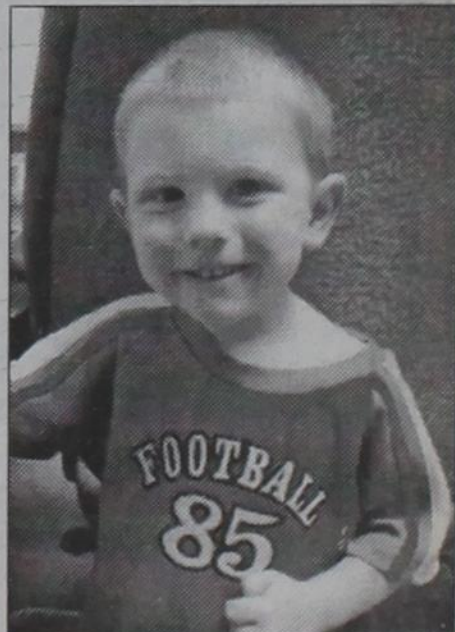

Suggestions From Parkview On Preventing The Spread Of Flu

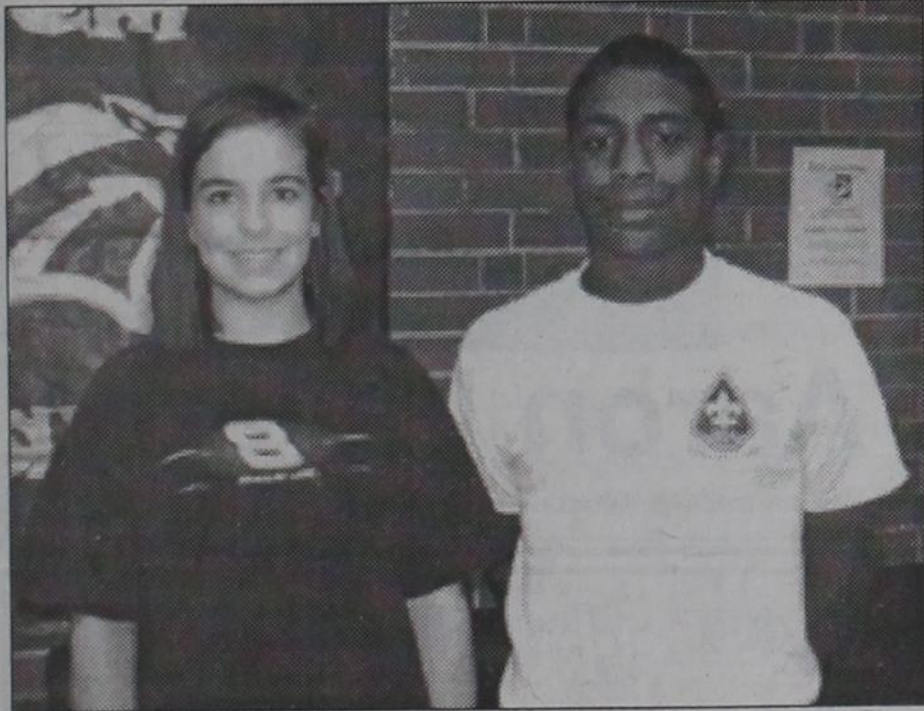
The flu season is approaching and we at Parkview Hospital would like to share some information that may help to prevent the spread of that nasty old bug around our community.

Influenza is primarily spread from person to person by virus laden droplets that are generated when infected persons cough or sneeze. It can also be picked up when a person touches a surface that has been contaminated.

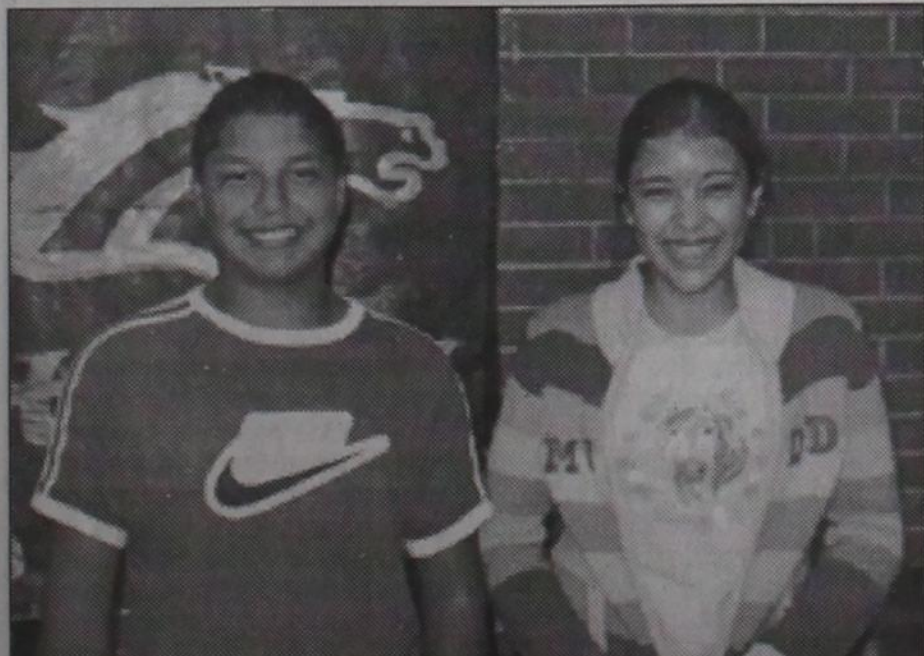
The single best way to protect against the flu is to get vaccinated each fall. Parkview Hospital will be offering flu and pneumonia shots this year, just as we have in the past. The dates for our Flu Clinic will soon be posted in the paper and on cable T.V., so be sure and watch for those notices. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the flu season can begin as early as October and last as late as May. While the flu shot can be given later, those who have it early in the season have the most protection. Other suggestions from the CDC include:

Avoid close contact with people who are sick. When you are sick, keep your distance from others to protect them from getting sick, too.

If possible, stay home from work, school and errands when you are sick. You will help to keep (Continued Page 8)

others from catching your illness. Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing and dispose of the tissue promptly. If no tissue is available, use your upper sleeve instead of your hands to cover your cough or sneeze. This is especially advised if you have no available means of cleaning your hands.

Washing your hands often or using an alcohol-based hand cleaner will help stop the spread of germs. Washing with soap and water for at least 20 seconds is advised. If you are teaching children about good hand washing technique, tell them to sing the "Happy Birthday" song through twice each time they wash their hands.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs are often spread when someone touches a contaminated surface and then transfers the germs to him/her self in this manner.

For those of you with computers, even more information about the flu can be found at the CDC website.

As the previous information discloses, it is very important for those people who have the flu to stay away from others as much as possible, to avoid spreading it. It is equally important for those who are well to stay away from those who have it, to avoid catching it. For that reason, if you are coughing or sneezing and feel that you may have "something catching" we request that you delay visiting someone in the hospital until you are well. We also request that if you know someone who is hospitalized with the flu or flu-like symptoms, please delay your visit until they are no longer ill. We know that our patients love to have visitors and we, as staff, also appreciate those who come. We know, however, that during flu season it can be for the best if you show your concern in some other way such as a phone call or a card.

If you feel that you must visit someone in the hospital even when you are coughing or sneezing or if you have to come in for tests of some kind, it will be best if you wear a mask to prevent the spread of germs. If you will request one at the nurses station, we will be happy to provide it for you. The good health of everyone in our community is our greatest priority. With shared knowledge and cooperation, we can work together toward that goal.
