W. S. S.— Black Ribbon With White Edge Is German Sign.

"Watch with suspicion for black ribbons with narrow white edges for watch fobs, lockets or other similar articles of jewelry," is the warning issued by the Bureau of Jewelry Fashions, New York, in a recent bulletin. 'The Iron Cross is always hung on a ribbon of this kind," the bulletin says, "and to anyone in & France or England, the wearing of this ribbon with watch, lorgnette, locket, etc., signifies German sympathy. This fact has just been called to the attention of New Yorkers and every effort is being made to give it publicity.

The Bureau of Jewelry Fashions bulletin says "a black ribbon with a narrow white edge & is significant of German propaganda.


