Renovations at Harvester Stadium approved; Construction will begin after graduation

The Pampa Independent School District's Board of Trustees met on Monday evening at the PISD Administration Building. The main topic of discussion was picking which option for renovations at Harvester Stadium the Board wanted to take. Then after that was decided they wanted to approve the con-

struction manager at risk for the renovations of the stadium. A representative for Stantec, the architectural firm PISD chose for the stadium, came to review with the Board the different options they talked about in the March meeting. There are 11 items to improve the stadium to be ADA compliant. Some of those things include the home bleachers, the visitor bleachers, the parking, restrooms, ticket booths and con-

cessions. The Board decided to approve and go with option three. That option includes a larger area for concessions with the ticket booth on the right of the concessions stand. The new concessions stand will be at the front of the stadium on the one-way entrance. The old concessions stand will be renovated to house more restrooms for the home side. The visitor restrooms will also

City Commission approves several PEDC grants

The Pampa City Commission met Monday afternoon for its second meeting of the month. All were in attendance with the exception of commissioner Karen McLain. Before discussing agenda items, the mayor and commissioners held the second public hearing in regards to the reintroduction and continuation of the city's nocturnal curfew ordinance for minors under the age of 17. There were no public comments, so the public hearing was closed and the agenda item was approved unanimously on second and final reading. When the time came to discuss and consider taking action on additional agenda items, the mayor and commissioners approved the minutes of the April 13 work session, public hearing and regular commission meeting as presented. Next, the council considered on second and final reading the approval of a loan from the Pampa Economic Development Corporation in the amount of \$162,800 to Tyler D. Grant, owner of Jump N' Jive. Pampa EDC held a public hearing on the loan April 16, and Clay Rice of Pampa EDC said no members of the public attended the hearing. This agenda item was approved unanimously. The mayor and commissioners then discussed on first reading a resolution approving a grant from Pampa EDC to the City of Pampa in the amount of \$212,000 for the purchase of a new Knuckle Boom truck and refurbishing of the existing Knuckle Boom truck. Director of Public Works Donny Hooper said the new truck will be used primarily for Operation Community Pride, and the logo will go on the side of the bed for advertising. The new truck will have a TL-3 dump bed and will cost approximately \$143,000. The rest of the money on the loan will be put toward repairs on the existing truck.

The current Knuckle Boom truck is a 2000 model and has seen a lot of alley miles. The hydraulic hoses on the current truck all leak and the truck itself just needs a lot of maintenance work. This agenda item was approved unanimously.

Next, the mayor and commissioners considered on first reading a resolution approving a grant from

Pampa EDC to the Pampa Optimist Club in the amount of \$50,000 for repairs to bathrooms and office and concession stands in the main building.

Rice told the commissioners that the building has been around for about 60 years and these repairs are needed. The bathrooms will be brought up to be ADA compliant. He added that these facilities accommodate hundreds of local kids every year and that he believes it is a good project to fund.

Commissioner Chris Porter, who is on the board for the Optimist Club, abstained from the vote and discussion. Commissioner Robert Dixon added that he was active within the Optimist Club for 35 years starting in 1964, and he believes it is one of the city's greatest organizations. This resolution was approved unanimously on first reading.

Pampa EDC took to the podium for the next agenda item as well when it came time to discuss a resolution approving a grant from them to the Pampa Youth and Community Center in the amount of \$60,000 for repairs to the swimming pool, which has been out of service due to leaks for some time now.

PY&CC board members Mac Smith and Doug Carmichael were present at the meeting to answer any questions. Rice said the leaks were so severe that the water bill shot up from \$300 to \$2,000 at its worst. Carmichael said the new plumbing for the pool is complete and ready for testing, and with the grant money, they would be able to begin cement pouring and tile work to reach the completion of repairs. This agenda item was approved unanimously on first reading.

For the final agenda item of the meeting, the mayor and commissioners approved the list of disbursements for March 2015 unanimously.

The next City Commission meeting will be held at 5:30 p.m. Monday, May 11 at City Hall.

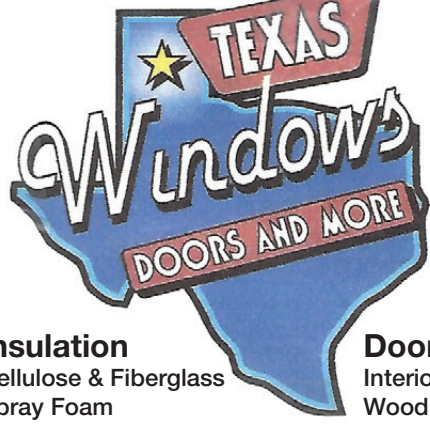

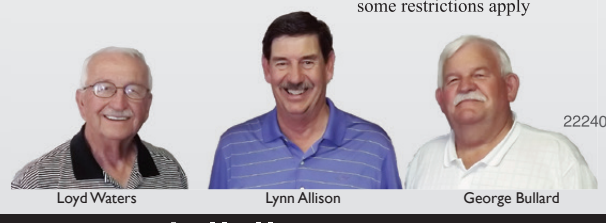

Follow the Lord close enough to bump him

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ! You know, it seems like God can really get your attention. I know the Bible teaches that truth as well. For Moses it was a burning bush (Exodus 3); for Balaam it was a donkey (Numbers 22); for David it was a Nathan (2 Samuel 12); for Darius it was a lion's den (Daniel 6); for Hosea it was an unfaithful wife (Hosea 1); for Peter it was confrontation with his sin (Matthew 26); and for Paul it was Christ on the road to Damascus (Acts 9).

I remember mine. It was July of 1975, at the end of the service at Falls Creek Assembly. I didn't surrender in that moment, but later in

the night, I came face to face with the reality of my rebelliousness. In that moment God definitely had my attention. I'm so thankful that I had that opportunity to be in the presence of people that loved me in Christ to help me begin a movement that has led to this time.

I'm sure that some of you can remember a moment similar to that as well. In a moment of time, God entered your life to speak to a hurt that you had kept for years. Maybe you were not even aware that it was there, but when Holy Spirit touched you, there it was. Now you find yourself giving thanks to the Lord for what He has done for you and in you.

It is my prayer that Christ will get the attention of people who do not know Him as Savior and Lord. One of the things that I try to do on a regular basis is write down the names of persons that I am not sure whether they

have a personal relationship with Christ. It then becomes my prayer that God will use me and others to show them the way to Christ. It is my hope that God will reveal Himself to them so that they will come to know Christ and begin a walk with Him that will last for eternity.

Some time back, God grabbed my attention. It was in the evening and I was on the way to my office when I observed a dad and his little boy coming out of their house. As they got close to their vehicle something happened that God used to speak to me.

The little boy was following his dad fairly close. As the dad got close to the car he stopped to look at something. The little boy then ran right into his dad and bounced back a couple of steps. The dad looked at his son and smiled as he saw his son stumble and get his balance. As I saw this, it made me smile.

This dad was going about his business with his son following closely behind. He

stopped and the boy ran into him. I suppose it would have been an embarrassing moment for an older child, but for this young boy, he was just being close to his dad. I'm not sure what the dad was thinking, but I do know what crossed my mind.

Here was this little boy with a desire to be so close to his dad that it didn't matter that he "bumped into" him. He just wanted to be close to the one he would seek to emulate in life. I can just imagine that he was so excited about being with his dad that a little bump in the midst of the walk didn't even bother him.

As I thought about that little incident, my mind went to John 17. In vv. 1-12, Jesus spoke to the Father and shared how He had glorified His name. But it was in vv. 13-21 that He desired the Father to work in His followers in such a way as to bring them into a deeper relationship with Him.

Jesus had given them God's word and encouraged

them to follow it in their life. But if you will allow me to paraphrase in my own words vv. 15-17, it may help you understand where I'm coming from. Jesus prays, "I'm not asking you to keep them from the bumps in life, just guard them from the one who can take their innocence away. They are now a part of me so they're not of this world, in the same way that I'm not of this world. Since they are going to bump into things in this life, let it be truth by which you deliver them. Since your word is truth, let them bump into it."

I recognize that's a rather loose paraphrase of those verses. But please understand- We will be able to overcome if we are following God's word so closely that when we bump into something it will be God's word. Wouldn't it be nice if we were following God so closely that each day we would 'bump into the truth of God's leadership for our lives?'

God has been revealing some wonderful things to me

in recent days. I believe this is one of them. Lynda Randle sings a song that says, "I want to get so close to Jesus that when I get to Heaven it won't be a big change." I guess you could say that I want to 'bump into' Jesus so much through each day, that when I get to Heaven and 'bump into' Him face to face it won't be a big change.

I just think it would be nice to 'bump into' Jesus and have Him turn around and smile at us because we were following Him so closely. The early disciples were first called Christians in Antioch and it was surely because they kept 'bumping into' Jesus as they followed Him. (Acts 11:26b). That's my hope for my life and the life of each one of you.

Anyway, I hope you 'bump into' Jesus as you read this and in the days to follow. I truly believe it will make a difference in the way you walk. Remember-- JESUS, JESUS, JESUS, there IS something about that name!

that our kids say in anger can really beat us down as parents. So you need to be continually reminded that you matter in the life of your kids.

You matter so much that you are the greatest adult influence in the life of your kid. The responsibility for raising your child isn't shouldered by the school, church, child-care worker, or coach. Although the involvement of community is important, your child needs you to be their primary teacher at every stage of life. Don't ever forget your influence is huge in their life. Even though they never say it. Even though they will often say the opposite. Know that you matter to them!!

I say "Your guidance is desired" because many kids will never say this to their parents. This goes back to that independence thing. At the heart of a child, they want help in deciding what is right and what is wrong. You guide them in that.

There is a strange thing that happens in families. Kids copy their parents almost exactly.

Do you know why your kids act like they do not need any guidance from you? It is because they have never seen you admit that you just don't know what to do. I know, we as parents are supposed to be strong, super humans with no flaws. But we all know that just isn't the case. Simply put, kids do not ask for guidance because they have never seen us ask another adult for guidance.

Here is a challenge for you. Sit down with your kids and

admit to an area of struggle or indecision. Then share with them how you are working to free yourself from the indecision. This one act will go so far in showing them that you are vulnerable too. It will show them it is ok to ask for help. This opens the door for you to guide them in their tough decisions.

I say "You are the parent" because the authority of being the parent has been robbed from many of you. You feel helpless in taking control of the direction of your child's life. You need to know that you are the parent and you have authority over your child's life. It is not the other way around.

I am tired of seeing television shows and other media portray the children in the home as the ultimate authority. That is absolutely not true. You are the parent so start being the parent.

I do not mean for that last statement to be harsh. It is simply a truth that many of you need to hear. Be affirmed of the fact that God has placed you in the life of your kids to help in molding and making them into all that He desires for them.

I think these three things need to be said. And I think they need to be said often!

I hope these words are encouraging to you as you strive to raise you kids in the right way!

Here is a quote for the day: "Nothing you do for children is ever wasted. They seem not to notice us, hovering, averting our eyes, and they seldom offer thanks, but what we do for them is never wasted." -Garrison Keillor

DEAR ABBY: I'm a 17-year-old girl and I caught my mom sniffing nail polish remover. She obviously doesn't want me to know because she tries to hide it.

I don't know what to do. I don't know why she would want to do this. It's something people MY age would do. I know better than to do that.

Should I talk to her about it? She'll probably make up some excuse like she likes the smell. She sometimes tells me I need to grow up because I can act silly. But honestly, SHE is the one who needs to grow up.

I want to help her because I know what she's doing is not good for her. But how? — KNOWS HER SECRET IN NORTH CAROLINA

DEAR KNOWS: Your mother may have an acetone addiction. Because you can't convince her to take your concerns seriously, tell another adult ASAP what's going on — a relative, your father if he's in the picture, a teacher or counselor at school.

This kind of inhalant addiction is serious because in high concentrations acetone is a nervous system depressant. This means it can slow a person's heart-beat, respiration and metabolism, causing a person to become dizzy, confused and pass out. It can also damage the vital organs — the heart, liver, kidneys and the bone marrow — and cause cardiac arrest and death.

A support group for the children of addicts such as Alateen could give you emotional support. To find one, visit al-anon.org.

DEAR ABBY: My husband had a heart attack a week ago and is still in the ICU. I visit him every day. Yesterday I found out that he had asked his sister to stay with me to "be there for me."

I am furious. My sister-in-law is a nice woman, but we have never been close. My house is a shambles (my husband and I are both disabled, he with peripheral artery disease and me after having been run over by a car) because housework is painful for me. So now, in addition to the stress of taking cabs to see him, I have the additional stress and pain of trying to make the house presentable.

I know my husband meant well, but I don't want to go through this in front of an audience. I feel angry and also guilty for being angry. Can you help me put all this into perspective? — STRESSED IN NEW JERSEY

DEAR STRESSED: After spending a week in an ICU, your husband may be having concerns about ever emerging. He may have suggested his sister come because he was worried about how you would handle being alone. That you might be upset because your home isn't ready to be featured in *House Beautiful* probably didn't enter his mind.

However, now that she's coming, be smart. Ask her to help you with the deferred housework so the place will be shipshape when your husband is discharged. If, as you say, you and your sister-in-law aren't close, her stay with you may be shorter than planned.

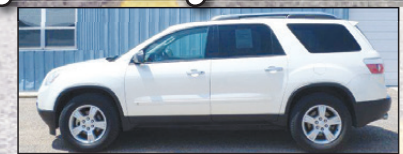
