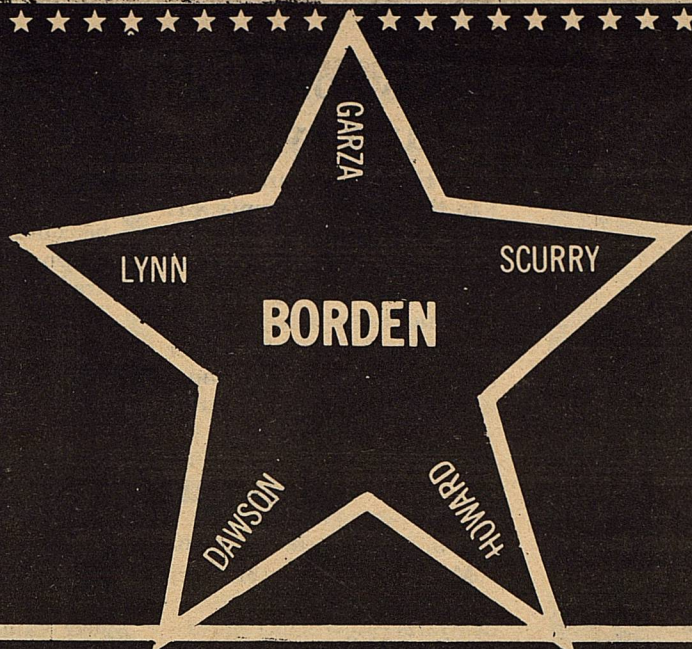

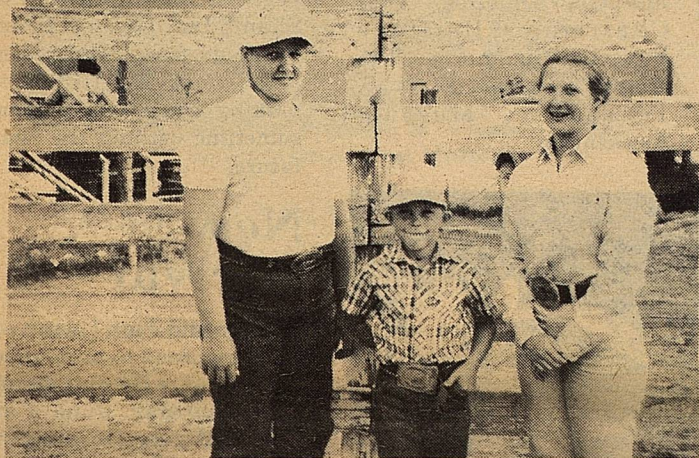

Borden County Horse Show results

Forty nine contestants from Gaines, Scurry, Fisher, Howard, Andrews, Lynn, Terry, Mitchell, Kent, Garza and Martin Counties came to Borden County for the Open Horseshow Saturday. The Borden County Open Invitational Horseshow is sponsored by the 4-H Club. J. J. Kincheloe of Scurry won the 8 and under All Around with 28 points. Others with high point totals were Dane Driver of Howard County with 17 points, and Tammy Voss of Borden County with 14 points.

Shelly Nichols of Andrews County was high point individual in the Junior ages 9-13, with 34 points. Others with high point totals were Melody Scharz of Scurry County and Cody Stice of Lynn County.

Stephanie Weaver of Scurry County was high point individual of the 14-19 year olds with 37 points. Kristi Hancock of Terry

county had 26 points and Jana Terry of Garza County, Craig Cornett of Terry County and Mary Beth Tollison of Martin Counties each had 17 points.

Scurry County won the High Point County award with a total of 88 points. Second for visiting county was Terry County with 60. Borden County had a total of 65 points, Andrews 42, and Lynn and Fisher Counties each had 36.

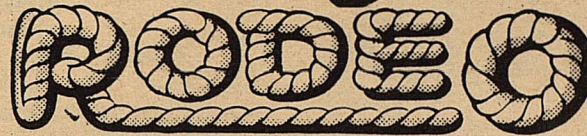

June 11 & 12

The twentieth annual Borden County Junior Rodeo is scheduled to kickoff Friday June 11 and run thru Saturday night. Nightly performances will begin at 8:00 p.m. in the Gail arena.

Events include bull riding, bareback bronc riding, barrel racing, tie down calf roping, breakaway roping, team roping, ribbon roping, girls goat tying, pole bending and flag racing.

Special attraction will include Buffalo riding, trick roping and Riley Miller's western acts.

Weldon Reed and The Solid Country will provide music for the rodeo dance Saturday night. The dance will be in the county barn.

The concession stand will be open on Friday from 7:00 p.m. until the rodeo is over and on Saturday the concession will be open from 11:30 a.m. until the rodeo is over. Among the wide variety of things on the menu will be mexican hamburgers, hot dogs, sandwiches, french fries, nachos, candy, homemade ice cream, brownies, krispies, tea, coffee and soft drinks.

Low voter turnout

Low voter turnout in Borden County, as was expected, saw a total of 45 votes cast in Saturdays runoff election. There were no county runoffs, only four state offices.

Also on Saturday at 4:00 p.m. a WTBRA approved barrel race will be held.

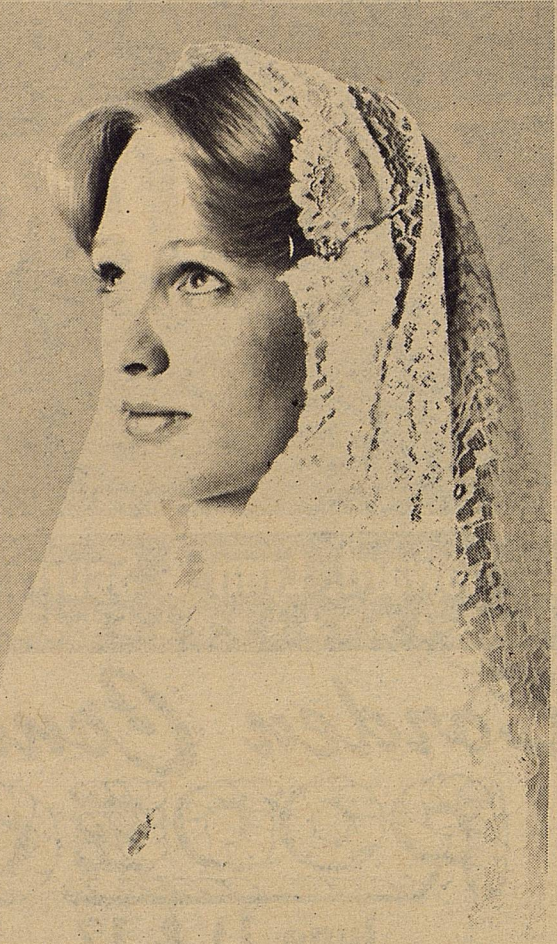

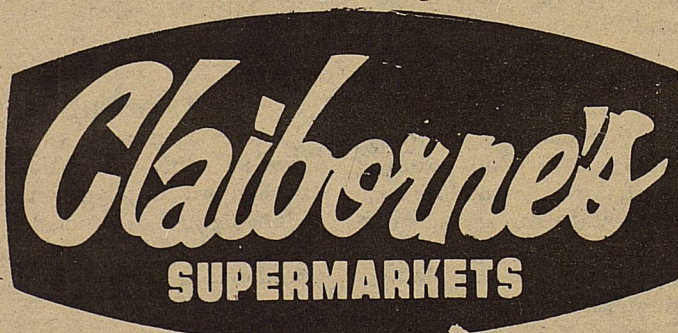
New Arrival

MANUFACTURED HOMES - A HOUSING ALTERNATIVE

Mobile homes - they are an answer to the rising cost of housing for Americans who can not afford to own conventional homes.

The image of mobile homes has changed in recent years, in fact, since 1976, all mobile homes built must meet stringent federal construction and safety codes comparable to building codes.

In addition, recent innovations in design and construction materials make mobile homes comparable to site built homes.

FEATURES

Most mobile manufactured homes come in 12, 14, 24, and 28 foot widths, and lengths up to 80 feet.

Average construction cost is about \$19 per square foot of living space.

Mobile homes usually come with appliances, carpeting, draperies and some furnishings and may even be custom built.

VALUE

Depending on the location and the upkeep mobile homes appreciate in value at about the same rate as site built homes.

Lenders, law makers and tax assessors are beginning to view the mobile home as real property when the home is placed on a permanent foundation on private property.

COST

Manufactured homes are less expensive than site built homes because they are constructed in highly efficient manufacturing plants.

Today, the average cost of a new site built home is approximately \$68,000. A new manufactured home can be purchased for under \$30,000.

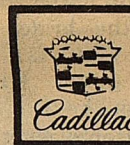
