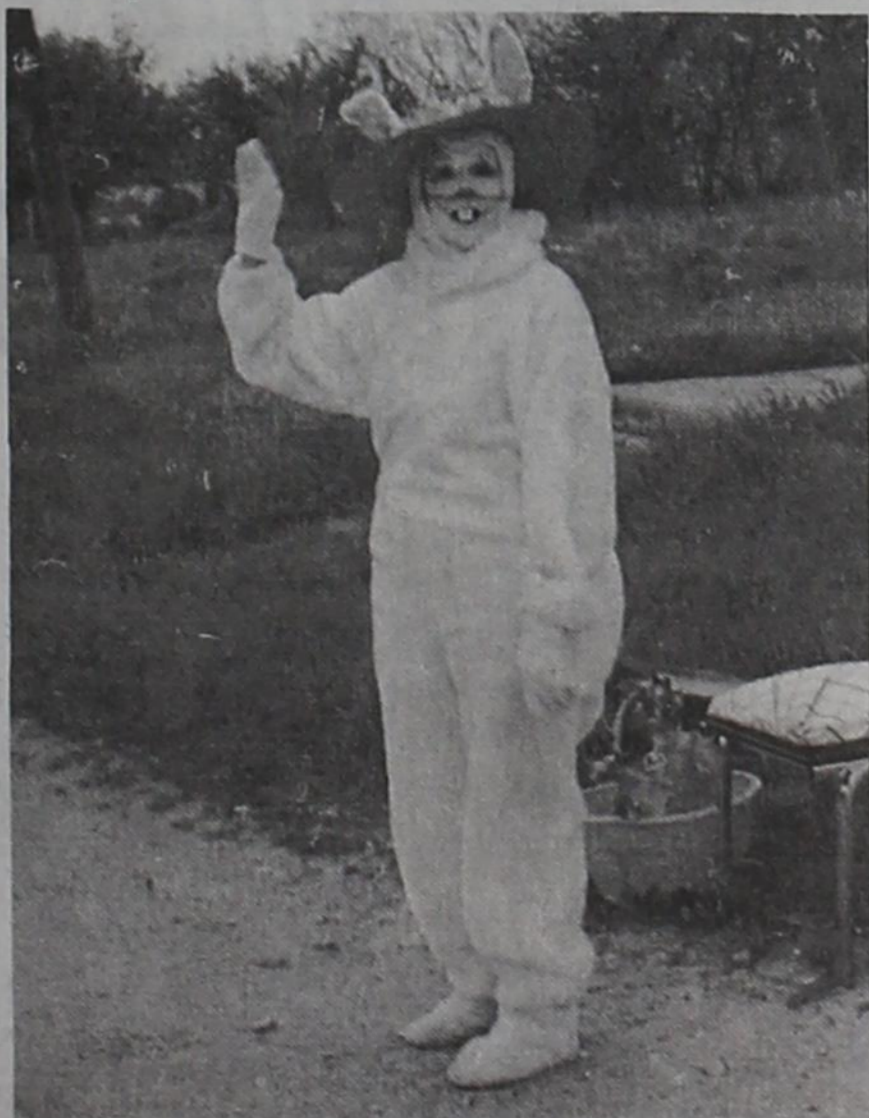

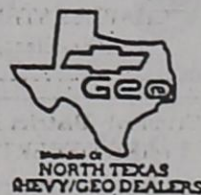
