As the last warm days of summer swiftly pass, we need to be reminded that "Back to School" means more than shopping for new clothes, searching for the perfect backpack, and attempting to get the kids in bed before midnight. Back to school also means watching out for children, and reminding children of the safety rules they need to know. As adults we

should remember to drive SLOWLY in all school zones and near bus stops. We must remain alert. Children can often dart into the street without looking at traffic. And do you know what the flashing lights on school busses mean? Yellow flashing lights mean the bus is preparing to stop and load or unload children. Red flashing lights and an extended stop arm mean the bus has stopped and children are

Coyotes began season with scrimmage against Dawson Dragons

The Borden County Coyotes began the 1999 football season with a scrimmage against the Dawson Dragons. The scrimmage was in Gail on the practice field. Afterwards, everyone enjoyed ice and various goodies for a Meet the Coyotes Night.

Ed Rodriguez, began the '99 season in grand style as he dashed 60 yards for a TD on the first play of the scrimmage. End, Robert Stamper; guard, Nick Flanigan; and center, Ramon Griffin each blocked down, as fullback, Joseph Hardman supplied

the kick out block and quarterback, Kevin Pinkerton mowed down the safety, to allow Ed to break through their line.

Hardman carried the ball four times for 26 yards, and he caught a pass for a 16-yard gain from quarterback Kevin Pinkerton.

Rodriguez carried the ball 7 times for 104 yards and 2 touchdowns. He also completed a 10-yard pass to Flanigan to keep a drive alive.

Pinkerton carried the ball one time for 8 yards.

The Coyotes varsity offense found the end zone twice in just 15 plays. A third TD attempt was spoiled with a fumble between center and quarterback that ended a drive.

The varsity defense did a great job holding the Dragons to very limited success. The Dragons offense managed just 12 yards against the Coyotes defense in 9 plays.

Highlights of this series includes Rodriguez with a sack, a caused, fumble and Rodriguez and Dale Grant together cause a fumble. Grant starts at cornerback along with Pinkerton. Hardman is the linebacker. Rodriguez and Griffin are the defensive ends, and Robert Stamper is the safety.

Also playing for the varsity squad were John Harding, Tom Griffin, Lee Pepper and Ross Aten.

The JV took the field when the varsity was finished and managed to accumulate 186 yards in only 10 plays.

Freshman T.J. Sharp carried the ball 2 times for 47 yards. Freshman, Raul

Rodriguez carried the ball 3 times for 70 yards. Sophomore T.C. Stipe carried the ball twice for 4 yards and a TD while sophomore Jacob Zant connected with classmate Cody Nowlain for a 60-yard touchdown play.

Freshman quarterback, Brionne Jackson hit sophomore end, Payton Brown for a TD from 5 yards out.

Also playing in the game for the JV was sophomores, James Bond and Rowdy Dunlap and freshman Tanner Poole and Talin Pepper.

boarding or exiting the bus. Do not pass a school bus that is stopped. Not only is that very dangerous, but it is also against the law. And what should we remind our children about? When they are getting off the bus, cross in front of the bus after making eye contact with the driver. They should never walk behind the bus. Also, they should only cross the street at intersections. And if your children ride a bike to school, be sure they wear a helmet and obey all traffic laws. Finally, whether they walk or ride a bicycle to school, help them choose the fastest

route. The safest route is one that allows them to make all or most of the trip on sidewalks or bike paths. And children now have one more safety advantage working for them. Effective September 1st, children 4 to 15 (through age 14) must wear a seat belt, whether seated in the front or back seat. This new law simply compliments current laws, which cover children age birth to 4. What an exciting time for children and safety! So love your children enough to go over these simple safety rules with. And let's all be alert and watch out for our most precious gift.

Texas Agricultural Chemicals Conference Slated for Sept. 15th, at Lubbock Civic Center

person.

The general conference session runs from 8 a.m. to 1:45 p.m., and will include presentations on water management and chemigation, biotechnology, new technology to enhance drift control, record keeping, and an update on Texas agriculture by state ag commissioner Susan Combs. More than 500 producers, chemical dealers and agribusiness people are expected to attend.

Participants can earn up to 5½ continuing education units (CEUs) required by the Texas Department of Agriculture for certification of commercial and non-commercial pesticide applicators, or 5½ CEUs approved by the Crop Consultants Association (CCA).

The conference is sponsored by the West Texas Agricultural Chemicals Institute (WTACI), an organization of scientists, educators, industry representatives and agribusiness leaders. The institute has sponsored-conducted research and educational programs focusing on safe ag chemical use since 1953.

The noon luncheon will feature presentation of WTACI awards and college scholarships totaling more than \$8,000. Election of new officers will also take place at the luncheon.

The afternoon general session will begin at 3:15 p.m. and will feature concurrent educational ses-

sions on cotton, corn and milo, and specialty crops such as legumes, melons, alfalfa and peanuts – presented by Extension specialists, Texas Agricultural Experiment Station scientists and Texas Tech University and industry representatives.

The cotton session will focus on micronutrients and fertility, conservation tillage, managing for an early crop, and bollweevil eradication. Topics in the corn-milo session are wheat herbicide options, corn nitrogen management, weed management in corn-milo, and transgenic corn. The specialty crops session will key on peas and beans as a cropping option, water management in melon production, pest management for alfalfa dairy hay, and peanut pest management options.

Each concurrent afternoon session will run from 2:30 to 5:10 p.m. Business meetings, closing remarks, CEU-CCA certificates and session evaluations will be the order of business after the afternoon sessions close.

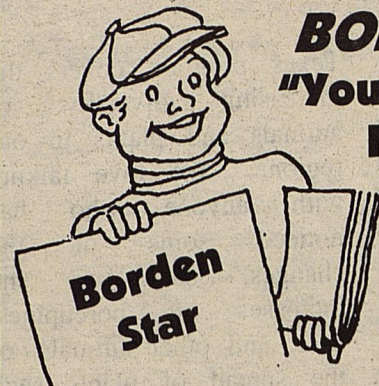

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO CONDUCT WEATHER MODIFICATION OPERATIONS IN THE STATE OF TEXAS

Date of the first of three weekly publications of this notice: August 18, 1999, in the Borden Star, published in Borden County.

1. Notice is hereby given that the Colorado River Municipal Water District, P. O. Box 869, Big Spring, Texas 79721-0869, has filed an application with the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission for a State permit to conduct weather-modification operations to change, or attempt to change, the natural development of clouds for the purpose, objective, period, and by the method summarized herein below.
2. The Colorado River Municipal Water District has a valid Texas weather-modification license that was originally issued in 1975 and has been renewed annually. The most recent license renewal was granted by the Commission on October 16, 1998 and expires on August 31, 1999. An application by the District for renewal of its license for 2000 was filed by the CRMWD on June 15, 1999 and is now being considered by the Commission.
3. The purpose of weather-modification operations is to increase rainfall to affect the inflow of fresh water into the J. B. Thomas and E. V. Spence reservoirs located in Borden, Coke, and Scurry Counties of Texas. The requested period of the permit is four years from the date of issuance by the TNRCC.
4. The proposed weather-modification operation is to be conducted by and on behalf of the Colorado River Municipal Water District, P. O. Box 869, Big Spring, Texas 79721-0869.
5. The proposed weather-modification operation is to be carried out in both an operational area and a target area to cause the intended effects to occur only in the target area. The operational area includes the counties of Lynn, Garza, Kent, Fisher, Nolan, Coke, Sterling, Glasscock, Martin, and Dawson.
6. The area to be affected by the proposed weather-modification operation is the target area. The target area is that area described as bounded by a line beginning at a point of origin at Big Spring, in Howard County, and running along Highway 87 in a northwesterly direction to Lamesa; thence, north-northeast on Highway 87 to the north border of Dawson County; thence, east along the northern boundary lines of Dawson, Borden, and Scurry Counties to Highway 84; thence, southeast along Highway 84 to Roscoe, in Nolan County; thence, south-southeast to Maryneal; thence, southerly to Robert Lee, in Coke County; thence, westerly to Highway 87 at a point approximately thirteen miles northwest of Sterling City, in Sterling County; and thence, northwesterly along Highway 87 to the point of origin at Big Spring, Texas. That is, the target area includes all or part of Howard, Dawson, Borden, Scurry, Nolan, Coke, and Sterling Counties.
7. The methods and materials to be used in conducting this operation include a licensed meteorologist who will select cumuliform or other appropriate clouds for seeding, using a weather-radar display, standard meteorological analyses, forecast techniques, surface weather observations, and pilot reports. The licensed meteorologist will direct one or more aircraft equipped with flare racks or generators to dispense either glaciogenic or hygroscopic seeding material into the updraft portions of selected clouds to perform seeding operations.
8. Persons interested in knowing more about the technical aspects of the proposed operation should contact George Bomar, MC-160, TNRCC, P. O. Box 13087, Austin, Texas 78711-3087, (512) 239-0770.
9. A public hearing on this application may be called by mailing a petition that requests a hearing to the Executive Director, Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission, P. O. Box 13087, Austin, Texas 78711-3087. The petition must contain (1) the signature, full name, address and phone number of each person requesting the hearing; (2) a statement that each person is at least 18 years of age and resides or owns property in the operational area; and (3) a description of each person's interest and how that interest would be adversely affected. Requests for hearing must be received by the Commission within 30 days of the last date the Notice of Intention is published in week one of the mandatory three-week period required by 289.17(j) of Commission rules. If at least 25 eligible persons make written request, the Commission shall hold a public hearing on an application prior to issuance of a permit.

Individual members of the public who wish to inquire about the information contained in this notice, or to inquire about other agency permit applications or permitting procedures, should call the TNRCC Office of Public Assistance, Toll Free, at 1-800-687-4040.
