He returned home to Norman, Oklahoma after his three-year military career to attend college under the G.I. Bill. He acquired 89 hours toward a degree in Elementary Education. (He hopes to receive his B.S. degree from West Texas University in Canyon in the near future.)

Mr. Pence has had a goal to be a gospel preacher since childhood. He and his wife made a very difficult decision to enable him to began trying to fulfill this dream in 1987. They moved to Lubbock so he could enroll in the Ministerial Program in the Sunset School of Preaching. They also decided that he should finish his Elementary Education Degree.

While attending school in Lubbock, Merrill Pence accepted the job preaching for the Gail Church of Christ in Gail, Texas. He graduated from the Ministerial Programs at Sunset School of Preaching and is now the pastor for the Church of Christ in Kress, Texas.

Two of the Gail FFA judging teams have recently attended the State judging contest which was held at Texas A&M University.

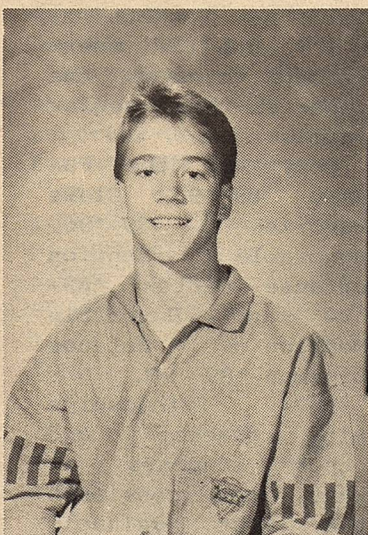
Both teams qualified to compete with the top 45 teams from around

BETA Club Secretary and Coyote Marching Band Drum Major.

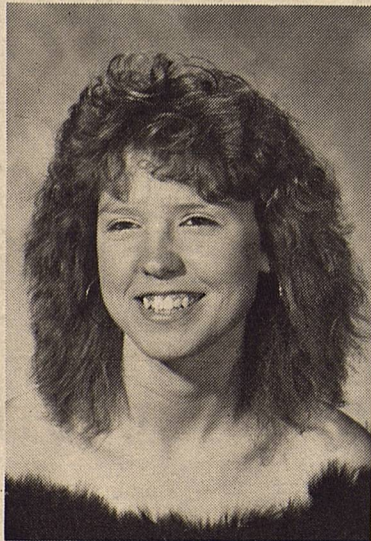

attended BHS for the past three years coming here from Snyder High School.

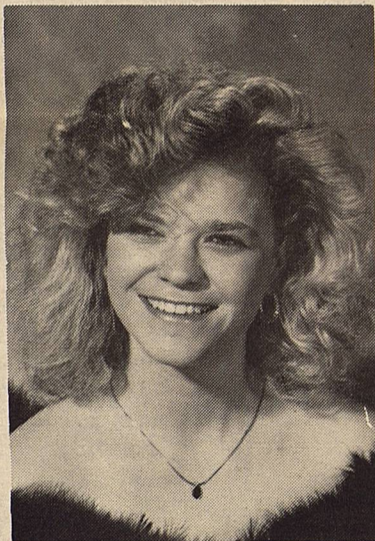
She participated in track and FHA, was the Lady Coyote basketball team manager, Band librarian and worked on the yearbook.

Learning how to be responsible is what

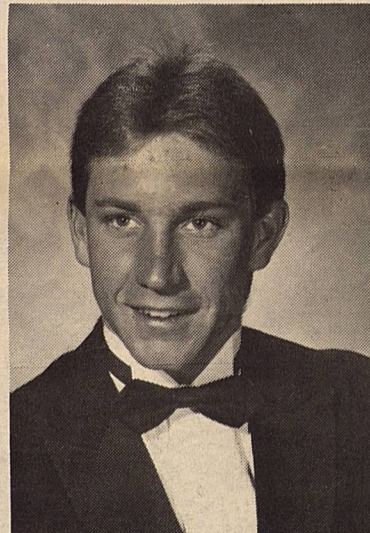
Kandy considers the most valuable thing she received in high school.

He has been active in football, basketball, track, golf and tennis. He has earned many honors which include All-District basketball, 6-man State track qualifier and 3rd place District-golf.

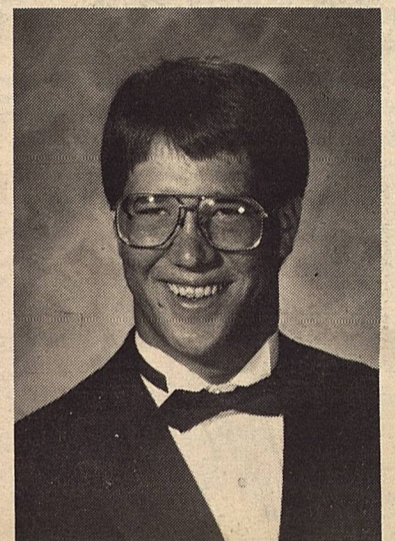
Brian was also involved in UIL, Beta Club, FFA, 4-H and served as the senior class treasurer.

Elizabeth served as the secretary and reporter-photographer for her FHA chapter.

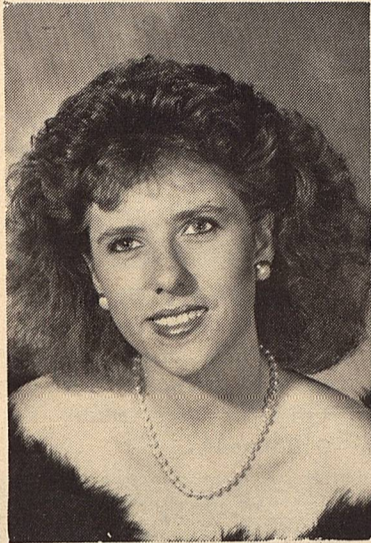
She received an athletic award in basketball and was voted as the school clown and school flirt at Union High School.

She participated in basketball, track, tennis and band. She was a cheerleader, FHA President for two years, Beta Club President and held class offices all four years including President of the Senior class.

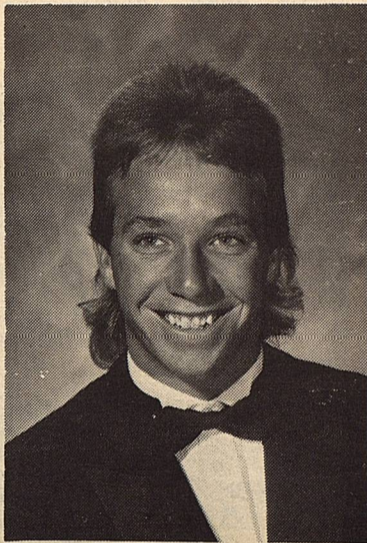

He participated in basketball, golf, tennis, U.I.L. and judging and leadership events in FFA. He held the offices of Band President and FFA Chapter secretary.

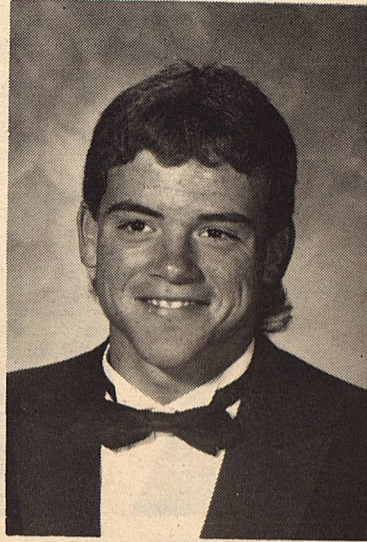
Fuzz has received the John Phillip Sousa Band Award, was a Star Chapter Farmer, All-District-football and alternate to the All-Star game.

During Marc's three years at BHS he has been active in football, track and FFA.

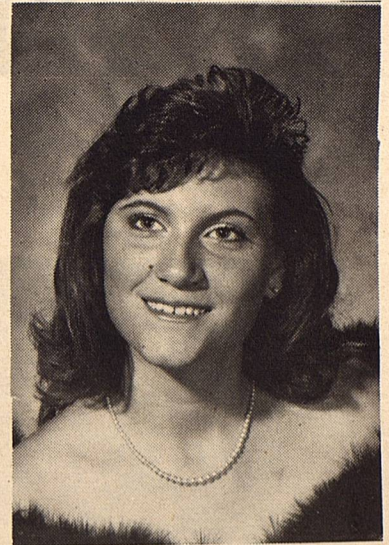
He was chosen as All-District in football and was selected as Cross-roads Defensive Player of the Week. He was also elected Sophomore and Junior class favorite.

She has plans to continue her education at Abilene Christian University where she will major in studies that will help her achieve a career in Hotel Management.

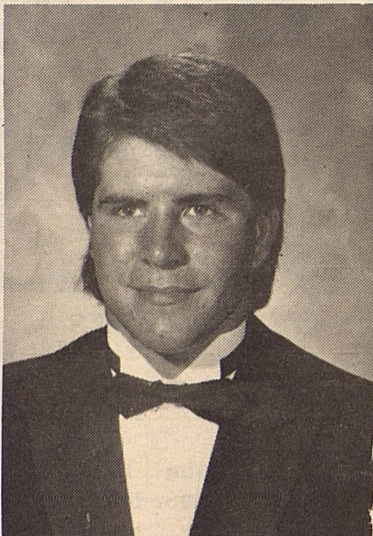
Amy has worked as a babysitter and house cleaner for various local families. She has also done secretarial work at the Borden County Courthouse.

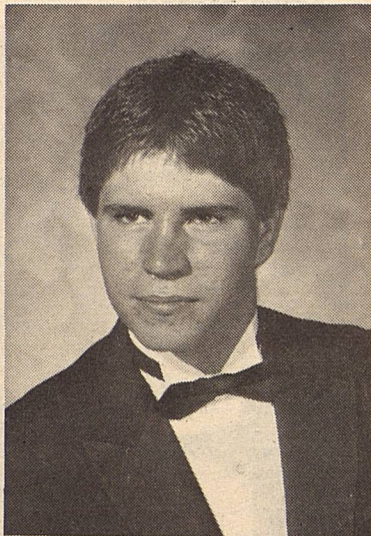
He feels the most valuable things he has received at Borden County is an education and a desire to work.

Jeff placed 1st in debate at regional and 5th at the State level.

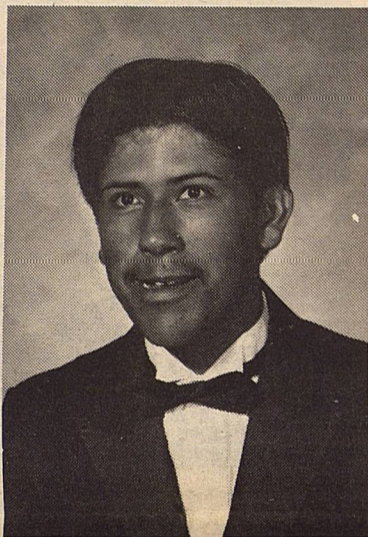
Jeff considers a good education and skills in leadership to be the most valuable things he has received at BHS.

has participated in during her high school career.

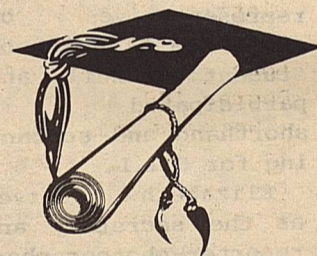

20 projects on display which range from a flat bed trailer and metal silhouettes to gun cabinets and coffee tables.

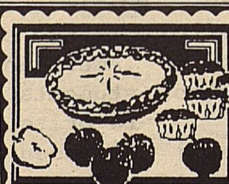

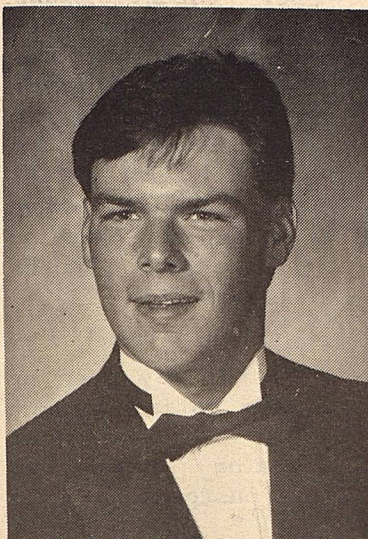

James has received the Star Greenhand Award; Chapter, District. Star Chapter Farmer '88 and Lone Star Farmer Degree '89.

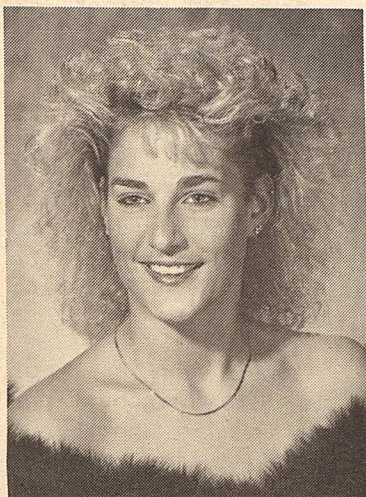
He says a top rate education and many lasting friendships are what he considers the most valuable things he has received in high school.

In her basketball career, she was awarded All-District M.V.P. of the District, Honorable mention, 2nd team All-Star and numerous band awards.

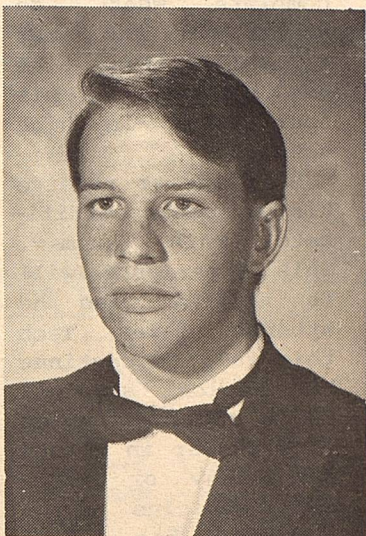
"The relationships between teachers and friends which has better prepared me to live in todays world." is what Lisha considers the most valuable thing she has received at BHS.

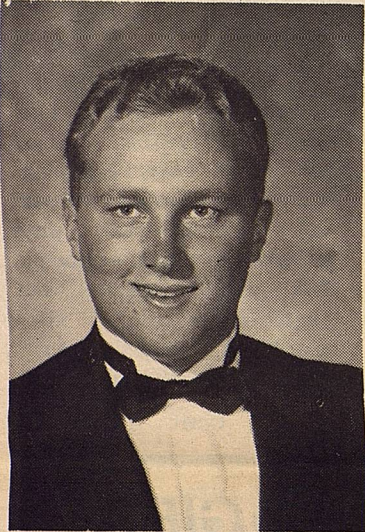

He participated in U.I.L. in OAP, Lincoln-Douglas Debate, typing and Editorial Writing.

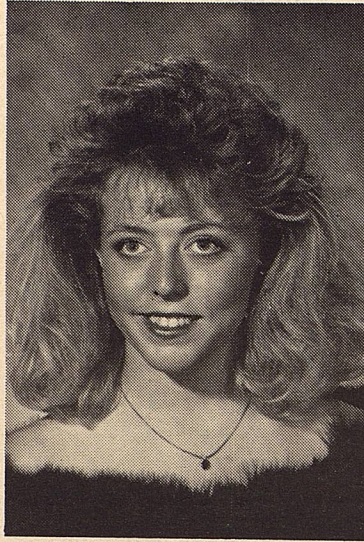
Lance was president for three years of the 4-H Club and Vice president of Shooting Sports for five years.

The Board of Trustees of the Borden County Independent School District met in regular session on May 21, 1990 at 8:00 p.m. in the Board Room of the Borden County Schools in Gail, Texas.

Board members present were Jack McPhaul, Kenny Hensley, Randy Adcock, Scott Clayton, Tom Ed Vestal, Jon Monger and Joel Dennis.

Administrators present were James McLeroy, Superintendent and Mickey McMeans, Principal.

President Jack McPhaul called the meeting to order.

Minutes
Minutes of the May 7, 1990 Board Meeting were read and approved.

Oath of Office and Swearing-in of Board Members

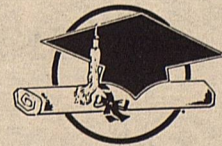

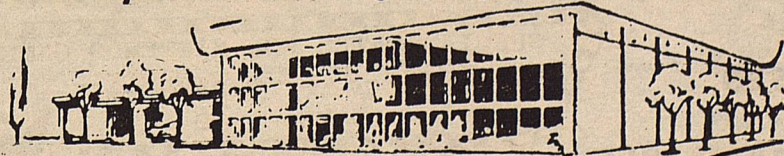

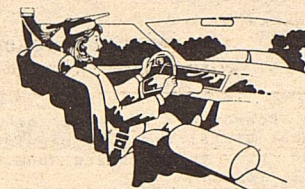
