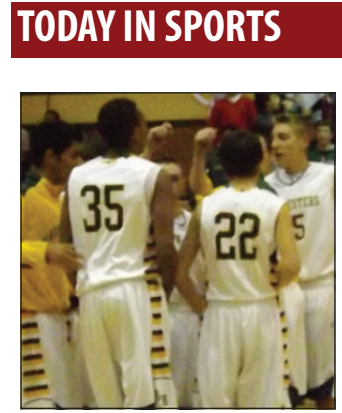

## City Commission to vote on water tap fees

■ Also will consider \$670K loan for Las Pampas improvements.

The Pampa City Commission will meet at 4 p.m. Tuesday to vote on whether to increase the fees that are to be charged and collected for the

tapping of the city's water mains. The commission approved first reading of the proposed ordinance at its Nov. 12 meeting. If approved on final reading, the new rates would only affect new customers tapping into the city's water lines. Public Works Director Donny Hooper said at the last meeting the fees have not been increased for several years and that the new fees are in **CITY** cont. on page 2

## 5 killed, many more injured in weather-related crashes

Five people were killed and many others were injured in weather-related crashes throughout the Panhandle on Saturday.

None of the killed and injured was from Pampa or Gray County.

The first and most deadly crash occurred early Saturday on Interstate 40 in Oldham County near Vega at mile marker 31. Multiple tractor trailer trucks and two passenger vehicles were involved in what the Texas Department of Public Safety called three separate crash events.

Three people died, and 11 others were

line with what other municipalities in the state are charging. He said the current fees barely recoup the city's cost of materials for connecting new customers.

The new fees are \$600 for a 3/4-inch tap, \$700 for a 1-inch tap and \$1,500 for a 1.5-inch tap.

The cost for a 2-inch tap or larger is not a set fee, because the installation cost can vary widely from one customer to another, Hooper said.

The Commission also will hold final reading on a resolution to approve a

\$1.5 million grant from the Pampa Economic Development Corp. to the Pampa Energy Center.

The Pampa Energy Center is a new industrial development on the grounds of the former Celanese Plant and is now owned by the PEDC.

At the Nov. 12 meeting, PEDC board president Gary Sutherland told the Commission a company interested in locating at energy center is requesting additional railroad tracks.

Sutherland said he could not disclose the name of the company at this time.

The grant would add additional railroad tracks to accommodate larger trains that could be used by all businesses located in the

industrial park, said Kathy Cota, PEDC associate director.

In another action, the Commission will hold first reading on a resolution to approve an unsecured loan from the Pampa Economic Development Corp. to Las Pampas Square in the amount of \$670,000.

No collateral would be required for the loan, Cota said.

She said the loan would allow continued upgrades to Las Pampas Square and would be paid back when the shopping center is sold to a private individual or company.

"It's always been the goal to continue to upgrade (Las Pampas) to the point where we can sell it," she said. "At

that point the money would go back to the Pampa EDC.

At its Nov. 12 meeting, the Commission turned down PEDC's request for \$670,000 in the form of a grant.

Mayor Brad Pingel said he supported everything PEDC is doing for the community, but expressed concern about how the money would be paid back if it was allocated as a grant instead of a loan.

Texas state law allows municipalities to create economic development corporations, which are nonprofits, to spur economic development. The EDCs are funded through optional local sales taxes.

City Attorney Lee Waters told commissioners

they could not change the PEDC's request for a grant to a loan during the meeting.

He said the resolution would have to go back to the PEDC, rewritten as a request for a loan instead of a grant and then put back on the Commission's agenda.

Sutherland said that could be done, but the process of two boards holding meetings, one for the PEDC and a separate one for Las Pampa Square, would take time and could delay some of the work that immediately needed to be done at the center, like replacing roofs.

In the lease agreement PEDC signed with Bealls, the sign that says Coronado Center, the former name of the shopping center, must

be replaced by November 2014 with one that has the new name, Las Pampas Square.

In June, Bealls relocated within the center to a larger space next to The Plaza Restaurant.

The former Coronado Center steadily decayed and it was abandoned by most of its original businesses.

However, the structure of the shopping center is still solid and money has been invested by the PEDC in recent years to repair roofs and replace worn out plumbing and electrical systems.

transported to Northwest Texas Healthcare System in Amarillo with various levels of injuries, including critical.

At the time of the crash, witnesses stated the road was already iced over and so they had slowed down significantly. The crash events started when two vehicles collided with each other, which caused other vehicles to take evasive action.

The fatalities were one in each passenger vehicle and a pedestrian, who was a truck driver who had exited his truck after he crashed and was struck by one of the passenger cars. The names of the killed and injured are posted at [www.thepampanews.com](http://www.thepampanews.com).

Saturday night around 8:20, one woman was killed and three were injured in a two-vehicle crash in Potter County.

Crystal Gonzales, 42, of Texhoma, Okla. was pronounced dead at the scene.

Shannan Ann Hensley, also of Texhoma, was driving south on U.S. Highway 87 in a 1990 Toyota pickup truck and was driving too fast for conditions, according to DPS.

Hensley's Toyota began to swerve toward the

west, leaving the roadway and traveling southwest. The second vehicle, a 2009 Ford van, was parked on the west side of the roadway facing northeast. The Toyota struck the Ford with its front driver side corner, causing damage to both vehicles. The van was pushed back as a result of impact and the truck flipped onto the driver's side as a result of the impact.

Gonzales, who was

Hensley's passenger, was not wearing a seatbelt, according to DPS.

Hensley and the two occupants of the Ford van, Tanja Kye Purdy and Ethan Purdy, both of Amarillo, were all transported to Northwest Amarillo Healthcare Systems for their injuries.

About an hour and a half later in Moore County, Arnulfo Garcia Almanza, 53, of Amarillo was killed when his mini truck rolled

over a half mile north of Dumas.

Almanza was southbound on U.S. Highway 287 in a 2002 Ford Ranger and driving too fast for the existing road conditions, according to the Texas Department of Public Safety.

Almanza lost control of the vehicle, drove over a curb and rolled the vehicle multiple times. He was pronounced dead at the scene. He was wearing a seatbelt.

# Who gets what when someone dies

Today's column discusses two separate but related topics involving Social Security benefits due after someone dies. The first question deals with a circumstance I've covered many times, but bears repeating. The second question covers an issue I don't ever recall answering before in this column.

**Q:** My wife died Sept. 29, 2013. In other words, she was alive almost the entire month of September. And yet I wasn't allowed to keep her Social Security check that came just a week or so after she died. Can you justify this in any way?

**A:** I'm not sure I can "justify" it, but I can explain what the law and Social Security rules say.

You are probably aware that Social Security checks are paid one month in arrears. In other words, the check that comes in November is the payment for October. And in your wife's case, the check that came in October was the Social Security payment for September.

You may not be aware that the law says a person must be alive the entire month (and that means every day, every hour, every minute and every second of the month) to be eligible for the check for that month. Because your wife died on Sept. 29, she was not alive the entire month. Therefore, I'm sorry, but she (and now in turn you) are just not due any of the proceeds of her September



Social Security check.

In other words, Social Security checks are not pro-rated. But as I've pointed out before in this column, although that may be bad news after you are gone, it's good news when you first sign up for Social Security. For example, if you are 66 years old on Sept. 29 and want your benefits to begin effective with age 66, you will get a check for the entire month of September, even though you are only 66 for two days in the month. (Note: This rule does NOT apply if you take benefits at age 62. The law says you must be 62 for an entire month before you can get a Social Security benefit for that month.)

**Q:** My husband passed away Oct. 5, 2013. Our Social Security checks go into the bank the second Wednesday of each month, in this case Oct. 9. I called Social Security and was told quite clearly that I would receive his check in October but not in November.

I thought all was well until this week when I went to the bank to get some cash and was told they could not honor my request due to an overdrawn balance. I discovered that my husband's Social Security check had been deposited but then had been sent back, leaving my account short

almost \$1,500. I was told that is standard practice.

My problem is that no one told me this would happen — not the Social Security people and not the bank. After a couple more contacts with the Social Security office, they had me send in a form to request the amount be returned and that will take at least 6 weeks. And to add insult to injury, the bank is charging me overdraft fees! Am I missing something? Why didn't anyone tell me this would happen? And why wasn't anyone the least bit sympathetic?

**A:** You certainly have my sympathies. Although your husband's Social Security payment was properly returned, your case could have been handled with much more compassion by both the Social Security Administration and the bank.

Actually, there are three players involved in your case: the Social Security Administration (obviously because it's a Social Security benefit), the Treasury Department (they are the ones who issue the payment) and the bank.

The Treasury Department correctly recalled the payment. Although your husband was technically due the October check, which is the payment for September (and he was alive the whole month of September), the law says that if a government check — Social Security

or any other kind — is issued after someone dies, then the payment must be returned to the Treasury. Or to clarify that some more: The Treasury Department doesn't know that someone (in this case, you) is due the proceeds of that Social Security check. All they know is that a government check was sent to someone who died before its official date of issue. So the Treasury Department did its job by asking the bank to return the funds.

But the Social Security people didn't do a very good job explaining all of this to you. They should have told you that the payment sent in your husband's name has to be returned.

Then they should have explained that you are due the proceeds of that check, but that it has to be reissued in your name. They should have helped you fill out the form to do that the first time you contacted them.

And they should have helped you file for the one time Social Security death benefit. If you haven't done the latter, make sure you get back to the Social Security office right away to do so. Or you can call them at 800-772-1213.

As I said, the third player in this little drama is the bank. And in my opinion, they should show you a little kindness and not impose any overdraft fees. If they insist on doing so, I would switch banks tomorrow!

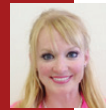

With the Harvesters down 5-0 early, they and the Hornets traded blows early, exchanging 2-pointer shots, until sophomore Cade Engle, seniors Cory Ponce and Ryan Powell scored consecutive shots, with Powell hitting a 3-pointer to pull the Harvesters within five and a 13-8 score. Highland Park didn't want to let the Harvesters stick around, how-

ever, as Justin McDonald and Ruben Ruiz connected on their 2-pointers, keeping their team ahead early in the game, 17-10. The quarter ended, as the Harvesters scored four consecutive points to pull within three, 17-14.

Then the Harvesters went on a run that gave them the lead. Senior Gabe Garcia started the scoring frenzy, hitting a 2-pointer, followed by a shot from sophomore Kambrin Scott, a pair of 2-point baskets from Ponce, junior Jonathan Stevens' first points of the game and ended with a 2-pointer from senior Brandon Stokes.

All this, while just allowing two points from Timothy Thornton of the Hornets. The Harvesters went on a 10-2 run, which gave them their first lead of the game at 22-19.

The Hornets did not let the Harvesters keep momentum as they were the beneficiaries of a three-point shot from Malik Jackson, and from that moment, the Harvesters and Hornets were back to trading points. The Harvesters outscored the Hornets 17-12 by the end of the half and gained momentum.

The Harvesters opened the third quarter on an 8-2 run, with scores from Ponce and

Powell, Ponce having five of the eight points. Highland Park kept battling to stay in it though, as they went on a 12-4 run of their own, having five different scorers. Jonathan Stevens connected on the last score of the game, giving the teams an even third quarter at 14 points scored each, and the Harvesters still leading by 2 at 45-43.

“I think he's a great player,” Embry said. “He's got some mental growth ahead of him. But what you saw there was a kid who battled through his struggles, he was missing throws but in turn was rebounding his own free throws. Then he steps out and makes a mid-range jumper. To me that speaks a lot to his character.”

Stealing the momentum from the Hornets, the Harvesters put up another 24-point quarter. Powell started the scoring for the Harvesters, maintaining their 47-45 lead. Ruiz kept scoring for the Hornets whether it was free throws or buckets, but Ponce, Stokes and Engle made it difficult for the Hornets to hang on as they outscored them 6-2 over four possessions.

Following a Highland Park free throw, the Harvest-

ers scored four points off of 2-pointers from Engle and Stokes again.

The very physical quarter caused multiple free throws to happen throughout the period, and the Harvesters were only able to sink eight out of 17 free throw attempts. But it was enough to keep the Harvesters in the lead as an 8-2 run, with points from Stevens, Stokes and Powell secured the 71-52 victory.

“That was an effort victory, because our heads were not in it tonight,” Embry said. “We're still working on this transition thing if you can't tell. We are throwing that mid-range outlet pass to the other team because we are not making it. Our bigs need to make sure it's available before they release. If that mid-range is taken away then that deep ball should be open and we are not doing a very good job of recognizing that”

The Harvesters play tonight in Amarillo against the San Jacinto Patriots. San Jacinto is a private school, which Embry says makes things a little more interesting.

“They can openly enroll anybody they're willing to take in,” Embry said. “They have a pretty good squad.

We scrimmaged against them earlier in the season and we beat them. But a scrimmage has nothing to do with a game, it's not indicative of what is going to happen. I know that if we come out and play our game like our first two home games, we'll be right there with them.”

The Harvesters had four double-digit scorers with Engle, Stevens, Stokes and Ponce. Ponce double-doubled and had 19 points and 13 rebounds.

“His (Kory Ponce) rebounding is paramount to our success, if he doesn't get 12-14 a game, we're in

trouble,” Embry said. “I am willing to bet he had at least 15 tonight.”

While Embry is excited about how the team is doing, he still says the team has work to do.

“The transition passing game and free throws, I don't know the numbers but I know we missed a ton of free throws,” Embry said.

“Brandon (Stokes) and Ryan (Powell) hit a couple down the stretch to close that game out but the scoreboard doesn't show how Highland Park played tonight, that's a good team.”

Tip-off is tonight at 7:30 in Amarillo.

## Burnett, Brown lead Lady Harvesters past Lady Hornets

Senior Hayley Burnett and junior Madison Brown both scored double-digit points Friday night as the Pampa Lady Harvesters (3-5) passed the Lady Hornets 64-48. It was only the Lady Harvesters' second home game, and they played more inspired.

"For about three and a half quarters I feel like they did (play with a lot more energy)," head coach Gene Valentine said.

"We kind of had a lull in the second quarter going into the half. We kind of regrouped at halftime, we are at home, and we played like it to start the game. We started with a 17-1 run, played to that energy and effort."

Junior Risa Rodriguez set the tone for the game, hitting a 3-point bucket to put the Lady Harvesters up 3-0. Then, Brown and Burnett started piling on the points, Brown hit a 2-pointer, then Burnett followed with a 2-pointer and a 3-pointer, and Brown capped off six consecutive points, putting the Lady Harvesters up 16-0.

Highland Park didn't score their first points until Ashleigh Sugar connected with a free throw. Once the Lady Hornets got on the board, regardless of the fashion, they found life. Kaylie Morris sunk a 3-pointer, followed by a score from Amanda Koop and a 3-pointer Morgan Kelley, who also had a 2-pointer to finish off their 12-2 run to draw in closer at 20-13 in the middle of the second quarter.

The Lady Harvesters and Lady Hornets fired points back and forth, with the Lady Hornets outscoring the Lady Harvesters in the second quarter 22-11, keeping it close at 29-28 at the end of the first half.

The scoring frenzy continued, but Burnett had the

hot hand in the third quarter, scoring 11 of her 13 points in that quarter alone. The Lady Harvesters gave her plenty of opportunities to do so, forcing the Lady Hornets to turn the ball over rapidly and repeatedly.

The teams went on a scoring onslaught, the Lady Hornets getting their third quarter points first off of a free throw. Burnett scored four consecutive points, swishing the net twice from a 2-point range. Morris and Sugar dropped 2-pointers for the Lady Hornets, but the Lady Harvesters' persistence continued as a free throw from junior Caragan Niccum, followed by a 2-pointer and a 3-pointer from Burnett set the Lady Harvesters at a 39-34 lead.

After a Sugar 2-pointer for the Lady Hornets, the Lady Harvesters went on a 6-0 run to end the third quarter, hitting a free throw, a 2-pointer and a 3-pointer in that order, making the score 45-36.

In the fourth quarter, the teams matched each other 5-5, and after scoring three unanswered points, the Lady Harvesters went on a 7-0 scoring run, with points from Burnett and Brown. A 2-pointer from Tiah Brown, after the Lady Hornets connected on a free throw finished off the game for the Lady Harvesters, with a 64-48 win.

Burnett and Brown led the team in scoring with 19 and 18 points respectively. Rodriguez had two 3-pointer shots and seven rebounds, and was one of the better ball-handlers for the Lady Harvesters tonight.

"She is the one who got hurt in the first home game," Valentine said.

"We kind of gradually brought her in and her key is she is going to play hard defense. She's going to play hard, do a lot of rebounding. Tonight when Hayley (Burnett) got into some foul

trouble, we needed another ball-handler. Someone who could bring the ball down and she did that for us."

The Lady Harvesters return to action Tuesday night against the San Jacinto Patriots in Amarillo. Tip-off is at 6 p.m.

"It's hard to figure out (San Jacinto) because they're a

private school," Valentine said. "You don't know the change in personnel. We had them here last year and it was a good competitive game. I am hoping with tonight we can do the same thing. But it's just a matter of who came into that school and who hasn't, and we don't know about them right now."
