

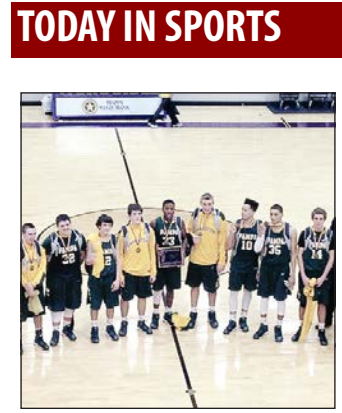

Gray County commissioners approve tax abatements for five years with conditions

The Gray County commissioners court met on the second floor of the county courthouse on Monday morning for their second meeting of the month. The commissioners approved tax abatements for Rampa, Inc., and Attebury Grain, LLC. But the abatements come with a condition.



Judge allows Texas' ban on same-sex marriage to continue

A judge on Friday declined to lift a stay that is preventing same-sex marriage in Texas.

U.S. District Judge Orlando Garcia of San

Antonio ruled in February that Texas' same-sex marriage ban is unconstitutional.

Anticipating an appeal from the state, Garcia also immediately issued a stay to keep his ruling

from going into effect.

In November, the plaintiffs in the case — two same-sex couples who want to marry — asked Garcia to lift his stay. On Friday, Garcia declined to lift the stay.

“Such action would only be temporary, with confusion and doubt to follow,” Garcia wrote in the ruling on Friday. “The day for finality and

legal certainty in the long and difficult journey for equality is closer than ever before.”

The 5th Circuit Court of Appeals will hear oral arguments in same-sex marriage cases from Texas, Mississippi and Louisiana on Jan. 9.

More than 30 states, and the District of Columbia, allow same-sex marriage.

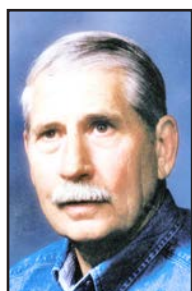

Harold and Charlotte returned to their hometown to raise their family in 1963.

He began working for Cabot Corporation where he ultimately retired after many years of service. Fishing and hunting were always favorite pastimes for Harold, along with spending time with his family.

Police end Sydney hostage siege after 16 hours

SYDNEY (AP)—A swarm of heavily armed police stormed a cafe in the heart of downtown Sydney early Tuesday, ending a siege where a gunman had been holding an unknown number of people hostage for more than 16 hours.

A police spokesman confirmed "the operation is over," but would not release any further details about the fate of the gunman or any of those who were inside.

After a flurry of loud bangs, police swooped into the Lindt Chocolate Cafe shortly after five or six hostages were seen running from the building.

After the police moved in, one weeping woman was helped out by the officers and at least two other people were wheeled out on stretchers.

The drama unfolded shortly after the gunman was identi-

fied by local media as Iranian-born Man Haron Monis, who is facing charges including sexual assault and accessory to murder in separate cases. A police official said "you wouldn't be wrong" in identifying the 50-year-old Monis as the gunman. Under department rules, officials do not identify themselves unless speaking at a formal news conference.

Monis has long been on officials' radar. Last year, he was sentenced to 300 hours of community service for writing offensive letters to families of soldiers killed in Afghanistan. He was later charged with being an accessory to the murder of his ex-wife. Earlier this year, he was charged with the sexual assault of a woman in 2002. He has been out on bail on the charges.

"This is a one-off random

individual. It's not a concerted terrorism event or act. It's a damaged goods individual who's done something outrageous," his former lawyer, Manny Conditis, told Australian Broadcasting Corp.

"His ideology is just so strong and so powerful that it clouds his vision for common sense and objectiveness," Conditis said.

The siege began around 9:45 a.m. in Martin Place, a plaza in Sydney's financial and shopping district that is packed with holiday shoppers this time of year. Many of those inside the cafe would have been taken captive as they stopped in for their morning coffees.

Throughout the day, several people were seen with their arms in the air and hands pressed against the window of the cafe, and two people hold-

ing up a black flag with the Shahada, or Islamic declaration of faith, written on it.

The Shahada translates as "There is no god but God and Muhammad is his messenger." It is considered the first of Islam's five pillars of faith, and is similar to the Lord's Prayer in Christianity.

It is pervasive throughout Islamic culture, including the green flag of Saudi Arabia. Jihadis have used the Shahada in their own black flag.

Dear Abby...

DEAR ABBY: I'm so upset. I just found out my son was molested by one of his older cousins. "Ryan" didn't want me to know because he was afraid of how I would react. Ryan is 19 and a very private person. I want to confront the person who did this to him and press charges.

What's upsetting is I tried hard to protect my children. I thought I was doing everything right by having my boys let their friends come and spend the night at my home instead of letting them stay at their friends' homes.

I want Ryan to go to counseling to understand he did nothing wrong, that it wasn't his fault. Please help me to help my son. I partly blame myself for not knowing.

How did I let this happen? I am their mother. I am supposed to keep them safe. Please tell me what to do. — CONFUSED MOTHER IN NORTH CAROLINA

DEAR MOTHER: Stay calm and understand that you have done nothing wrong. This is no reflection upon you as a parent. While many people still believe that child molesters are creepy strangers who prey on little kids, the truth is the majority turn out to be family members or close friends one would never suspect.

Your son may be embarrassed or blame himself for what his cousin did. Reassure him that when someone older acts out against a younger one as his cousin did, that is "coercion" — an imbalance of power and experience. Explain that it would be beneficial for him to talk to a therapist. It might also

benefit the cousin to do so because he may need to learn about boundaries.

Whether the cousin can be arrested or prosecuted may depend upon how long ago this occurred, and how old the kids were at the time it happened.

DEAR ABBY: I feel like I am not appreciated at my husband's family's holiday gatherings. Everyone brings a dish, while I get assigned the "leftover" — which is usually a salad. I told my husband I wanted to bring the dessert one year, so I made a homemade pie. His sister proceeded to bring two store-bought pies in addition to her dish. No one ate any of my pie except for my husband and me. Even when I bring the salad, no one eats it, either.

I may not be the best cook, but I am a good one and my pie was perfect. Because this has happened more than once, I feel discouraged about contributing, and I

have told that to my husband. Do you have any advice about how I can contribute without feeling left out? — NO NAME, PLEASE, IN MISSOURI

DEAR NO NAME: Yes. Understand that when families gather for holiday dinners year after year, they often want particular foods prepared in the way to which they are accustomed. While you may want to contribute, you may not be able to do that unless you are hosting the party.

From now on, unless you are asked to do otherwise, bring with you only a smile, your appetite, and flowers or a bottle of wine. If you do, there will be fewer hurt feelings and you'll save yourself some work.

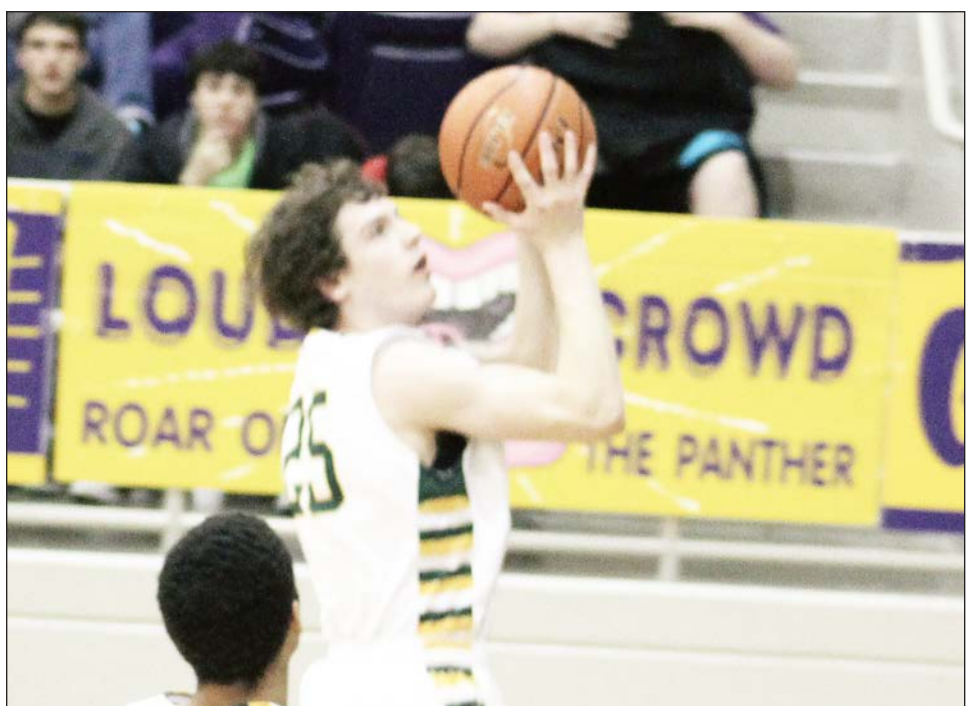

If you are like me and are too busy watching football and basketball during the offseason, you may turn on baseball in April and wonder where all your favorite players went. I am going to try to cover most of the main players and what has happened with them so far.

Unfortunately for me and other Rangers fans, they were fairly quiet the entire time. They did trade with the Washington Nationals to acquire lefty Ross Detwiler for two minor leaguers. The Angels got Andrew Heaney from the Dodgers for Howie Kendrick.

The Marlins got Dee Gordon, Dan Haren and Miguel Rojas from the Dodgers for a boatload of prospects. The Marlins also got Mat Latos from Cincinnati for some prospects.

The Cubs traded a couple of prospects for catcher Miguel Montero from Arizona.

The Dodgers traded for Jimmy Rollins for two minor leaguers.

The Athletics traded Brandon Moss to the Indians for a minor leaguer. The Rockies traded Josh Rutledge to the Angels for Jairo Diaz.
